Comments /notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation:

Grave Creek: No expansion, many isolated heat sources across the fire. The Northwest and Southeast portions of the fire has the greatest concentration of isolated heat sources tonight. There were six isolated heat sources within the 600-foot buffer, two on the North end, three on the middle portion of the East side, and one on the South end of the fire.

Pleasant Creek: No expansion. There was one isolated heat sources area that was detected in the west portion of the fire, past the 600-foot buffer line.

King Mountain: No expansion, no heat detected.

Spencer Creek: Fire was not flown.

There were no potential heat sources detected tonight.
