


WEATHER DISCUSSION:

High pressure will continue to weaken over the area today, with cooler but dry conditions continuing. The fire will have more of a coastal influence this weekend, with good overnight humidity recoveries tonight and Sunday night. Under high pressure ridging, the winds will continue to be slope driven as the winds aloft will be light through Sunday. A weak upper level disturbance will move across the fire on Monday and this will mainly be dry, with no precipitation expected. The winds on Monday will become easterly, but expect wind speeds to remain relatively light, with the main effect of this being drier air moving into the area. Temperatures will be on the rise again on Tuesday.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: Sunny and cooler.

High Temperatures: 73-84. (24hr Trend Down 4-5°F)

Afternoon Humidity: 25-34%, highest on the ridges. (24hr Trend: Up 4-6%)

20 Foot Winds:

Valleys/Lower Slopes: Down slope/drainage 5 mph, becoming upslope from the south 5-10 mph late morning, then generally from the west and up drainage 5-10 mph in the afternoon.

Upper Slopes & Ridges: South 5 mph becoming SW 5-8 G12 mph in the afternoon, then NW 5-8 mph, with gusts to 12 mph late afternoon into the evening.
(24hr Wind Trend: Steady)

Transport Wind: NW 10 mph.

Local Thresholds for Elevated Fire Behavior– Watch Outs

20-foot winds > 13 mph, RH under 25%, Temperature over 85°, 1,000-hour fuel moisture less than 12%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL:

One- and ten-hour fuels will remain receptive to ignition. One-hour fuels in 4% in exposed locations to 8% in sheltered locations. Ten-hour fuels, < 7%. 1000-hour fuels remain above critical levels at around 16%.

Fire behavior will be **minimal** today. No active fire spread is expected. **Smoldering** in stumps, snags, and downed heavy fuels will continue. **Creeping** fire may occur in areas with **needle/leaf drop**. No fire perimeter growth is expected.

If fire starts outside containment lines expect moderate running fire with occasional torching.

ERC values are slightly above average. ERC-G is 47 at Grandad RAWS. Critical ERC level 54-58.

Rate of spread and flame lengths are model outputs based on **maximum values** for the fuel models shown, with current fuel moistures in exposed locations on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub (GS2)	12 chains/hour 10 feet/min	4 feet
Mature Timber (TU2 & TL5)	7 chains/hour 8 feet/min	3 feet

In **one hour** a spot fire would be approximately **2 acres** in timber and **5 acres** in grass/shrub.
Probability of Ignition = **61%**

Specific Areas of Concern:

All Divisions:

Any remaining heat source, stumps, logs, and snags.

Areas with heavy needle/leaf cast.

AIR OPERATIONS: No concerns for Air Operations.

SAFETY:

How much energy is in that smoldering material?

A 2-foot diameter, 12-foot long Douglas Fir log has about 6.2 million BTUs.

How much energy is this?

That's the energy in 50 gallons of gasoline.

That's one reason mop-up is so important.

Watch your step and keep up your Situational Awareness in areas of smoldering material!

<p>Assignment: Completing the assignment starts from the time you check in till you are back home. The Southern Area Red Team wants to meet the objectives with the resources assigned to the incident. This means we are ALL to do our jobs efficiently and SAFELY to finish our assignment. By doing this we will have kept the faith that what we did on our assignment was intended to help sustain the forest.</p> <p>Driving/Heavy Equipment: The Southern Area Red Team wants to thank everyone on the Incident for doing their part in safe operations. As we continue throughout the season, use deliberate actions when driving to and from the line such as slowing down, avoiding distractions while driving, using spotters when parking and backing, and driving defensively. Heavy equipment operations will continue to have specific hazards that continuously need mitigation. Needs for spotters and road guards around high traffic areas are paramount to safe operations. When new resources arrive, they are not familiar with the operations and routines so they should be briefed and made aware of operations in their work area.</p> <p>Fatigue: It has been a long season for most all of us. Long periods of multiple days spent working fires can take its toll on the best of us. Please take the time to take care of yourself. Frequent breaks, adequate rest, hydration, good eating habits, and good personal hygiene practices will help mitigate the accumulated fatigue.</p> <p>Increasing Public Interface: Firearms hunting season will open in Western Oregon this Saturday October 3rd. Many deer hunters will be coming close to our fire impacted areas for recreation. Expect to see an increase in traffic, people looking for camping sites within the forest, and the need to be very aware of public safety in fire impacted areas.</p> <p>Covid-19: Continue to provide awareness and mitigations for Covid-19 prevention in all our daily operations. Daily COVID-19 Reminder

