EVACUATION ORDER

Level 1 [image]

AN EVACUATION NOTICE LEVEL 1 HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR THIS AREA

Residents should be aware of the danger that exists in the area.

YOU ARE NOTIFIED that the fire nearby presents real or expected threats that are considered severe for this area. Conditions can change and worsen quickly. This is the time to prepare people with limited mobility, and plan transportation for pets and livestock out of the area of immediate danger. Prepare a backpack with essentials (like medications), in case you need to leave quickly. If conditions worsen, emergency services personnel will attempt to contact you in person or by phone. Continue to monitor the websites of emergency services in your local area, and continue to monitor local news websites for the most up to date information.

EVACUATION ORDER

AN EVACUATION NOTICE LEVEL 2 HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR THIS AREA

Residents should be prepared to evacuate immediately.

YOU ARE NOTIFIED that conditions are dangerous, and there is a threat to your security. Due to the considerable danger in your area, emergency services personnel will have a limited capacity to protect you or your property. At this time, you can evacuate voluntarily. If you choose to stay, you need to be ready to leave at any moment. It's possible, that residents may have time to gather up personal belongings, but it will be at your own risk. This may be the only notice you receive to evacuate. Emergency services personnel will make every reasonable effort to reach you to contact you, but it is not guaranteed that they will be able to locate you or reach you if conditions deteriorate. If you are away from your home, even for a short time, leave a note with your name and phone number in a visible place.

EVACUATION ORDER

AN EVACUATION NOTICE LEVEL 2 HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR THIS AREA

Residents should evacuate immediately and shelter in a safe place.

YOU ARE NOTIFIED that current conditions present an immediate threat to the security and property of residents in this area. Residents are advised to evacuate immediately and to shelter in a safe place. Emergency services personnel will have more information about shelter housing evacuated residents. Do not waste time. This is not the time to gather personal belongings, nor to prepare or protect your home. If you ignore this recommendation to evacuate immediately, understand that emergency services, like firefighters and ambulances, will not be able to come to your aid. This will be the last notice you receive. Road closures are possible, and residents may be denied re-entry until conditions are safe.
