• North Santiam:

• Reviewed and assimilated the Detroit Ranger District Eclipse Incident Action Plan (IAP).

• Mary's Peak:

- o Delivered materials to Oregon Department of Forestry in Dallas, OR for their distribution to patrol engines, offices and Dallas businesses.
- Delivered materials to the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde's Spirit Mountain Casino.
- Coordinated with Grand Ronde Natural Resources staff and learned about tribal history and fire program. Shared the FTP site for their additional communication material needs. They will use materials at the tribal Powwow this Saturday.
