Leaders Intent

It is my expectation that we as an organization will meet the following leaders' intent as well as the objectives below:

- Ensure all incident strategies and actions reflect a commitment to public, responder, and aviation safety through use of the risk management process as outlined in the IRPG and aviation risk assessment process.
- As professional we will provide superior customer service to all requesting agencies, cooperating agencies, and resources assigned to the incident.
- Coordinate incident management activities with our requesting and cooperating agencies including but not limited to suppression, suppression repair, and support needs.
- Treat all incident personnel, cooperators, and public with dignity and respect creating a "zero tolerance" atmosphere for harassment, alcohol, and drug use.

Management Objectives

- Provide for emergency personnel and public safety at all times through the utilization of a deliberate risk-informed approach while ensuring COVID-19 precautions and best practices are met by following agency, team, and CDC guidance.

General Situational Awareness:

Tactical Objectives

Balsinger

- Protect Tenderfoot Experimental Forest infrastructure within the Tenderfoot drainage.
- Protect the communities of Belt Park, Deer Creek Estates, Monarch, Neihart and the Hwy 89 corridor to avoid loss or damage to private lands and critical infrastructure.
- Keep the fire west of Belt Park on NF lands to protect private land, critical grazing land, and associated infrastructure.
- To the extent possible prevent negative impacts from fire suppression actions, including ground disturbance and retardant use, within Tillinghast Creek and Harley Creek Westslope Cutthroat Trout habitat. Protect the Iron Mines cabin to the extent possible.
- Use mechanized equipment to establish and improve control lines where approved to minimize risk and exposure to firefighting resources.

Woods Creek

- Confine fire to Forest Service lands to protect and limit impacts to adjacent landowner property and values at risk, to include private properties east of HWY 284 and south Confederate Gulch to the North Fork of Cabin Gulch and properties east of the forest boundary along Benton Gulch, Camas Creek, Birch Creek, and Grassy Mountain to the south.
- Protect values at risk including Miller Cabin, Thompson Guard Station, Diamond City Cemetery, and the Duck Creek repeater and communications towers.
- Protect the Westslope cutthroat trout habitat in Camas, Ray and Whites Creeks by limiting fire intensity and ground disturbance where feasible.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Today will be sunny and cooler with much lighter ridgetop winds. The winds will be from an easterly direction today through tonight. A series of approaching weather systems will bring a chance of afternoon and evening showers and isolated thunderstorms Wednesday through Thursday. There is a better chance of showers Thursday, although the chance for wetting rains is relatively low as the showers are expected to be light.

FOR WOODS CREEK and BALSINGER FIRES:

WEATHER: Sunny and cooler with less wind.
TEMPERATURES: High 56 to 59 ridges (around 7,500 ft) to 63 to 67. Down 7-9 degrees.
HUMIDITY: Minimum around 30%. Up 4 to 7%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - North wind 7 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph.
PROTECTED SLOPES – Upslope/upvalley 5 to 8 mph with afternoon gusts to 15 mph.
LOWER ELEVATIONS – Light Terrain driven winds to 10 mph. Occasional gusts to 15 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 3 (Very Low chance of plume dominated activity)

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (> .10): 0% **LAL:** 1

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak to Moderate inversion breaking 1000-1100.

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



1. Remove discharge hose, suction hose, and priming cap.
2. Drain the pump by tilting the pump several times to remove as much water as possible from the pump head.
3. After the water has been drained, add 4-8 oz of RV Anti-Freeze to each pump head.
4. Leave discharge and suction hose disconnected until equipment is needed again.
