REGIONAL CLOSURE ORDER
Fireworks**

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) §551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) §261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands administered as National Forests or National Grasslands within the Pacific Northwest Region (Region 6) of the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service in the states of California, Oregon and Washington (the "Restricted Areas") and on all roads and trails located within the Restricted Areas (the "Restricted Roads and Trails"). This Regional Order is supplemental to and does not rescind or replace those restrictions at 36 CFR 261 Subpart A, and/or any Forest Supervisor Order issued under 36 CFR 261 Subpart B.

RESTRICTED AREAS:

This Regional Order is necessary to protect public health and safety and to provide the public with consistent public health and safety restrictions in the Pacific Northwest Region.

PROHIBITION:

1. Possessing, discharging, or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device except emergency highway fuses and flares. 36 CFR § 261.52(f)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

The Regional Order shall be in effect until rescinded.

**REGIONAL CLOSURE ORDER
Explosives and Exploding Targets**

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) §551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) §261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands administered as National Forests or National Grasslands within the Pacific Northwest Region (Region 6) of the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service in the states of California, Oregon and Washington (the "Restricted Areas") and on all roads and trails located within the Restricted Areas (the "Restricted Roads and Trails"). This Regional Order is supplemental to and does not rescind or replace those restrictions at 36 CFR 261 Subpart A, and/or any Forest Supervisor Order issued under 36 CFR 261 Subpart B.

This Regional Order is necessary to protect public health and safety and to provide the public with consistent public health and safety restrictions in the Pacific Northwest Region.

PROHIBITION:

1. Using an explosive; including exploding targets. 36 CFR § 261.52(b)

An explosive is defined as any chemical compound, mixture, or device, the primary or common purpose of which is to function by explosion.

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Any person engaged in the use of black powder or other muzzleloader propellant, and the use of its associated ignition source, for legal hunting or recreational shooting with a muzzleloader. This exemption does not include the firing at or use of exploding targets.

The Regional Order shall be in effect until rescinded.
