

.DISCUSSION...

High pressure will keep the fire area dry this week. Smoke from area and regional fires may drift over the fire and produce hazy conditions, otherwise skies would be generally clear. Northeast winds will prevail into Wednesday. Temperatures will be cool and below normal Tuesday but dry with low relative humidity. Temperatures will warm closer to normal Wednesday but conditions will remain dry.
