**Weather Discussion:** With the ridge of high pressure firmly in control of the weather pattern, conditions for the next couple of days will be very similar to the past few days. Temperatures remain 15-20 degrees above normal through Friday, before the ridge weakens and temperatures cool several degrees. Humidity values both minimum and maximum will slowly increase as temperatures fall. Terrain driven winds look to remain the dominant wind pattern. Smoke from California fires will slowly encroach on the region. Changes appear on the horizon with cooler temperatures and an increase of moisture for the second half of next week.

#### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

Today:

SKY/WEATHER: Hot and dry with terrain driven winds. Mid and high level smoke.

High Temperature...84-89F Min RH......15-20%

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION

GENERAL: Continued drying with ERC values remaining at average and below the 50th percentile.

#### Predicted Fire Behavior:

Fuel conditions outside the current fire footprint could support spread however, lack of mid-flame winds limit spread. Fire behavior within the fire footprint will be limited to smoldering and very slow creeping in the deep duff and in heavy jackpots of down dead. 100 and 1000 hour fuels hover around the 25<sup>th</sup> percentile while fine dead and 10 hour fuel continue to trend low and above the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile for this time of year. In lighter grass with exposure to sunlight and slope, new starts could observe spread rates at 13 chains/hour with flame lengths of 4 feet. In moderate load timber litter, expect spread rates at 1 chain/hour with flame lengths of less than a foot.

#### Probability of Ignition:

After yesterday drying and last night's moderate relative humidity recovery POI is predicted to be near 85%.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Today:** Both divisions continue to hold isolated interior heat. These heat sources remain the areas in which smoldering and creeping continue to be expected.

Tonight: Moderate humidity recovery and cool overnight temperatures stall any fire spread.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Another day of clear skies with minimal wind should create favorable conditions for aerial operations throughout the burn period.

#### SAFETY:

Caesar Augustus is said to have first adopted the motto: Festina Lente. Make haste, slowly. To act with due diligence, focus, and attention to detail in order to avoid mistakes and finish a task more expeditiously overall.






Definitions of a Fire Weather Watch and a Red Flag Warning

A Fire Weather Watch or Red Flag Warning is issued when the combination of dry fuels and weather conditions support extreme fire danger. These products are written for land and fire managers to highlight the increased fire danger.

Each NWS office creates local criteria for fire weather watches and red flag warnings. The criteria for Medford Weather Forecast Office (WFO), Fire Zone 617 is:

- Abundant lightning, LAL of 3 or greater unless fuels are exceptionally dry with an LAL of 2.
- Min RH < 15% and 10 minute sustained wind 10+ mph or peak winds to 20+ mph lasting > 2 hours.
- Min RH < 30% AND sustained wind 10+ mph lasting > 2 hours
- Haines Index forecast of 6 in conjunction with an ongoing fire.





The difference in a Fire Weather Watch and Red Flag Warning is essentially the confidence of the fire weather zone office in the likelihood of the event occurring. 

#### Notice of Right to Representation

As a bargaining unit employee represented by a labor organization, you have the right to request representation from your certified labor organization at any investigative examination/interview where you reasonably believe the examination might result in disciplinary action being taken against you. You may make this request at any time prior to or during the interview. If you request union representation, your agency may opt to: (1) suspend questioning and grant your request then resume the interview; (2) discontinue the interview; or (3) offer you the choice to proceed with the interview without a Union representative or to forego the interview.

#### Clarification about the Above Notice

If a management representative wants to question you (a bargaining unit employee) about an allegation that you were involved in some occurrence that could result in a proposal to discipline you, Union believes it is in your interest to have a Union representative present when you are questioned. *You have to invoke that right by asking for representation*. *Management is not obligated to inform you of this right, and they are not obligated to automatically arrange for a Union representative to be present.* In the event that you request representation and a Union representative has not been dispatched to the incident, contact will be made with the Union representative listed above, and arrangements will be made for that representative or his designee to come out on site, or to meet with you by telephone.