- **“MODULE OF ONE” Concept:** Resources assigned to the Archie Fire need to focus on reducing the amount of time they spend around other resources they do not need to directly work with. Please limit your exposure to other resources.

Chinook Salmon – providing sustenance through the ages

Chinook salmon (also known as king salmon) and the Oregon Coast Coho Salmon, are the two salmonid species present in the Umpqua River. Chinook salmon are a key component of this region's past, present, and will likely hold a prominent spot in the future. At a glance, here are a few facts about this important fish;

- The Chinook is the biggest of all of the Pacific salmon, growing as long as 53 inches and weighing as much as 126 pounds.
- Its Pacific Ocean habitat ranges all the way from Southern California to the Canadian Arctic.
- The king salmon is born in freshwater, migrates to the ocean during the second year of its life, and swims back to freshwater by the age of seven years to spawn and then die.
- In Oregon, the Chinook salmon provides sportfishing both in rivers and the ocean.
- The Chinook salmon is also a major part of commercial fishing operations in Oregon.
- For the coastal Native Americans who originally inhabited Oregon, salmon served as the basis of life. They placed the salmon in very high esteem, holding special rites around the coming of the salmon and the spearing and roasting of the fish.
- Chinook salmon make their spawning migrations during the spring, summer, and fall.
- In Oregon, the biggest runs happen in the Rogue, Umpqua, and Columbia rivers and the larger coastal streams.
- While swimming for up to 60 days from the ocean to their home streams, salmon do not feed and their stored body materials gradually dissipate.
- Upon reaching home again, the female salmon deposits up to 14,000 eggs in gravel nests, where newly hatched youngsters then live for several weeks.
- Young salmon consume plankton and later insects while in the streams, before moving on to creatures like herring, squid, pilchard, and crustaceans in the ocean habitat, reported State Symbols USA.
- Even today, salmon remain an important source of food for humans, who eat the meat fresh, frozen, canned, or smoked.

