#### **HEAVY EQUIPMENT**

• When near the excavator or other equipment that's working, maintain a safe distance and wear ear protection.

• Heavy equipment operators have limited visibility, especially to the rear of their equipment. Do not approach equipment unless you have established eye-contact with the operator and have been given the "go ahead" to approach.

• Do not work on the downhill side of heavy equipment. Watch for rolling debris.

#### DRIVING/TRANSPORTATION

Practice defensive driving skills and maintain time and distance from other vehicles and visual obstructions such as curves and blind spots. Be aware of debris fall and logs along the right-of-way. Keep your speeds low and take your time.



# **Catch of the Day**



This photo is believed to be from the lower North Umpqua, circa 1930-1940s.

'A bad day fishing beats a good day at work,' as the old saying goes....but not to worry, there aren't very many bad fishing days on the North Umpqua river...

The North Umpqua river bisects the Archie Creek fire area, and is considered a world-class fishery, known for its Steelhead runs. In addition to summer and winter steelhead, the North Umpqua is home to several species, including Oregon Coast coho salmon, spring Chinook salmon, cutthroat trout, and Pacific lamprey.

The impact of a fire of this magnitude will likely affect the North Umpqua and it's tributaries for years to come, but we can help minimize additional resource damage by implementing the following;

- As pumps get set up for mop-up, please keep fuel as far from the streams as possible, and make sure each pump has a containment kit.
- Avoid drafting from smaller streams if you need help finding water sources, please contact a Resource Advisor, as most of them are local, have incredible knowledge of this area, and can assist with minimal response time.
- If working on hazard tree removal adjacent to larger streams such as Canton Creek and Rock Creek, please contact READ Jeff McEnroe at 541-537-0501.

## Weed Wash!!



The weed wash stations are still up and running! The objective, is to complete suppression repair and minimize damage to the natural resources. Thank you for your continued vigilance in helping us achieve that objective!

#### BOTH FIRES HAVE A WEED WASH.

• Archie Creek Weed Wash location. (not at the ICP)

Directions: Take 138 West into Glide, make a right (North) just West of the Glide Community Center (about 0.8 miles from Archie ICP). You'll see signs at the entrance. This is also the new Staging Area.

• Thielsen Weed Wash location is at DP-3.

PLEASE wash your vehicles during the following situations:

- Prior to demob....DO NOT take our weeds home with you!
- Whenever logistically possible, wash equipment/vehicles prior to moving from the BLM/Private checkerboard to Forest Service- administered lands.

\*\*If you are just arriving to the Archie Creek or Thielsen Fire, take all vehicles through the weed wash before entering the fire areas.\*\*

- 1. Initial mobilization into camp;
- 2. Final demobilization;
- 3. Moving from BLM to FS;
- 4. As often as possible!

\*Federal agencies and private industry spend thousands of dollars a year in the fight against noxious weeds as they spread from the valleys (or other infested areas) into un-infested Public Lands and plantations. Prevention is by far the most effective proactive weapon we have; it saves taxpayer dollars, and all it takes is a little extra time.

#### Human Resource Message – Archie Creek & Thielsen Fires October 15, 2020



<u>Shake Out Day is a day to practice earthquake safety. It is an annual event held on the third</u> <u>day of October.</u> This is an international event where people from every country and every walk of life practice a "safety drill" to prepare themselves in case of an earthquake. Everyone everywhere should know how to protect themselves before, during and after earthquakes.

So, what happens if we are on a fire assignment and we have an earthquake? What would you do in the moment? This is something to consider for your, and your team-mate's safety.

#### If an earthquake happens, protect yourself right away:

- If you are in a car, pull over and stop. Set your parking brake.
- If you are in bed, turn face down and cover your head and neck with a pillow.
- If you are outdoors, stay outdoors away from buildings, power poles and other aerial hazards.
- If you are inside, stay and do not run outside and avoid doorways.

# After an earthquake, there can be serious hazards such as damage to the building, leaking gas and water lines, or downed power lines.

- Expect aftershocks to follow the main shock of an earthquake. Be ready to Drop, Cover, and Hold On if you feel an aftershock.
- If you are in a damaged building, go outside and quickly move away from the building. Do not enter damaged buildings.
- If you are trapped, protect your mouth, nose, and eyes from dust. Send a text, bang on a pipe or wall or use a whistle instead of shouting to help rescuers locate you.
- If you are in an area that may experience tsunamis, go inland or to higher ground immediately after the shaking stops.
- Check yourself to see if you are hurt and help others if you have training. Learn how to be the help until help arrives.

- Modules (e.g. crews, engines) should send representatives to pick up meals for the entire group: 1 person for engine crews, 3-4 people for 20 person crews.
- Join morning briefing via phone (number provided in IAP)
- Observe 6-foot social distancing during briefings and while standing in line for meals, and any other time you are near people outside of your module.
- Limit contact between firefighters and the public as much as possible, use crew representatives to pick up supplies, fuel, etc.

#### **EMERGENCY PLAN**

#### **INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT**

#### **ON SCENE SUPERVISOR**

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment and Transportation.

- Conduct size-up of the incident (nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location); notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency; coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.
- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED.
