Management Objectives

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Mostly clear skies in the morning will give way to partly cloudy skies and isolated thunderstorms in the afternoon. High temps will increase slightly over yesterday, reaching upper 70s at higher elevations with min RHs dropping into the mid 20's. The primary threats will be erratic and gusty winds to 40 mph and a couple lightning strikes. Winds during the afternoon will generally be terrain driven with predominantly upslope/upvalley flow, however, exposed locations will see more of a NE wind. Decent RH recoveries (50-60%) are expected tonight with light downslope/downvalley winds.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THE DIVIDE COMPLEX & AMERICAN FORK:

WEATHER: Seasonable temperatures with a chance of an afternoon shower/storm. Generally less than 0.05" of rainfall is expected. Erratic wind gusts to 40 mph possible with any shower/storm.

TEMPERATURES:

72-76 ridges and 78-82 valley bottoms

HUMIDITY:

Minimums 25 to 30%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - NE 10 to 15 mph for completely exposed locations. Otherwise, variable wind.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley at 8 to 12 mph.

HAINES INDEX:

3 (Very low chance of plume dominated activity)

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> .10):

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion breaking by 0900.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:

A slight chance of a shower with gusty winds before 2200. RH recoveries will reach 50-60%. Partly cloudy skies early will become mostly clear by Saturday morning. Temperatures will fall to the mid and upper 50s for most areas and the low 50s for the valley locations. Downslope/downvalley winds 4-8 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY AND SUNDAY:

High temperatures will be in the 70s with lows in the 50's. Expect mostly sunny to partly cloudy skies each day with min RHs in the upper 20s. Most areas will remain dry, but a stray afternoon shower or thunderstorm cannot be ruled out. If a shower or storm develops, gusty winds and lightning would be the primary threats. Winds become E to ESE with gusts of 20 to 30 mph expected in exposed areas.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The major fuel types found on the American Fork/Divide Complex are Fuel Model 10 (mixed conifer with heavy dead/down) and Fuel Model 2 (short grass w/timber) in the lower elevations.

Current fuel conditions are favorable for extreme fire behavior within all fuel types, especially 100 hour and 1000 hour fuels. Live fuel moistures are low and will contribute to fire spread. Grass fuels are becoming more available as well. Heavy dead and down will likely be the most problematic. ERC's are approaching all time high's for today's date.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics. Mostly clear skies in the morning will give way to partly cloudy skies and isolated T storms this afternoon. Gusty and erratic winds possible near these storms. Temps – upper 70's with RH's in the mid 20"s. Decent RH recovery tonight. Winds will be light and predominantly upslope/upvalley.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: General movement will be upslope/upvalley today. Current fuel conditions encourage extreme fire behavior. Fuel driven fire with uphill runs and torching or crowning should be expected. Long distance spotting is probable anywhere wind and slope align. Expect a high resistance to control. Expect activity to begin early in the day and to persist thru early evening and into the night hours.

Specific:

American Fork Fire - Westward push into Shields River drainage will continue today. Fire behavior could be intense and progression may continue unabated until fire reaches rocks/grass. Meadows and fuels treatment should blunt fire progression on the west side of Shield River drainage. Blacktail fire scar should continue to limit spread to the north. Remainder of fire – probable low fire activity.

Balsinger Fire – Expect fire to continue to progress to the north around/near/down Thunder mountain until it runs out of fuel. Fire behavior could be intense if upslope- with group torching, crown runs, and long range spotting possible. It will be difficult to suppress fire in conifer fuel under the extremely dry conditions.

Ellis Fire – Smoldering and isolated single tree torching will most likely continue. Any heat source in direct contact with unburned fuel could produce intense fire behavior.

Night Shift – Expect fire to remain active well into the overnight hours – possibly midnight or later.

Unexpectedly intense fire behavior is possible. Forward movement of fire with torching or short canopy runs possible when moving upslope.

Fine fuel moisture today is - 4% 1000 hour fuels 9 to 12%

Probability of Ignition today - 85% + Live fuel moistures are critically low

Max Spotting Distance Today- 1/2 mile plus Haines is at 3 for today

AIR OPERATIONS: Light inversion possible that should not impact aviation. Light smoke expected.

Fire Behavior Safety: Snags havent been a huge problem on this fire thus far, but they do injure firefighters almost every year. Look up. Look down. Look all around.

Today is Transition Day: The incoming SA Red Team will be shadowing the SA Gold Team today before taking over the fire at 0600 tomorrow morning. This has historically been a time where missed communications or the lack there of can lead to an undesirable outcome. Make sure you have good instructions and communication with your supervisor before engaging the fire.

Driving: It is important to know where you are as you drive, especially if you need to drive to new locations, download a transportation map from the QR reader on the front of this plan. Know which road leads to your safety zone, keep in mind there will be additional traffic on the road leading out of fire areas.

Roads in the fire areas are becoming dusty. Turn on headlights, follow far behind the vehicle in front of you and keep your mind on the road. Washboards and holes can bounce you off the road, so slow down to keep control.





The Gold Team fully supports EEO and will not tolerate sexual harassment or any form of discrimination!







On your demob day, or last work day, personnel should:

- 1. Turn in all supplies, radios and computer equipment checked out from the incident.
- 2. They should ensure that all Unit Logs and evaluations are submitted to Documentation electronically. 2021.americanfork.docs@firenet.gov
- 3. Go to the Ground Support Unit for equipment inspections.
- 4. Go through weed wash and obtain a receipt to verify that the equipment has been cleaned. Return that receipt to demob (this can be done virtually if necessary by emailing a picture of the receipt to: 2021.americanfork.demob@firenet.gov.
- 5. Go to the Time Unit to complete time and review their final OF-288 or OF-286. This may be done virtually if necessary.
- 6. Report back to the Demobilization Unit to verify travel information home, including ETD/ETA and RON locations. This can be done virtually if necessary.











ICP Map
