

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

High pressure will continue to weaken over the fire today with cooler temperatures and slightly higher Rh's. The winds as the winds will continue to be slope driven as the winds aloft will be light through Sunday. A weak upper level disturbance will move across the fire on Monday and this will mainly be dry, with no precipitation expected. The winds on Monday will become easterly, but expect wind speeds to remain relatively light, with the main effect of this being drier air moving into the area. Temperatures will be on the rise and Rh's will be lower once again on Tuesday and Wednesday, as high pressure strengthens over the region.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: Sunny and cooler.

High Temperatures: 69-79. (24hr Trend: Down 4-5°F)

Afternoon Humidity: 34-44%, highest on the ridges. (24hr Trend: Up 8-10%)

20 Foot Winds:

Valleys/Lower Slopes: Down slope/drainage 5 mph, becoming upslope from the south 5-10 mph late morning, then generally from the west and up drainage 5-10 mph in the afternoon.

Upper Slopes & Ridges: South 5 mph becoming SW 5-8 G12 mph in the afternoon, then NW 5-8 mph, with gusts to 12 mph late afternoon into the evening.
(24hr Wind Trend: Steady)

Transport Wind: NW 10 mph.

LAL: 1.

Inversion: Weak at 3,000ft MSL early.

Local Thresholds for Elevated Fire Behavior– Watch Outs

20-foot winds > 13 mph, RH under 25%, Temperature over 85°, 1,000-hour fuel moisture less than 12%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR:

GENERAL:

One- and ten-hour fuels will remain receptive to ignition. One-hour fuels in 6% in exposed locations to 9% in sheltered locations. Ten-hour fuels, 7%. 1000-hour fuels remain above critical levels at around 14%.

Fire behavior will be **minimal** today. No active fire spread is expected. **Smoldering** in stumps, snags, and downed heavy fuels will continue. **Creeping** fire may occur in areas with **needle/leaf drop**. No fire perimeter growth is expected.

If fire starts outside containment lines expect moderate running fire with occasional torching.

ERC values are slightly above average. ERC-G is **51** at Grandad RAWs. Critical ERC level 54-58.

Rate of spread and flame lengths are model outputs based on **maximum values** for the fuel models shown, with current fuel moistures in exposed locations on steep slope.

Fuel Model	Rate of Spread	Flame Length
Grass/Shrub (GS2)	11 chains/hour 13 feet/min	3 feet
Mature Timber (TU2 & TL5)	5 chains/hour 6 feet/min	2 feet

In **one hour** a spot fire would be approximately **1.6 acres** in timber and **5 acres** in grass/shrub.
Probability of Ignition = **53%**

Specific Areas of Concern:

All Divisions:

Any remaining heat source, stumps, logs, and snags.

Areas with heavy needle/leaf cast.

Snags burning at the base.

AIR OPERATIONS: No concerns for Air Operations.

SAFETY:

Burning (Smoldering) snags!

Watch out for snags burning at their base. This can be hard to detect. Especially snags up hill and away from the fire line. These snags can burn until they fall and make a downhill run, posing a serious hazard to folks below.

We would like to collect them in the evening and implement the ideas to help us finish strong where everyone goes home safe.</p> <p>Driving/Backing: Driving to and from the Incident continues to be one of the most dangerous tasks we do each day. Driving alert and safely depends on your mindset and commitment to others on the roadway. Ensuring you have adequate rest and remain both physically and mentally healthy throughout assignments will help you to maintain safe driving practices. Ensure you are using spotters for all backing of vehicles and paying attention to your surroundings.</p> <p>Heavy Equipment/Traffic: Heavy equipment operations will continue to have specific hazards that continuously need mitigation. Needs for spotters and road guards around high traffic areas are paramount to responder and public safety. As forest closures are opened or reduced in the fire areas public interface will increase. Increasing traffic near fire repair operations will have the need for our personnel to monitor safety continuously.</p> <p>Fatigue: It has been a long season for most all of us. Long periods of multiple days spent working fires can take its toll on the best of us. Please take the time to take care of yourself. Frequent breaks, adequate rest, hydration, good eating habits, and good personal hygiene practices will help mitigate the accumulated fatigue.</p> <p>Transition: Transition has proven to be a “Watch-Out” situation for ALL assigned resources. Transition hazards must be mitigated the same as any hazard, by ensuring good briefings covering timely information about locations, amenities and most importantly command and control changes. Use good situational awareness, take the extra time to ensure all information and direction is understood.</p>

