Day Operations: 0600 – 2000 September 24, 2021

Strategic Framework:

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Rough Patch Complex and Jack Fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, Highway 138, private property, commercial timber, mining claims, natural and cultural resources, general habitat and aquatic values.

Management Objectives:

- Implement risk management practices that provide for the safety of firefighters, other responders, and the public as the priority while understanding the selected strategies and tactics, including a clearly defined and obtainable end state and that offers highest probability of success.
- Ensure suppression operations including repair efforts are coordinated between state, federal resources and NW Team 7 to minimize impacts to private timber land and mining claims by using stakeholder and landowner inputs and advice from Resource Advisors.
- Maintain positive relationship between NW Team 7, the Umpqua and Willamette NF, Oregon Department of Forestry, vested stakeholders and public by fostering trust and ensuring information is provided in timely manner.
- Provide for infectious disease control through thoughtful mitigations when appropriate for the safety of the firefighters and the public we serve.
- Provide Initial Attack response and assist as requested by the Umpqua National Forest and the Oregon Department of Forestry.

Control Objectives:

- Keep Chaos Fire south of private mine claims, commercial timber lands and private property
- Ensure Chaos and Little Bend fires do not progress east into general forest lands and private lands expanding fire footprint
- Keep Jack Fire from further impacting Hwy 138 and associated infrastructure along corridor
Keep Jack and Near Minky from subsequent spread and impacts to Smith Fire and the Devils Knob complex

DISCUSSION: Today will be the warmest day of the week, with lower elevations pushing into the low 90s. Breezy easterly winds will weaken by the afternoon and become more northwesterly. Very poor overnight RH recoveries are expected by this morning. This dry air mass will linger over the area and result in daytime minimum RH values in the teens across ridgetops this afternoon. The dry and warm air, coupled with breezy winds at ridgetops will result in elevated fire weather conditions today – the warmest and driest days since the rain even last weekend. Modest overnight RH recoveries are expected overnight Friday. Dry and warm Saturday into Sunday before the pattern changes for next week. Expecting a cooler and more active pattern across the Pacific NW into next week with an increased chance of precipitation across the complex.

FRIDAY: ELEVATED FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly sunny, warmer, and very dry.

WIND (20 FT):

Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley through 1000 then upslope/up valley 4-8 mph.

Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: SE 5-9 mph with gusts 10-15 mph, becoming WNW after 1300 and lighter, 4-8 mph with gusts decreasing to 10-12 mph.

MAX TEMPERATURE: Lower slopes (< 3500 ft): 85-93F; Upper slopes/ridges (> 3500 ft): 76-82F.

MIN RH: Lower slopes: 18-30%; Upper slopes/ridges: 12-25%.

HAINES: 4 **INVERSION:** Low-level inversion mixes out by late morning. Mixing height: 5,000 ft.

FRIDAY NIGHT:

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly clear and dry.

WIND (20 FT):

Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-5 mph.

Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: WSW 4-8 mph, gusts 10-12 mph.

MIN TEMPERATURE: Lower slopes: 49-58F; Upper slopes/ridges: 45-55F.

MAX RH: Lower slopes: 60-75%; Upper slopes/ridges: 50-60%

INVERSION: Strong inversion near mid-slope.

SATURDAY:

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly sunny, warm, dry, and breezy.

WIND (20 FT):

Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley through 1000 then upslope/up valley 4-9 mph, gusts to 10 mph.

Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: WNW 5-10 mph with gusts 10-20 mph.

MAX TEMPERATURE: Lower slopes: 77-83F; Upper slopes/ridges: 71-78F.

MIN RH: Lower slopes: 30-40%; Upper slopes/ridges: 20-35%.

HAINES: 4 **INVERSION:** Low-level inversion mixes out by late morning. Mixing height: 5,000 ft.

Extended outlook: Sunday: Partly cloudy. Highs in upper 60s to upper 70s. Min RH: 25-40%. WSW winds 5-20 mph.

Monday: Increasing clouds, chance of rain. Highs in the upper 50s and 60s. Min RH: 60-80%. W winds 10-25 mph.

Tuesday: Mostly cloudy, chance of rain. Highs in the 50s. Min RH: 70-85%. W winds 10-25 mph.

FUELS:
 Two primary timber stands in the fire area are Douglas-fir with cedar, madrone, white fir and big leaf maple that are open with low brush mixed throughout the understory (TU5). The second is Douglas-fir with moderate to heavy brush in the understory (TL5). Both timber stands have light to moderate dead and downed material. Litter and 10hr fuels are drying out, especially on exposed ridges.


Forecast ERC-G 42 (59th %-ile) fuels reaching local threshold for potential fire spread

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:
 Expect mostly continued smoldering and consumption of heavy fuels. Local fire danger outputs (and some “crunchiness” of surface litter) provide signs of potential for creeping surface fire spread in unlined areas, especially on ridges with a bit of sunshine and a breeze. Poor overnight humidity recoveries will mean peak burning conditions may arrive earlier in the shift.

- Timber Litter – TL5 (High Load Conifer Litter)
 - Rate of Spread – smoldering and creeping, flame lengths less than 1 foot.
- Timber Understory – TU5 (Very High Load, Dry Climate Timber-Shrub)
 - Rate of Spread – smoldering and creeping, flame lengths less than 1 foot.

***Fine Dead Fuel Moistures and Probability of Ignition are based on peak forecast fire weather conditions and do not take into account recent precipitation. Fire behavior forecast is based on observed fuel conditions.**

FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:
 Unlined Divs: Smoldering and creeping edge. Watch for increased amounts of smoke as a sign of fuels beginning to dry.
 Lined Divs: Continued consumption of heavies and stumpholes mostly interior. Beware of snags if going deeper.

AIR OPERATIONS:
 Visibility should be good after morning smoke lifts out of valleys. Very little smoke production and a few high level clouds.

SAFETY

Next couple days will bring conditions favorable for potential fire spread. We have numerous sources of heat spread across a large geographic area. Monitor and observe fire behavior and weather conditions. Good time to review Standard Firefighting Order(s): #1 Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts. #2 Know what your fire is doing at all times. #3 Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.



Take hourly weather observations, including Fine Dead Fuel Moisture and Probability of Ignition calculations, communicate to resources on your division.

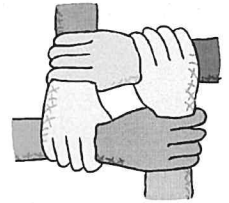



