Comments /notes on tonight's mission and this interpretation: Grave Creek: No expansion, many isolated heat sources across the fire. The Northwest and South portions of the fire has the greatest concentrations of isolated heat sources tonight. There were four isolated heat source areas within the 600-foot buffer on the upper West, South and Southeast portions of the fire. There was one grouping of isolated heat sources on the lower West side that had some intensity to them (42° 38.994', -123° 11.141'). Pleasant Creek: No expansion. There were three areas of isolated heat sources detected in the north central portion of the fire, with on in the 600-foot buffer. King Mountain: No expansion, no heat detected. Spencer Creek: Fire was not flown. There were no potential heat sources detected tonight.
