Weather Discussion: The warm and dry weather pattern will continue as the ridge of high pressure remains in place. A weak wave of energy passes through Washington State on Sunday that will flatten the ridge of high pressure bringing temperatures down a few degrees. The aforementioned ridge rebounds on Monday allowing for a warming trend through midweek. Overnight humidity recovery continues to be good on the fire.

FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION

GENERAL: Heavy down dead fuel moistures are running average for this time of year. 1 and 10-Hour Fuel moistures are low and trend at or below the 85th percentile.

Predicted Fire Behavior:

Resources on Cinnamon Butte reported a single tree torch on the east flank of division P/W early in the day yesterday. Division A/M also reported duff smoldering under heavy canopy, which has shaded fuels and inhibited drying until recently.

- Live herbaceous and woody fuel moistures are low and with the contribution of jackpot ladder fuels, single tree torching could continue to be observed.
- Unburned interior fuels comprised of duff, needle cast, and 10 hour fuels can support spread, which can result in consumption up through ladder fuels and into the canopy. Weak terrain winds won't support spread through the canopy.

SPECIFIC:

Today: Continuation of drying further promotes consumption of duff, heavy down dead fuels, and single tree torching as observed yesterday on division P/W. Smoldering and slow creeping fire under the canopy in division A/M is expected.

Tonight: Moderate to good humidity recovery and cool nighttime temperatures stall overnight fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Continuation of hazy skies throughout the day, possibility clouds moving in late in the burn period. Neither should have an impact on aerial operations.

SAFETY:

It is recommended that firefighters limit their consumption of energy beverages and hydrate regularly. Results of studies revealed significant decreases in intracellular hydration immediately post exercise, as well as increased urinary output, blood pressure and heart rate when EBs were consumed, Recommended ratio of liquid intake is 3 waters per 1 Gatorade.

LEARN MORE ABOUT FIRE BEHAVIOR---

Evaluating spotting fire behavior requires the integration of three factors:

- the source, size, and number of firebrands
- the distance the firebrand is carried downwind
- The probability of igniting a new fire at the downwind location

Short-Range Spotting is not generally considered as significant in the growth of wildfires, because the advancing fire usually overruns the developing spot fire. Based on that, the assumption is that short range spotting is typically accounted for in the spread model outputs

Long-Range Spotting is differentiated from short-range spotting, primarily because firebrands are being lifted by a convection column and carried beyond the immediate fire area.

Major Hazards & Risks: Hydration, Fatigue, Driving/ Heavy Equipment, Public Interface, and Covid-19

Assignment: Completing the assignment starts from the time you check in till you are back home. The Southern Area Red Team wants to meet the objectives with the resources assigned to the incident. This means we are ALL to do our jobs efficiently and SAFELY to finish our assignment. By doing this we will have kept the faith that what we did on our assignment was intended to help sustain the forest.

Driving/Heavy Equipment: The Southern Area Red Team wants to thank everyone on the Incident for doing their part in safe operations. As we continue throughout the season, use deliberate actions when driving to and from the line such as slowing down, avoiding distractions while driving, using spotters when parking and backing, and driving defensively. Heavy equipment operations will continue to have specific hazards that continuously need mitigation. Needs for spotters and road guards around high traffic areas are paramount to safe operations. When new resources arrive, they are not familiar with the operations and routines so they should be briefed and made aware of operations in their work area.

Fatigue: It has been a long season for most all of us. Long periods of multiple days spent working fires can take its toll on the best of us. Please take the time to take care of yourself. Frequent breaks, adequate rest, hydration, good eating habits, and good personal hygiene practices will help mitigate the accumulated fatigue.





Notice of Right to Representation

As a bargaining unit employee represented by a labor organization, you have the right to request representation from your certified labor organization at any investigative examination/interview where you reasonably believe the examination might result in disciplinary action being taken against you. You may make this request at any time prior to or during the interview. If you request union representation, your agency may opt to: (1) suspend questioning and grant your request then resume the interview; (2) discontinue the interview; or (3) offer you the choice to proceed with the interview without a Union representative or to forego the interview.

Clarification about the Above Notice

If a management representative wants to question you (a bargaining unit employee) about an allegation that you were involved in some occurrence that could result in a proposal to discipline you, Union believes it is in your interest to have a Union representative present when you are questioned. You have to invoke that right by asking for representation. Management is not obligated to inform you of this right, and they are not obligated to automatically arrange for a Union representative to be present. In the event that you request representation and a Union representative has not been dispatched to the incident, contact will be made with the Union representative listed above, and arrangements will be made for that representative or his designee to come out on site, or to meet with you by telephone.







Important information for those traveling home by vehicle

Driving is the most hazardous thing we do while on an incident. It is for this reason I wanted to remind everyone about driving safely as you travel home. You should be well rested before beginning travel with 8 hours off before driving. Remember these rules as you prepare to go home.

- No driver will drive more than 10 hours (behind the wheel) within any duty-day.
- Multiple drivers in a single vehicle may drive up to the duty-day limitation provided no driver exceeds the individual driving (behind the wheel) time limitation of 10 hours.
- To manage fatigue, every effort should be made to conduct travel between 0500 and 2200 hours.
- Take a break every two hours besides meal stops, get out of the vehicle and walk around.




