<b>Grays Harbor Co. - Aberdeen</b>		Mostly cloudy, with a high near 49. West wind 5 to 11 mph. <u>Tonight:</u> Mostly cloudy, with a low around 38. West wind 5 to 10 mph becoming light northwest after midnight.				
<b>Lewis Co. - Centralia</b>		Partly sunny, with a high near 58. Calm wind becoming west northwest 5 to 8 mph in the afternoon. <u>Tonight:</u> Increasing clouds, with a low around 37. West northwest wind 5 to 10 mph becoming light and variable in the evening.				
<b>Pacific Co. - Raymond</b>		Patchy fog before 8am. Otherwise, mostly cloudy, with a high near 53. West wind 3 to 7 mph. <u>Tonight:</u> A slight chance of drizzle. Patchy fog after 9pm. Snow level 3500 feet lowering to 2000 feet after midnight . Otherwise, mostly cloudy, with a low around 35. West southwest wind 5 to 7 mph becoming calm.

Plans personnel attended the Grays Harbor County Tactics Meeting in preparation for their upcoming mass vaccination clinics this weekend. Operations continued their efforts to support LHJ's with expanding their current capacity and flow rates by exploring additional and/or improved POD sites. Received an order from Pacific County to provide vaccinators for clinic and to work on addressing homebound population.
