COLD CREEK WA-MCR-282 IAP Map

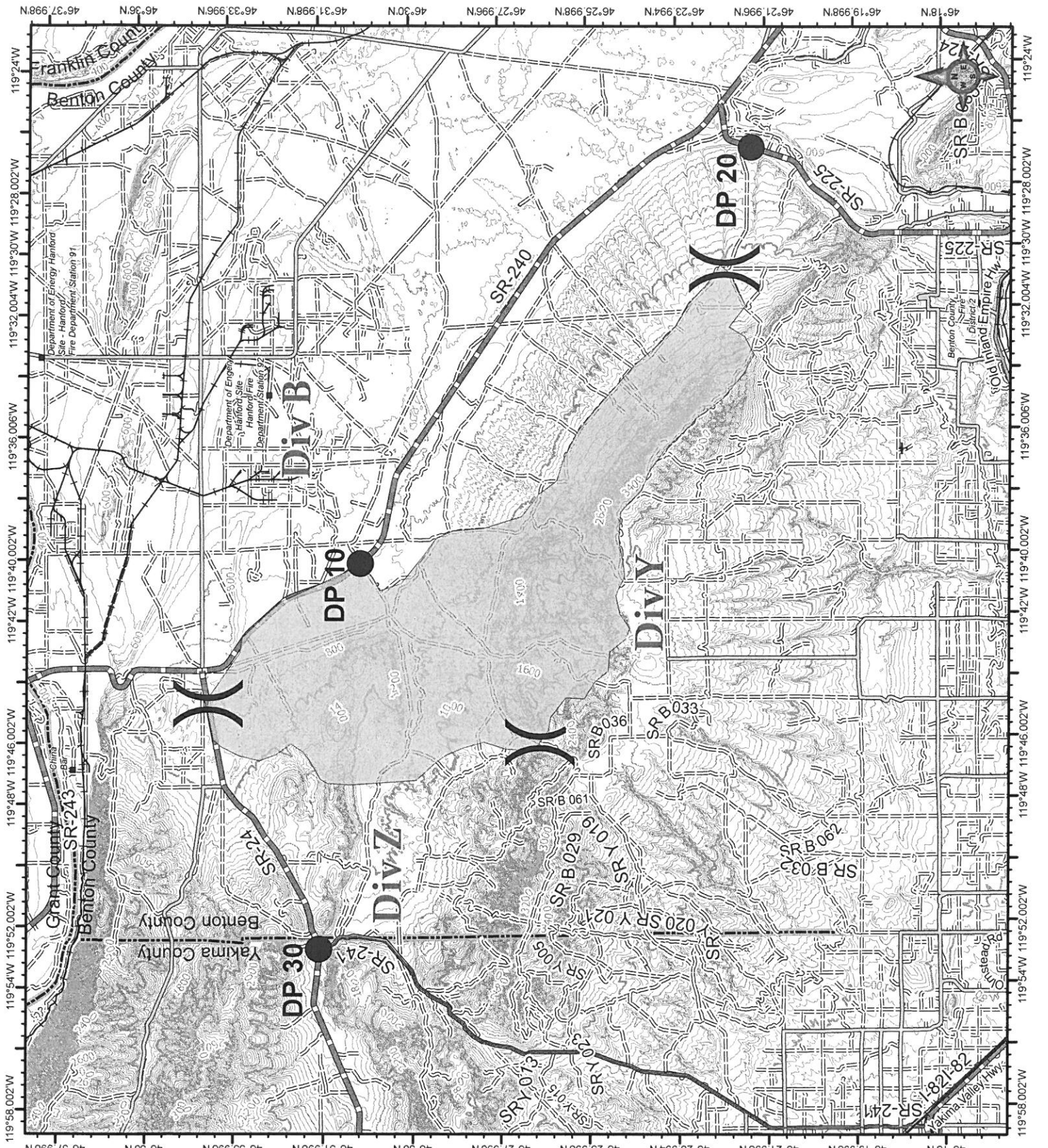




