3. Objective(s):

1. Public and firefighter safety is our top priority. We will utilize established risk management principles when taking action and developing tactics.

2. The Garnet Fire is a full suppression fire. Direct attack is the preferred strategy in order to mitigate prolonged resource exposure. Some situations may call for indirect tactics to utilize natural features, breaks in fuels, topographical features or manmade barriers.

3. Provide timely and accurate information to agencies, stakeholders and the public by utilizing the planning cycle, media outlets and stakeholder meetings.

4. Keep costs/actions commensurate with risk, probability of success and expected fire behavior.

5. Garnet fire personnel will be polite, respectful and sensitive to the impacts of the fire on the local public, businesses and agencies. We will strive to maintain or improve existing relationships throughout the span of the incident.

6. This incident will be a positive work environment, free from harassment. All personnel will be treated with dignity and respect.

4. Leader's Intent:

The Garnet Fire is located on BLM ownership with DNRC fire protection in a wilderness study area. Close coordination with BLM READS and Agency Administrators on all operational decisions is paramount to navigating the special requirements with the WSA. In order to protect the critical values at risk, we will focus our efforts on minimizing fire growth. Values at risk are private lands and structures east of fire, threatened aquatic resources in Yourname and Wales Creek, wildlife habitat, grazing allotments, BLM repeater and warming hut on Elevation Mt, eligible historic sites near the McElwain jeep road, and wilderness/backcountry area characteristics. We are professional, hardworking, respectful, kind and understanding of others that we interact with throughout the life of this incident.

Fire Order of the Day – Continue to Fight fire Safely

Narrative:

TRANSPORTATION- ROAD FATALITIES are around the very next corner, so USE HEADLIGHTS, tap that horn, and GO SLOW. Fire vehicles must clean windshields regularly. User a backer with parking in camp

DRINKING WATER- Increase YOUR water consumption- don't negate your body's need for fluid replenishment. Potable water MUST be kept available at ALL Drop Points and Helispots. All fire vechicles must carry water.

COMMUNICATIONS- Radio coverage will be assessed by all divisions through out the scheduled work assignment period.

ATTITUDE/Complacency- affects our judgment and how we respond to hazards on the fireline such as snags, rolling rocks or even driving. We get used to a particular Division and think it will be the same as yesterday, but sometimes it's not the same. Yesterday's green tree may have burned out from a burnout operation and a slight breeze will send it down. THERE is still FIRE OUT THERE.

EVERYONE IS A SAFETY OFFICER (that means you too, so remember "Think SAFETY", starts with "THINK"!



Helicopter Bucket Operations

Personnel and equipment can be injured and damaged by the impact of material dropped by aircraft. Clear personnel out of target area when drop is to be made. If an individual is unable to retreat to a safe place, the safest procedure is to:

- Hold onto your handtool away from your body;
- Lie face down, with head toward oncoming aircraft and hardhat in place. Grasp something firm to prevent being carried or rolled about by the dropping liquid;
- Do not run unless escape is assured;
- Get clear of dead snags, tops, and limbs at least 2.5 tree lengths in drop area;
- Working in an area covered by wet retardant should be done with caution due to slippery surfaces.

Garnet Turn-Back Standards

End State Objectives:

- Fire is fully contained poses minimal threat to values at risk.
- Fire is managed by a type 4 organization.

Operations:

- Ensure all handlines and access routes are mapped.
- Mop-up is sufficient to secure containment and achieve end state.
- Spot fires $< \frac{1}{2}$ acre are mopped up 100%.
- Identify any unburned fuels inside containment lines.
- Provide GIS documentation and mapping coverage of all suppression features.

Suppression Repair:

- All suppression-related damage is identified geospatially.
- Provide status and estimated needs for repair activities.
- Any repairs that can be completed before turn-back are implemented per plan.

Planning:

- Compile demobilization of all personnel and equipment not needed for the incoming organization or Clearwater Unit.
- Ensure completion of open training taskbooks, assignments, and performance evaluations.

Logistics:

- All excess supplies are backhauled and demobilized, unless needed to accomplish the end state.
- All accountable (cache) items not returned to the Clearwater Unit must be identified by Type, Location at Incident, and Person Assigned, then reconciled to the property report.

Documentation:

• Ensure all documentation is completed as per DNRC direction.
