### 5. Leader's Intent

- Protect the identified values at risk utilizing full suppression strategies identified by Agency Administrators in alignment with their prioritization of specific values. Risk management tools will be used to evaluate tactics in order to provide for firefighter and public safety while implementing actions that have a high probability of success.
- The highest priority on this incident is to protect the safety of fire personnel and to protect human life followed by the protection of structures. Ensure LCES is known and understood by everyone, and contingencies and trigger points for disengagement are developed and followed.
- Maintain a positive and inclusive workplace where all employees are valued and treated with respect.

### 6. Incident Objectives

- Address the safety of firefighters, aviation and public through clear communication. Ensure an understanding of strategies and tactics, including a clearly defined and obtainable end state, in order to facilitate sound risk mitigation decision making.
- Natural and Cultural Resource Values at Risk: Weigh potential suppression actions in consideration of heritage resources, waterways and riparian areas, and bull trout and anadromous fish habitat in order to minimize fire effects and undesirable suppression related effects to these values.
- Continue to develop and implement the long-term plan for fires in the complex that incorporate management actions in alignment with the protection of identified values, based on current and expected weather and fire behavior. The long-term plan will incorporate primary, alternate, contingency, and emergency plans identifying opportunities for both direct and indirect suppression actions.
- Maintain and strengthen relationships with the Lolo and Kootenai National Forests; MT DNRC; Sanders County Sheriff,
   Emergency Managers, and VFD's; community leaders; cooperators; local government and agencies; and private landowners utilizing the most effective platforms available.
- Provide timely, accurate, and consistent incident information through the press, community meetings, trap lines, briefings
  and social media. Incident information shall be coordinated between the team and Forest Service Line Officers, MT DNRC
  Unit Manager, and the Sanders, Missoula, and Clearwater Sheriff Offices.
- Continue to monitor costs and implement cost effective methods for accomplishing operational objectives.
- Ensure adherence to current guidance regarding COVID-19 to provide for the health and safety of all incident personnel by implementing the module-of-one concept, social distancing, and masking up as appropriate.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** A chilly start to the morning with some patchy fog will yield to temperatures once again warming into the low-mid 70s. Southwest winds will again be gusty. with gusts to 30 mph possible along the ridges. Winds will switch to NW late in the evening and start to diminish. This will set the stage for the coldest night of the season Monday into Tuesday morning. Tuesday will remain mostly sunny with less wind that will be mostly terrain driven.

Outlook Wednesday through Friday: Mostly dry and seasonal weather in store for the rest of the week. Temperatures will fluctuate by a few degrees with Wednesday looking to be the warmest. Continued drying will allow minimum RHs to fall towards 15-20% and make for some cold mornings.

**FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** The major fuel type found on the West Lolo Complex is fuel model 10 (mixed conifer with heavy dead/down). There are also areas of TU 5 – which is timber with a shrub component underneath. Fuel arrangement may be a blend of these 2 conditions. There are areas of fuel model 2 (grass with timber overstory) in the lowest elevations.

**WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics:** A chilly start to the morning with some patchy fog will yield to temperatures once again warming into the low-mid 70s. Southwest winds will once again be gusty, with gusts to 30 mph possible along the ridges.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: Expect minimal fire behavior today in timber. Fuels remain damp from recent precipitation. Isolated smokes are possible around the fire area today – especially during the afternoon as things begin to dry out. Heavy fuels will likely continue to smolder. An isolated torching tree is possible. Grass fuels on a sunny slope could dry to the point of carrying fire today and could spread at moderate rates during the afternoon.

### **Critical fire behavior thresholds:**

RH below 25% Winds greater than 10 1000 hr FM less than 12% Haines 5 or 6

#### Specific:

**Division November** – Expect minimal fire behavior. Most fuels will be damp and will not carry fire. Some heavies are still consuming and may produce light smoke. Grass fuels might carry fire on a sunny slope late in the day. A torching tree might be possible.

**Division Echo/Hotel/Juliet**– Expect minimal fire behavior. Timber fuels will be too damp to carry fire. Grass fuels on a sunny slope could carry fire late shift. Heavies will continue to produce isolated smokes. A torching tree might be possible.

Divisions **Charlie/Papa/Zulu** – Expect minimal fire behavior. This division had the most precipitation and likely will not carry fire at all in timber. Grass fuels on a sunny slope might carry fire late shift. Heavies will continue to produce a minor amount of smoke. An isolated torching tree could be possible.

**Initial Attack** – Low potential for IA activity today. If IA occurs, expect minimal fire behavior in timber. Grass fuels could have moderate spread rates today in an open and sunny environment.