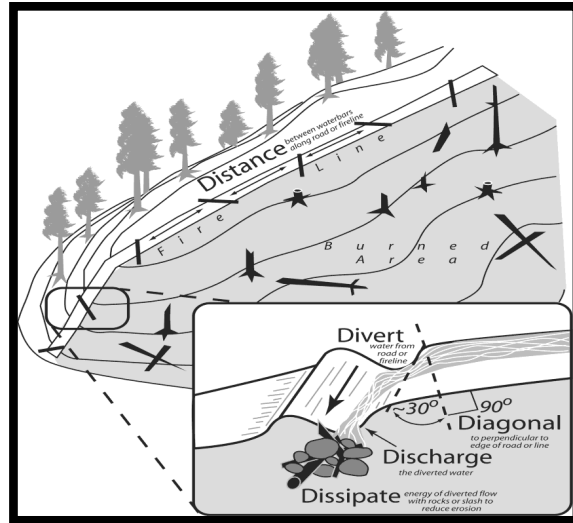
Top 10 Natural Resources Take-homes from Archie Creek

These are the top 10 messaging points and/ or tidbits of 'gee-whiz' info that we have shared that will prove useful no matter what incident you work on. Thank you for your most excellent work here and safe travels as you time out and return to your home units! Note: these are not listed in order of importance.

- 1) Constructing EFFECTIVE waterbars on firelines includes attention following the 5-D's; Distance, Divert, Diagonal, Discharge, and Dissipate. The purpose of waterbars is to slow water down as it travels downhill. When constructed correctly, waterbars help reduce excessive erosion and mitigate sediment transfer to streams and rivers.

1-6%	300 ft.
7-9%	200 ft.
10-14%	150 ft.
15-20%	90 ft.
21-40%	50 ft.
41-60+%	25 ft.

- 2) **RAPTORS HAVE 3 EYELIDS.**
- 3) Control efforts and economic losses stemming from noxious weeds are extremely costly – upwards of \$125 million, in Oregon alone. The best thing we can do is to prevent the spread; use the weed wash whenever possible, check your clothing for seeds, and ensure no plant parts/seeds make the journey home with you.
- 4) In areas where there are cultural sites, please do not move the items from where you discovered them. Simply collect point location, and pass the data to a READ/F on your division.
- 5) As pumps are set up for mop-up, please keep fuel as far from the streams as possible, and make sure each pump has a containment kit. Set pumps, fuel, jerry cans, etc. on level ground and ensure absorbent pads are changed when they become 50% saturated.
- 6) Avoid drafting from smaller streams – if you need help finding water sources, please contact a Resource Advisor, as on most incidents, at least a few of them are local, have incredible knowledge of the area, and can assist with minimal response time.
- 7) Splash erosion occurs when raindrops (which can travel at up to 20 mph) strike soil without any plant cover or woody debris to intercept the drop's kinetic energy, soil particles can splash up to five feet horizontally and two feet in the air.
- 8) You'd be surprised how long trash persists; thanks for your efforts on this incident!
- 9) Noxious weed seeds can remain viable for 1 – 80 years, depending on species.

10) The Chinook is the biggest of all of the Pacific salmon, growing as long as 53 inches and weighing as much as 126 pounds. This fish holds a significant stature culturally, economically, and recreationally.