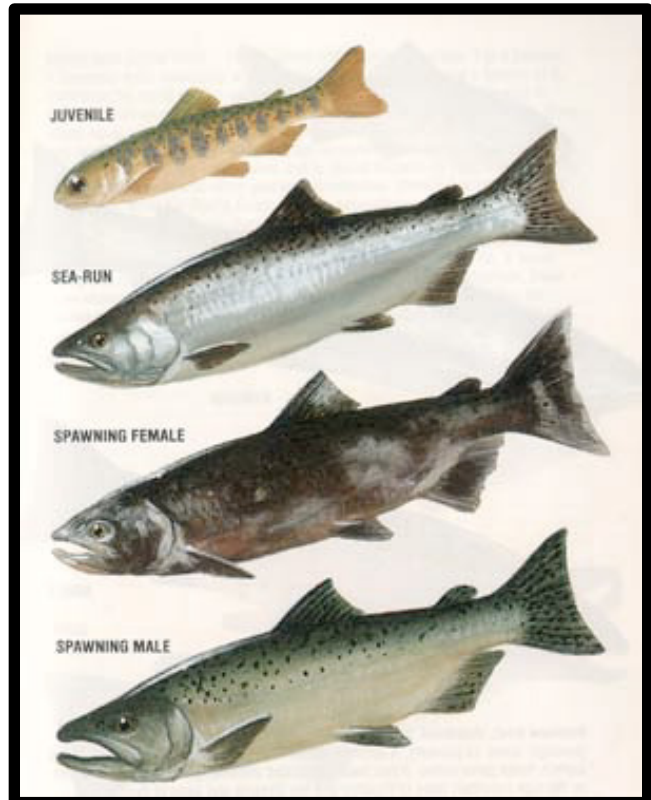

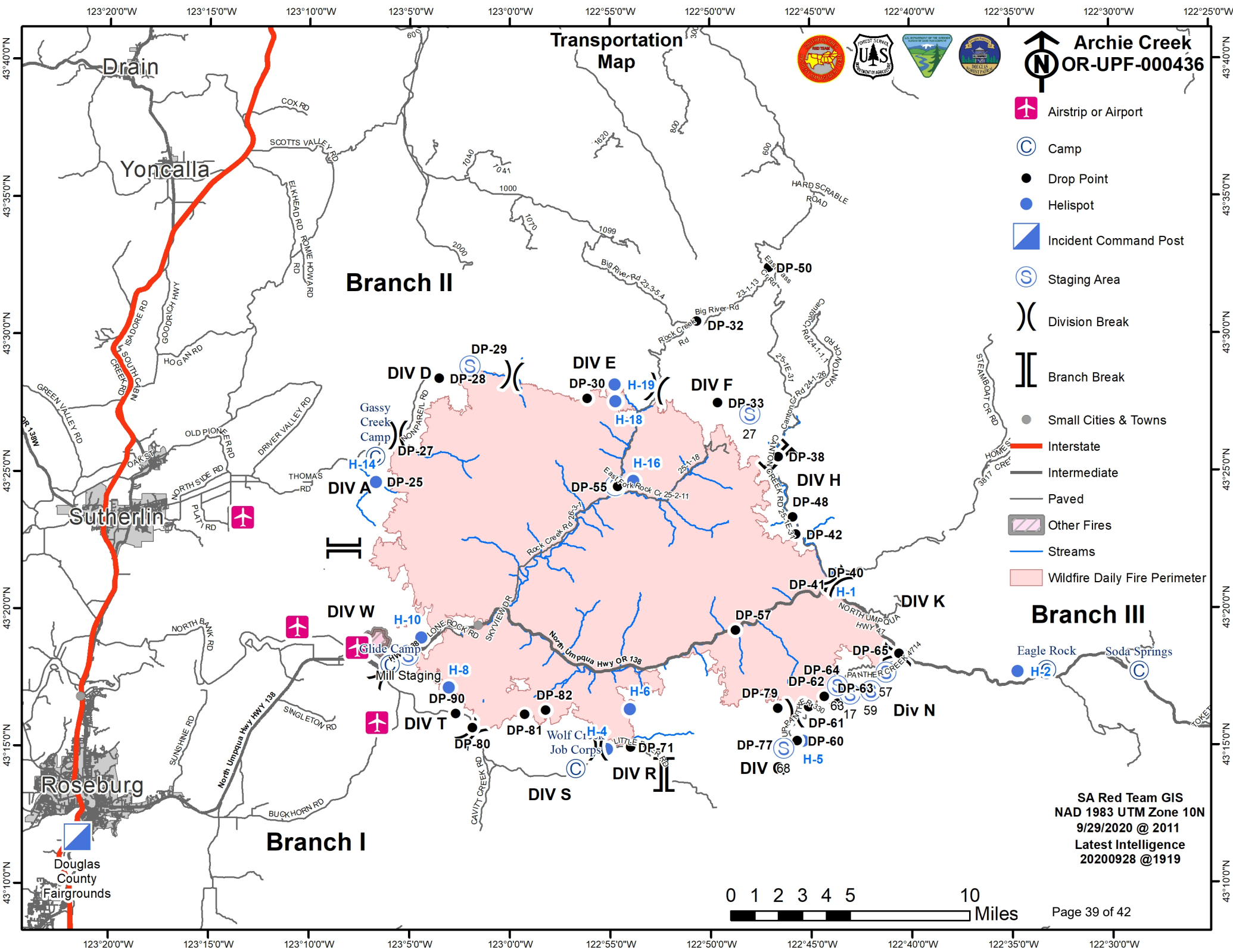

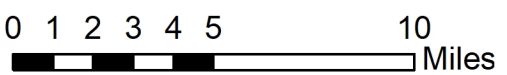
