Comments /notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation: Grave Creek: No expansion, many isolated heat sources across the fire. The Northwest and Southeast portions of the fire has the greatest concentration of isolated heat sources tonight. There were 8 isolated heat sources within the 600-foot buffer, two on the North end and six on the South end of the fire. Pleasant Creek: No expansion. There was one isolated heat sources was detected in the west portion of the fire, between the incident perimeter and the 600-foot buffer. King Mountain: No expansion, no heat detected. Spencer Creek: Fire was not flown. There were no potential heat sources detected tonight.
