Near Critical Fire Weather Conditions Expected Today

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Near critical fire weather conditions are expected today for all fires for min RHs of 12-15 percent and breezy west winds at 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 30. A thermal belt will develop again tonight, mainly over the Balsinger Fire. Elevated fire weather conditions are expected Tuesday with more hot and dry conditions with winds shifting more to the WNW.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE AMERICAN FORK FIRE:

WEATHER: NEAR CRITICAL FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS. Hot, dry, and breezy.

TEMPERATURES:

77-81 ridges and 82-86 valley bottoms

HUMIDITY:

Minimums 12 to 15%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West 15 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley before 0900 becoming W 10-15 mph, gusts to 25 mph.

HAINES INDEX:

6 (High chance of plume dominated activity)

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> .10):

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion breaking by 0900.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE DIVIDE COMPLEX:

WEATHER: NEAR CRITICAL FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS. Hot, dry, and breezy.

TEMPERATURES:

76-80 ridges and 81-87 valley bottoms

HUMIDITY:

Minimums 13 to 16%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West 15 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley before 0900 becoming W 10-15 mph, gusts to 25 mph.

HAINES INDEX:

5-6 (Moderate to high chance of plume dominated activity)

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> .10):

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion breaking by 0900.

MONDAY NIGHT AND TUESDAY:

A thermal belt will develop again Monday night with minimal RH recovery, 20-25% in the mid/upper elevations and 30-40% in the valley bottoms. Expect generally SW winds at 10-20 mph within the thermal belt. Tuesday will be the hottest day with highs in the 80s everywhere. Winds will be lighter out of the WNW or upslope/upvalley in any sheltered location with min RH dropping to around 14 percent. Afternoon cumulus clouds will develop Tuesday with a 20% chance of a thunderstorm.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found on the American Fork/Divide Complex are Fuel Model 10 (mixed conifer with heavy dead/down) as well as areas of Fuel Model 2 (short grass w/timber) in the lower elevations. Current fuel conditions are favorable for extreme fire behavior within all fuel types, especially 100 hour and 1000 hour fuels. Live fuel moistures are low enough to contribute as well. Heavy dead and down will likely be the most problematic. ERC's are approaching all time high's for today's date.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Near critical fire weather conditions are expected today for all fires for min RHs of 12-15 percent and breezy west winds at 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 30. **Haines Index today is forecasted to be a 6.**

General Fire Behavior Forecast: Weather today will create conditions for extreme fire behavior. Wind and fuel driven fire with uphill runs and torching or crowning should be expected wherever fuels exist for fire to consume. Long distance spotting is probable anywhere wind and slope align. General movement will be upslope or towards the north and east. Expect a high resistance to control. Expect activity to begin early in the day and to persist thru early evening and into the night hours.

Specific:

American Fork Fire Expect intense fire behavior anywhere that fuel is available for fire to consume. Slopover in South Fork/American Fork drainage will run upslope to the ridgetop/rocks and likely move easterly where fuel will allow. Expect progression to continue unabated until fire reaches rocks/grass. Blacktail fire scar should continue to limit spread to the north.

Balsinger Fire – Expect fire to continue to progress unabated to the north and east until it runs out of fuel. Fire behavior will be intense, with group torching, crown runs, and long range spotting likely. It will be difficult to suppress fire in conifer fuel under the extremely dry conditions.

Ellis Fire – Isolated single tree torching will most likely continue. It may be somewhat more frequent today with a Haines 6 and low rh. There could be reburn potential in canopy fuels if canopy is intact/brown. Any heat source in direct contact with unburned fuel could produce intense fire behavior today.

Night Shift – Expect fire to remain active well into the overnight hours. A thermal belt is forecasted that may provide low RH and breezy conditions that could allow for unexpectedly active fire behavior. Forward movement of fire with torching is certainly possible. Short canopy runs cannot be ruled out.

Major Hazards and Risks: Falls, and Fatigue

Extreme Fire Behavior: Today's fire behavior will be at Red Flag conditions and potential for aggressive and extreme fire behavior. Establish LCES and position vehicles for prompt movement if needed. Maintain situational awareness and keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts. Develop trigger points to reassess your mission and tactics.

Fatigue: This is the beginning of a long fire season and we need to closely evaluate our physical and mental fatigue. Fatigue hinders our ability to focus and concentrate, therefore decreasing our ability to maintain good situational awareness. Ways to fight fatigue: eat healthy balanced meals, exercise regularly, take mind off work or other stressors, take breaks as needed, and get plenty of sleep (6-8 hrs per night).



18.TAKING A NAP NEAR THE FIRELINE

Common Denominators on Tragedy Fire

There are 5 major common denominators of fire behavior on fatal and near-fatal fires.

- 1. On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of large fires.
- 2. In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush.
- 3. When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction or in wind speed.
- 4. When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.
- 5. Critical burn period between 1400 and 1700.

Alignment of topography and wind during the critical burning period should be considered a trigger point to reevaluate tactics.






ICP Map
