Weather Discussion: Conditions as a whole remain similar to previous days with temperatures well above normal and low relative humidity. Only subtle changes are expected with a degree or two cooler daytime highs and a percent or two higher humidity. This slight cooling trend continues into Sunday before we warm up with the ridge rebounding Monday and Tuesday. Terrain driven winds looks to remain the dominant wind pattern for the next several days.

WEATHER FORECAST:

Today:

SKY/WEATHER: Increasing smoke from California fires. A degree or two cooler.

Extended Outlook:

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION

GENERAL: 100 and 1000 hour fuels slowly trend drier and could start burning more readily.

Predicted Fire Behavior:

Another day of minimal fire behavior could be observed today. Previous infrared show scattered and isolated heat throughout the fire however, these heat sources are more than likely a combination of stump holes and heavy down/dead fuel. For any new starts in the Thielsen Fire initial attack area, grass fuel could expect to observe spread rates of up to 18 chains an hour with flame lengths of less than 5 feet. In high load timber, spread rates would be less than 3 chains an hour with flame lengths of 2 feet.

Probability of Ignition:

Continued drying with relative humidity values in the low twenties will result in predicted POI near 73%.

SPECIFIC:

Today: Infrared shows isolated heat throughout both divisions. The majority of this isolated heat should be stump holes and possibly 100 and 1000 hour dead and down fuels.

Tonight: Moderate to good humidity recovery and cool nighttime temperatures stall overnight fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Hazy skies, due to the wildfire situation in Northern California, will begin settling into the fire area today. This haze should have no impact on aerial operations today.

SAFETY

Warm and dry weather has continued for the past 5 days. Complacency can be a factor as operations have primarily moved to suppression repair. Resources should maintain readiness and awareness in case a new fire is discovered.

LEARN MORE ABOUT FIRE BEHAVIOR---

Haines (1988) developed the Lower Atmosphere Stability Index, or Haines Index, for fire weather use.

The Haines Index is used to indicate the potential for wildfire growth by measuring the stability and dryness of the air over a fire. It is calculated by combining the stability and moisture content of the lower atmosphere into a number that correlates well with large fire growth. The stability term is determined by the temperature difference between two atmospheric layers; the moisture term is determined by the temperature and dew point difference. This index has been shown to be correlated with large fire growth on initiating and existing fires where surface winds do not dominate fire behavior.

Haines Index is computed from the morning (12Z) soundings from RAwinsonde Observation (RAOB) stations across North America and is a measure of how readily atmospheric conditions roughly 1 to 3 km (0.5 to 2 miles) above the ground would support the development of a large or erratic plume dominated wildfire.

The Haines Index can range between 2 and 6. The drier and more unstable the lower atmosphere is, the higher the index.

Major Hazards & Risks: Driving, Hazard Trees, Deer Gun Season



Driving: More people and more trucks mean more potential for collisions. Gravel roads are not the only places that are narrow and winding. Watch out on those paved roads, too. *Log trucks* will be using the Canton Road to 138 and down into Roseburg. Be *extra cautious*

near Base Camp in Glide. There is also extremely heavy traffic on 97 especially in Chemult, at the Ranger Station where turning traffic and pedestrians are present.

Hazard Trees: There is a high concentration of hazard trees over in Branch III especially in the Wright Creek area. If you are working in this area or passing through, be heads up and let the Division Supervisor (known as the Wright Creek Group) know you are entering the area. *Identify hazard trees, avoid them or remove them safely.*


Hunters and recreation riders are using off road vehicles on many of the same roads as fire personnel. **Heads up** on blind corners and drive defensively. Deer gun season **starts tomorrow** so beware.

Notice of Right to Representation

As a bargaining unit employee represented by a labor organization, you have the right to request representation from your certified labor organization at any investigative examination/interview where you reasonably believe the examination might result in disciplinary action being taken against you. You may make this request at any time prior to or during the interview. If you request union representation, your agency may opt to: (1) suspend questioning and grant your request then resume the interview; (2) discontinue the interview; or (3) offer you the choice to proceed with the interview without a Union representative or to forego the interview.

Clarification about the Above Notice

If a management representative wants to question you (a bargaining unit employee) about an allegation that you were involved in some occurrence that could result in a proposal to discipline you, Union believes it is in your interest to have a Union representative present when you are questioned. *You have to invoke that right by asking for representation.*Management is not obligated to inform you of this right, and they are not obligated to automatically arrange for a Union representative to be present. In the event that you request representation and a Union representative has not been dispatched to the incident, contact will be made with the Union representative listed above, and arrangements will be made for that representative or his designee to come out on site, or to meet with you by telephone.
