Weather Discussion: A weak wave of energy passing to the north will flatten the ridge of high pressure allowing daytime temperatures to drop a handful of degrees. The ridge quickly rebounds on Monday into midweek bringing temperatures back into the mid to upper 70s. Minimum humidity values dip into the 20%s each day. Big changes look to come late in the week as a robust Pacific weather system moves onshore. Cooler temperatures and increased moisture are expected by the end of the week. This system should bring a good shot at wetting rains for much of the region.

SKY/WEATHER: Few degrees cooler than yesterday. Partly cloudy with smoke from California wildfires.

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FIRE BEHAVIOR DISCUSSION AND

GENERAL: Continued drying of fuels with the potential for isolated single tree torching increasing daily.

Predicted Fire Behavior:

Burn period today is shortened slightly due to good overnight humidity recovery and cool temperatures. Fuels should see continued slow smoldering and creeping throughout today's burn period.

Unburned interior fuels comprised of duff, needle cast, and 10 hour fuels can support spread, which can result
in consumption up through ladder fuels and into the canopy. Weak terrain winds won't support spread through
the canopy.

SPECIFIC:

Today: Portions of the understory near fire lines on division P/W are a checkerboard of unburned fuel with creeping ground fire being the prominent spread driver, while ladder fuel availability will continue to support isolated single tree torching. Divisions A/M should see continued smoldering and creeping with minimal mid-flame winds inhibiting torching currently.

Tonight: Moderate to good humidity recovery and cool nighttime temperatures stall overnight fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Low to moderate hanging smoke from the California wildfires should have no impacts to successful aerial operations today. 20 foot ridgetop wind gusts in the low teens would have no impacts.

SAFETY:

This fire has not done much for the past week plus. Today could be a different day. Maintain your situational awareness. Do not let your guard down. Play the what if game. Have a plan and be prepared to implement it.


LEARN MORE ABOUT FIRE BEHAVIOR --- Learning from the past:

Fire analysts frequently study historical weather, occurrence, and fire behavior to help predict current and expected fire behavior.

From discovery on September 8th through October 3rd the Thielsen Fire experienced two significant growth events.

- On the evening of September 8th an easterly wind with gusts of 32 miles per hour spread the fire overnight to the northwest approximately 6 miles.
- The burn periods of the 13th and 14th saw a strong southwesterly wind component, with gusts between 8 and 14 miles per hour, and resulted in additional significant spread to the northeast.

When observing the wind speed and wind direction Wind Rose Graph, from https://wrcc.dri.edu/cgi-bin/rawMAIN.pl?orOCIN, there are two very noticeable wind patterns at the Cinnamon RAWS that those winds of the 8th and 14th mimicked. Local responders within the area are aware of these SW and E wind trends and prepare accordingly.

- 1. To be prepared in case fire moves beyond current containment.
- 2. To ensure fire stays within current footprint.
- 3. To ensure safety of infrastructure at Cinnamon Butte.
- 4. To stay situationally aware of fire movement.
- 5. To prevent erosion and natural resource damage.

END STATE:

- 1. To have a defensible line to burn off and contain the fire.
- 2. Fire is no longer a threat to escape.
- 3. Infrastructure is safe with no threats from the fire.
- 4. To know if fire poses any threat to move beyond current location.
- All disturbed ground returned, as close as possible, to pre-fire conditions.

7. Special Instructions:

- *O-69 EMPF Med Transport, O-175 EMTF Forsythe, and E-71 AMBO 1571 are located at DP-52.
- 1. If need arises to go to Cinnamon Butte communication site, coordinate with Division Papa. If unable to contact DIVS, contact Branch 1 or Field OSC.


Driving/Backing: Driving to and from the Incident continues to be one of the most dangerous tasks we do each day. Driving alert and safely depends on your mindset and commitment to others on the roadway. Ensuring you have adequate rest and remain both physically and mentally healthy throughout assignments will help you to maintain safe driving practices. Ensure you are using spotters for all backing of vehicles and paying attention to your surroundings.

Heavy Equipment/Traffic: Heavy equipment operations will continue to have specific hazards that continuously need mitigation. Needs for spotters and road guards around high traffic areas are paramount to responder and public safety. As forest closures are opened or reduced in the fire areas public interface will increase. Increasing traffic near fire repair operations will have the need for our personnel to monitor safety continuously.

Fatigue: It has been a long season for most all of us. Long periods of multiple days spent working fires can take its toll on the best of us. Please take the time to take care of yourself. Frequent breaks, adequate rest, hydration, good eating habits, and good personal hygiene practices will help mitigate the accumulated fatigue.

Transition: Transition has proven to be a "Watch-Out" situation for ALL assigned resources. Transition hazards must be mitigated the same as any hazard, by ensuring good briefings covering timely information about locations, amenities and most importantly command and control changes. Use good situational awareness, take the extra time to ensure all information and direction is understood.

Notice of Right to Representation

As a bargaining unit employee represented by a labor organization, you have the right to request representation from your certified labor organization at any investigative examination/interview where you reasonably believe the examination might result in disciplinary action being taken against you. You may make this request at any time prior to or during the interview. If you request union representation, your agency may opt to: (1) suspend questioning and grant your request then resume the interview; (2) discontinue the interview; or (3) offer you the choice to proceed with the interview without a Union representative or to forego the interview.

Clarification about the Above Notice

If a management representative wants to question you (a bargaining unit employee) about an allegation that you were involved in some occurrence that could result in a proposal to discipline you, Union believes it is in your interest to have a Union representative present when you are questioned. You have to invoke that right by asking for representation. Management is not obligated to inform you of this right, and they are not obligated to automatically arrange for a Union representative to be present. In the event that you request representation and a Union representative has not been dispatched to the incident, contact will be made with the Union representative listed above, and arrangements will be made for that representative or his designee to come out on site, or to meet with you by telephone.





Important information for those traveling home by vehicle

Driving is the most hazardous thing we do while on an incident. It is for this reason we want to remind everyone about driving safely as you travel home. You should be well rested before beginning travel with 8 hours off before driving. Remember these rules as you prepare to go home.

- No driver will drive more than 10 hours (behind the wheel) within any duty-day.
- Multiple drivers in a single vehicle may drive up to the duty-day limitation provided no driver exceeds the individual driving (behind the wheel) time limitation of 10 hours.
- To manage fatigue, every effort should be made to conduct travel between 0500 and 2200 hours.
- Take a break every two hours besides meal stops, get out of the vehicle and walk around.


As part of the demob process, we ask all personnel driving home to provide an estimate of your time of departure your estimated time of arrival, RON location, etc.


Thielsen Fire IAP Transportation Map