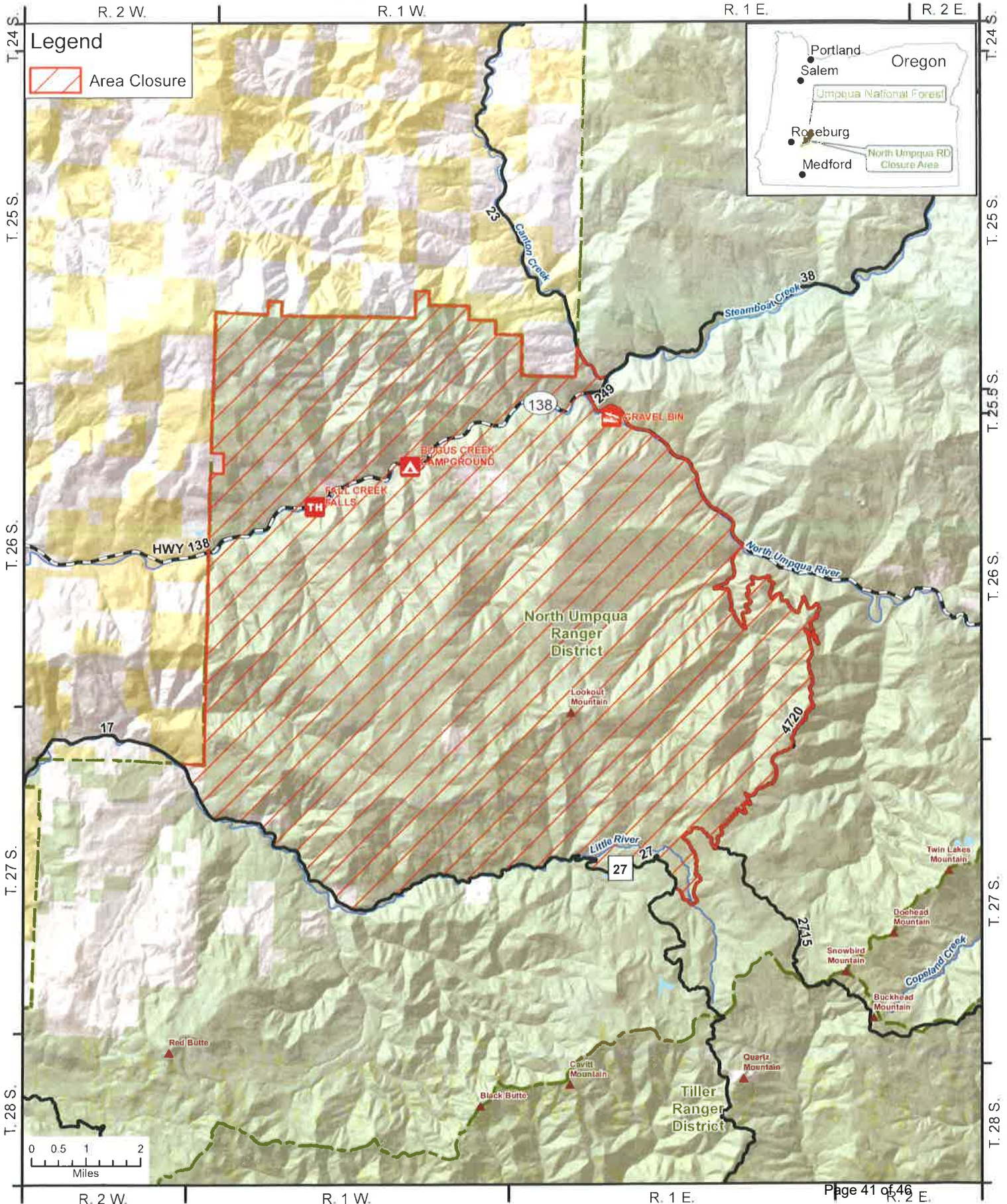

