Coordinate with LHJs for the timely, coordinated release of accurate public information. 7. Maintain and enhance interagency and interdisciplinary relationships by developing and maintaining an environment in which all participants are treated with dignity and respect.

Grays Harbor Co. - Aberdeen	A 40 percent chance of showers. Partly sunny, with a high near 47. West northwest wind 14 to 18 mph, with gusts as high as 23 mph. <u>Tonight:</u> Mostly clear, with a low around 34. West northwest wind 9 to 14 mph becoming light northwest after midnight. Winds could gust as high as 23 mph.					
Lewis Co. - Centralia	A 50 percent chance of showers. Cloudy, then gradually becoming mostly sunny, with a high near 50. West northwest wind 8 to 14 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. <u>Tonight:</u> Widespread frost after 2am. Otherwise, mostly clear, with a low around 27. West wind 6 to 11 mph becoming light and variable after midnight.					
Pacific Co. - Raymond	Showers likely, mainly before 8am. Snow level 1100 feet. Partly sunny, with a high near 50. West northwest wind 6 to 10 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. Chance of precipitation is 60%. New precipitation amounts of less than a tenth of an inch possible. <u>Tonight:</u> Widespread frost after midnight. Otherwise, mostly clear, with a low around 30. Northwest wind 5 to 10 mph becoming light west northwest in the evening.					
Thurston Co. - Olympia	A 40 percent chance of showers. Partly sunny, with a high near 50. West wind 9 to 15 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. <u>Tonight:</u> Widespread frost after 2am. Otherwise, partly cloudy, with a low around 29. West wind 9 to 14 mph becoming light and variable after midnight.
