

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Incident: CARPENTER ROAD

Red flag conditions and gusty winds has resulted in torching, crowning, uphill runs with 1/2 mile spotting. Fire whirls and dust devils occurring on the lee side of ridge tops and saddles. Fire continues to burn actively through the night with winds associated with a frontal passage.

36. Projected Incident Activity, Potential, Movement, Escalation, or Spread and influencing factors during the next operational period and in 12-, 24-, 48-, and 72-hour time frames:

12 hours: Fire will spread to the north and east and will cross the Springdale Hunters Road and continue 1-2 miles.

24 hours: Fire continues to spread 4-7 miles to north and east with rapid rates of spread and extreme fire behavior. It is anticipated the fire may reach Stensgar Mountain.

48 hours: Fire spread will shift to the SE with frontal passage towards Turtle Lake Road. Fire behavior will moderate somewhat after the front passes.  
 Fire behavior returns to the previous pattern resulting in north and east spread with torching, crowning, uphill

72 hours: runs with moderate spotting. Terrain driven winds will create fire whirls and dust devils. Extreme fire behavior during the afternoon hours.

Anticipated after 72 hours:

 The Full Suppression strategic objectives are to look out far ahead for favorable fuels and topographic conditions, predetermined Management Action Points, infrastructure and resource values. All Hazard Map has been completed showing Management Action Points.

500 structures located north and NE of the fire continue to be threatened. Fire is continuing to back towards 250 structures near McCoy Lake. Minimal structure protection resources available.

24 hours: The fire continues to spread towards the NE and will threaten 300+ additional structures as the fire burns towards the community of Springdale.
