Comments /notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation:

Grave Creek: No expansion, many isolated heat across the fire. The northwest portion of the fire has the greatest concentration of isolated heat sources tonight.

Pleasant Creek: No expansion. Most of the isolated heat sources were located inward from the 600-foot buffer.

King Mountain: No expansion, no heat detected.

Spencer Creek: Fire was not flown.

There were four potential heat sources south of the fire, one being in a field and other three look to be residences.
