

### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

Areas of low clouds and fog this morning will give way to partly cloudy skies late morning into the early afternoon. High clouds are expected to increase mid-late afternoon. Temperatures and humidity will be about that same as they were on Monday. A light southerly component to the wind in the morning will become southwesterly around midday, and then west to northwest later in the afternoon into the evening. It will be breezy Wednesday with rainfall arriving in the evening hours. Storm total rain amounts Wednesday night through Friday are likely to be 0.50 to 0.70".

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### **Today (0600-1800):**

**Weather:** Mostly Cloudy due to areas of fog and low clouds through mid to late morning, then Partly Cloudy. Becoming Mostly Cloudy mid to late afternoon due to high clouds.

**High Temperatures:** 67-77°F. (24hr Trend: Up 0-2F)

**Afternoon Humidity:** 30-50%, highest on the ridges. (24hr Trend: Little to no change)

### **20 Foot Winds:**

**Valleys/Lower Slopes:** Down slope/drainage 5-10 mph, becoming up slope and up drainage 5-10 mph late morning with gusts 10-15 mph in the afternoon,

**Upper Slopes & Ridges:** Southeast 5 mph in the morning, becoming WSW 5-10 mph with gusts 10-15 mph in the afternoon, then turning WNW late afternoon into the evening.

#### Local Thresholds – Watch Out

20-foot winds > 13 mph, RH under 25%, Temperature over 85°, 1,000-hour fuel moisture less than 12%.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR:

#### **GENERAL:**

Fuel moisture in the fine fuels have started to dry. Heavy fuels remain have started to recover but remain below the average and are still available to burn. Live fuels are nearly cured and are still very volatile.

Fine Dead Fuel Moisture = 7%, 1,000 Hour Fuel Moisture = 13%, Live Fuel Moisture = 70%

ERC's are above average but well below the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile. ERC values are expected to remain in this range the next few days and will drop considerably with the next rain event.

Rate of spread and flame lengths are based on maximum values for the fuel models shown, exposed fuels on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub (GS2)	29 feet/minute	5 feet
Mature Timber (TU2 & TL5)	5-15 feet/minute	2-4 feet

In **one hour** new spot fires can reach **4 acres in timber stands & 20 acres in exposed grass/shrub areas.**

Probability of Ignition = 48%

#### **Specific Areas of Concern:**

##### **Branch I**

Division S - The area near Emile creek and the Little River is of most concern, keeping fire from further progressing up the Emile Creek drainage towards Emile and Grotto Falls is critical. Reduced fire behavior and a shortened burn period will allow for direct line placement. Spread potential is low-moderate.

##### **Branch II**

Division E & F – The main heat is centered around the E & F division break. Favorable weather conditions will moderate any spread potential.

##### **Branch III**

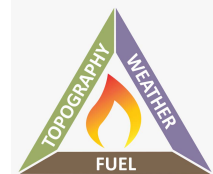
Division N – The area of concern is along the Panther Creek road where fire has moved across the road in several locations. Fire behavior conditions are favorable for direct line placement.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** No anticipated issues for Air Operations after the fog lifts in the late morning.

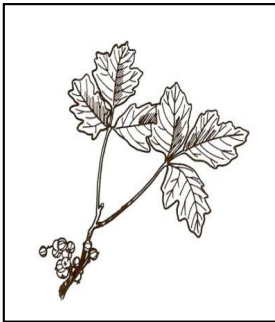

**Major Hazards & Risks:** *FOCUS on* → Poison Oak and Hazard Trees

### POISON OAK

An itchy, red rash can be a serious problem for firefighters working in the woods. A local plant in the fire area is called Poison Oak. Their resinous sap (found in leaves, stems, and roots) contain several oils which cause an allergic reaction on the skin with itching, swelling, and painful blisters. Wildland firefighters and forestry workers particularly run the risk of exposure to these plants. Highlights:



- Employees who are *extremely sensitive* to this toxic plants need to be assigned duties that do not expose them to these plants
- Everyone should try to recognize and avoid these plants, relying not only their distinctive leaf shapes, but also on black spots on their leaves
- IvyBlock lotion or similar products can help prevent allergic reactions to the toxic compounds in these plants.
- Launder or change out nomex clothing regularly

### HAZARD TREES

Snags are dead, standing trees without leaves or needles in the crowns and present a significant threat to forest worker safety. Snags may burn through more quickly than green trees and can fall without warning. *Live, structurally compromised green trees weakened by fire can also fall without notice.* Identify mitigation measures to reduce risk from hazard trees:

- Identify, communicate, establish, and monitor No-Work-Zones in all high-risk areas until the hazard has been mitigated. Assign highly qualified sawyers to mitigate
- Use heavy equipment or explosives to avoid placing sawyers under hazards.
- Plan quick and safe escape routes.
- Minimize exposure time at the stump by employing efficient felling procedures.
- Minimize impacts to the hazard tree from wedge pounding or other felling operations in the area.
- Do not turn your back on a falling tree or known hazard.
- Use lookouts to maintain secure felling areas.
- Discuss/practice medical evacuation procedures and accept risk accordingly.

## Daily COVID-19 Reminder

- **“MODULE OF ONE” Concept:** Resources assigned to the Archie Fire need to focus on reducing the amount of time they spend around other resources they do not need to directly work with. Please limit your exposure to other resources.

4. As often as possible

After being notified by your supervisor of your tentative release date:

Step 1. Return all supplies, radios, etc. that were checked out.

Step 2. Submit final time documents to finance

Remember to provide a valid email address. Finance staff will post your time, let you review a draft, and send your final time documents to you, all electronically. Do Not leave the incident without your final OF-2898 or OF-286.

Step 3. All vehicles that have been on the fireline must go through the weed wash.

Location:

- Roseburg Fairgrounds (regular vehicles/crummies/engines)
- Glide (all heavy equipment, and all vehicles)

**AFTER steps 1-3 are completed:**

Step 4. Complete Demob Checkout Sheet using QR code. Once you submit the Demob Checkout Sheet you are released from the incident and may begin travel home. You do not need to physically come to demob.
