



WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Cool and areas of valley fog this morning will give way to sun, but high and then mid-level clouds will increase during the afternoon as a weak frontal boundary moves in. Winds will be fairly light and terrain driven, with a west-northwest general flow. Winds increase Tuesday and Wednesday with breezy to windy conditions Wednesday. Wetting rainfall is expected Wednesday afternoon through Friday with amounts near a half an inch likely.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: Mostly Clear except for areas of valley fog in the morning, then increasing high and mid-level clouds in the afternoon.

High Temperatures: 65-76°F. (24hr Trend: Down 4F)

Afternoon Humidity: 30-50%, highest on the ridges. (24hr Trend: Up 5%)

20 Foot Winds:

Valleys/Lower Slopes: Down slope/drainage 5-10 mph, becoming up slope and up drainage 5-10 mph late morning with gusts 10-15 mph in the afternoon,

Upper Slopes & Ridges: Southeast 5 mph in the morning, becoming WNW 5-10 mph with gusts 10-15 mph in the afternoon into the evening.

(24hr Wind Trend: East wind 5 mph less in the morning and SE instead. Wind WNW sooner in afternoon ridges)

Transport Wind: SE 5 mph in the morning, becoming NW 10 mph in the afternoon.

Inversion: 3,000ft MSL through late morning.

Afternoon Mixing Height: 9,000ft MSL.

Local Thresholds – Watch Out

20-foot winds over 13 mph, RH under 25%, Temperature over 85°, 1,000-hour fuel moisture less than 12%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL:

Low to moderate fire behavior is expected today. Active fire spread in exposed fuels can be expected after morning inversion lifts. Heavy fuels and deep duff will continue to smolder. Live fuel moistures and heavy fuels remain dry and in the critical range. Moderated humidities and temperatures coupled with increasing cloud cover will inhibit further drying of fuels.

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture = 7%, 1,000 Hour Fuel Moisture = 12%, Live Fuel Moisture = 70%. Live fuels are nearly cured and volatile. These fuels are still available despite the recent rains.

ERC's are at average and well below the 90th percentile. ERC values are expected to remain in this range the next 5 days.

Rate of spread and flame lengths based on fuel models shown, exposed on steep slopes.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub (GS2)	6 feet/minute	3 foot
Mature Timber (TU2)	5 feet/minute	2-4 feet

New spot fires can reach 2.5 acres in one hour in timber stands, 6 acres/hour in grass/shrub.
Probability of Ignition = 53%

Specific Areas of Concern:

Branch I

Division R - The area near Emile creek and the Little River is of most concern due to heavy fuel loading. Smoldering in sheltered timber stands will continue, promoting potential for roll out and root falling of green trees above the 138 road.

Branch II

Division E&F – The main heat is centered around the E & F division break. Favorable weather conditions will moderate any spread potential. Fuels outside of containment lines remain available for ignition.

Branch III

Division N – The main area of concern is along the Panther Creek road. A fuel change due to the 2002 Apple fire will moderate fire behavior due to the higher fine fuel moistures.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Areas of fog in the morning may hamper early air operations. No anticipated issues for Air Operations after the fog lifts.

SAFETY:

Beware of the Burning Stump Hole!

Smoldering stump holes and deep ash pits may not be immediately noticeable to crews cold trailing and mopping up, but they do present a significant hazard to personnel mopping up and cold trailing. Take your time when inspecting potential hot spots using tools first.




If air transport is chosen, implement the plan for alternative transportation in the event aircraft cannot complete the mission. Names of injured or deceased individuals will not be transmitted on the radio. • Initiate documentation for future investigation; if a line safety officer is available, assign them to lead documentation. Do not move deceased individuals, gear or personal effects except to accomplish rescue work or protect the safety of others. Obtain written documentation of witnesses. The Unit Log, ICS 214, may be used for the initial documentation, but a subsequent narrative will be required. • As appropriate, conduct an After Action Review to determine successes, areas to improve and lessons learned.

INCIDENT: Archie Creek Wildfire	DATE: Monday September 21, 2020
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Major Hazards & Risks: FOCUS on → Driving & Fatigue
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Driving is one of the most hazardous things we do. We perform the task many times in the course of our daily lives so we tend to take it for granted. Based on recent accident trends, vehicle accidents are the main source of deaths and serious injuries to wildland firefighters.

- To be a safe driver you have to *want* to be one. Take a good hard look at your driving habits. Are you training yourself to do the right things the right way, like fastening your seat belt, driving prudently for the road conditions, and maintaining safe following distances?
- Inattentiveness is a major contributing factor in motor vehicle accidents within the wildland firefighting community. Since the average adult attention span is 15-20 minutes we must develop techniques that allow us to refocus our attention on our driving.
- Many things can lure our attention away from our driving such as fatigue, eating and drinking, reading directions and maps, writing, cell phone and radio use, conversation within the vehicle, and music.
 - Practice situational awareness; be aware of what is happening in front, behind, and on both sides of your vehicle.
 - Delegate navigation and communication to a passenger or pull over.
 - Do not be in a hurry, be patient.
- Safe driving starts with a safe vehicle. Before operating any vehicle, do a walk-around to look for potential problems, make sure the lights and blinkers work, adjust your seat and mirrors. If it is the first time you have driven the vehicle, take time to familiarize yourself with it.

Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue is defined as fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, which results in decreased productivity, *compromised immune function*, and reduced alertness. Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors and become inattentive. *Chronic fatigue often results in increased stress.* Recommendations for chronic fatigue/stress are:

- Take longer periods of rest/recovery and Ensure that workers are adequately rested before they begin work shifts. Provide periodic rest breaks to allow physical and mental recovery.
- Eat well-balanced meals regularly, with energy supplements during periods of high exertion and maintain hydration.
- Ensure workers maintain good personal hygiene.
- Maintain high standards of physical fitness and work capacity.
- In extreme cases, personnel may need to be relieved of their duties.

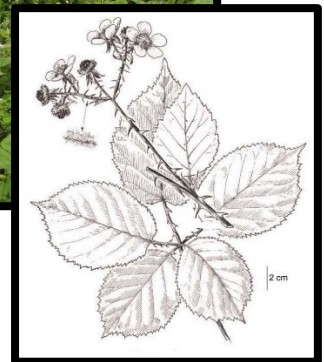


NOXIOUS WEEDS

Noxious weeds are nonnative, invasive plant species that cause ecological and/or economical harm. Nonnative plant species can change fire regimes, form monocultures, and displace native plant communities and the wildlife that depend on those communities. A couple of our most common noxious weeds in the area include Scotch broom and Himalayan blackberry.....

Scotch broom was introduced from Europe as a garden ornamental and later used for erosion control. Today, Scotch broom costs Oregonians an estimated \$40 million a year in lost timber revenue and control efforts.

Scotch broom seeds can remain viable in the seed bank for 50-80 years.



Himalayan blackberry

was introduced into North America in 1885 by Luther Burbank for the fruit. The plant was established on the west coast by 1945.

Blackberry canes can root at the tip, growing daughter plants; the seeds are spread by birds and other animals.

There are several native blackberry and raspberry species in our area; Himalayan blackberry can be distinguished by the robustness of the plant; the red, angled stems; and compound leaves which typically have 5 leaflets.

Help prevent the spread of noxious weeds and other nonnative plant species by visiting the weed wash before bringing equipment into the fire area, and before you demob, so you don't take our noxious weed seeds with you.....