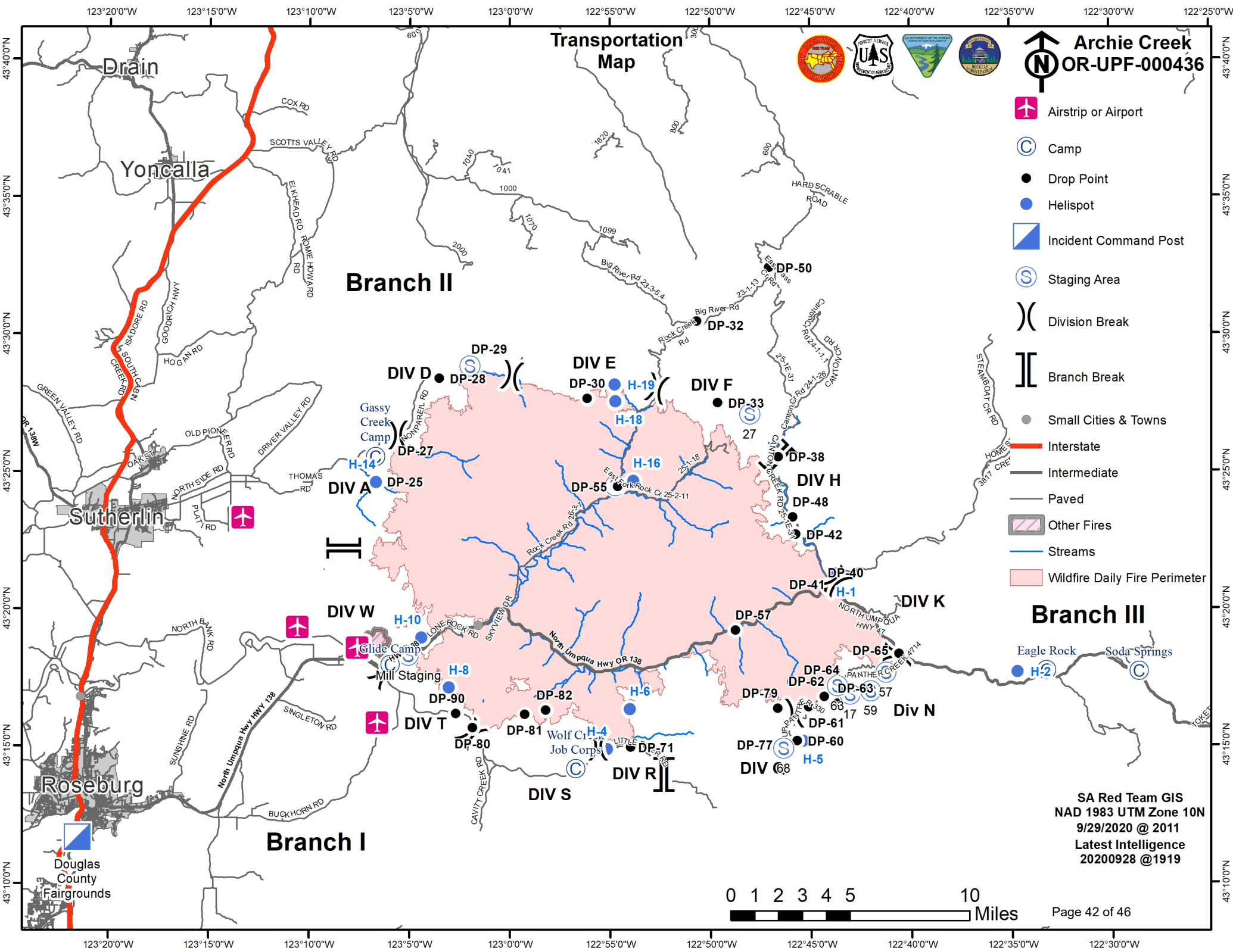

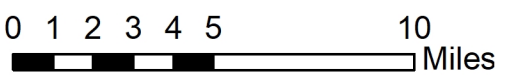
