



Most of the safety programs we are familiar with focus on, and propose "safe" practices or acts and equipment:


- Don't touch the flames, you'll burn yourself

- Use your saw chaps, or you'll cut yourself

All are good advice, and practices that if adhered to should lead to success in preventing an accident and/or injury!


What is sometimes forgotten, or lost is the concept of personal responsibility for one's safety, professionally described as adopting a safety culture or promoting behavior based safety. Basically safety is held as a value by all employees. Each employee feels a sense of responsibility for the safety of themselves, and their co-worker. From a managerial standpoint, the expectation is people can understand the communicated hazard, use the provided safety equipment, apply the provided training, speak up when something is out of whack and acknowledge people valuing safety! In practice the selftalk looks something like this:

- We are a professional group, use our PPE, and don't promote tomfoolery because we value our safety and want to survive to work another day!
- We not only understand, but embrace the idea that we are responsible for our own, and those we work with safety

16.GETTING FREQUENT SPOT FIRES **ACROSS LINE**




