<u>Weather Discussion:</u> Temperatures once again rise into the 80s with humidity falling into the teens. The east winds tapered off overnight giving way to more of a terrain driven wind pattern moving forward. Overnight humidity recoveries will once again be poor. This pattern looks to persist into the weekend with temperatures remaining well above normal and humidity values in the teens and twenties during the day.

WEATHER FORECAST:

Today:

SKY/WEATHER: Light terrain driven winds. Sunny skies with temperatures well above normal.

High Temperature...80-85F Min RH.....14-19%

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION

GENERAL: Continued warmer and drier weather. Areas still retaining heat will continue showing themselves.

Predicted Fire Behavior:

Limited relative humidity recovery last night allowed hot areas to continue to smolder and creep where fuels are available.

As relative humidity drops and temperatures rise, fuels will again support minimal spread where small diameter fuels are present. Standing grass and needle cast in open areas (limited canopy) could support spread up to 100 feet per hour. Flame lengths will remain less than 2 feet.

Probability of Ignition:

After yesterday drying and last night's limited relative humidity recovery POI is predicted to be near 65%.

SPECIFIC:

Today: The east and southeastern portions of Division P/W continue to be the most likely area have spread to the east and north from the few remaining hot areas.

Tonight: Slightly better humidity recovery will stall fire movement through the evening hours.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Clear skies with winds will allow for aerial resources to work the fire early.


SAFETY:

Watch Out Situation 14: Weather becoming hotter and drier

While the fire has not shown much activity over the last couple days, heat is still available to rekindle unburned fuel. Hotter and drier conditions will continue over the next few days. We will see more visible smoke with even some creeping surface fire possible. Energy Release Component (ERC) values are forecast to continue rising over the next 10 days.

Weather: Be aware of Lower Relative Humidity's, Higher Temperatures trending this week


Heavy Equipment: There is a lot of heavy equipment on both the Archie Creek & Thielsen Fire and likely more to come for suppression repair, and fuels reduction. With that brings large transports needed to move the equipment into and around the fire. You can help reduce the possibility of having an accident by driving slowly, stay alert and drive defensively. When you park in these areas make sure your vehicle does not block the travel way on these roads. If you are a passenger while the driver is backing offer to get out and be a spotter. These are certainly accidents that can be prevented.

Falling Snags: In addition to the heavy equipment, there will be fallers along interior roads to fell hazard trees. Fallers make sure you have road guards before felling trees along roadways.

Chippers: It is important that all resources working with the chipper be briefed on safe working practices and sign the JHA for chipper operation before using the chipper. The operator of the chipper must be trained and qualified. The operator should be the owner or employee of the chipper contractor.

Powerline: Always treat downed powerlines as if they are LIVE wires. Refer to Powerline Safety in the (IRPG) **Incident Response Pocket Guide** pages 24 & 25.

Notice of Right to Representation

As a bargaining unit employee represented by a labor organization, you have the right to request representation from your certified labor organization at any investigative examination/interview where you reasonably believe the examination might result in disciplinary action being taken against you. You may make this request at any time prior to or during the interview. If you request union representation, your agency may opt to: (1) suspend questioning and grant your request then resume the interview; (2) discontinue the interview; or (3) offer you the choice to proceed with the interview without a Union representative or to forego the interview.

Clarification about the Above Notice

If a management representative wants to question you (a bargaining unit employee) about an allegation that you were involved in some occurrence that could result in a proposal to discipline you, Union believes it is in your interest to have a Union representative present when you are questioned. *You have to invoke that right by asking for representation*. *Management is not obligated to inform you of this right, and they are not obligated to automatically arrange for a Union representative to be present.* In the event that you request representation and a Union representative has not been dispatched to the incident, contact will be made with the Union representative listed above, and arrangements will be made for that representative or his designee to come out on site, or to meet with you by telephone.




IAP Transportation Map **Thielsen Fire**
