Safety Message

DRIVING

Driving is one of the most hazardous things we do because we perform the task hundreds of times in the course of our daily lives. We tend to take it for granted. Based on recent accident trends, vehicle accidents are the source of more deaths and serious injuries to wildland firefighters than any other single cause.

To be a safe driver you have want to be one

- When driving, keep speed at or ***below*** the posted speed limit.
- Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve.
- Watch out for debris and wildlife on the roads.
- Do not tail gate, keep a safe distance between vehicles on dirt roads.
- Use hazard or emergency lights on dusty roads.
- Always fasten your seat belt before the vehicle is set into motion.
- Use a “Backer” when backing your vehicle. Do a walk around if a “Backer” is not available.
- Watch for inattentive and distractive drivers when traveling to and from assignment locations and base camp.
- Use caution when driving steep terrain before, during and after rain events.
- Roads may be washed out, debris and flash floods may occur, have a plan for the
