There is no higher value than that of the responder/firefighter and our public. 2) Keep fire north of Bridge Creek Road to minimize impacts to structures and recreational facilities at Twin Lakes 3) Keep fire east of BIA Road 73 to reduce loss of commercial timber and cultural values. 4) Keep fire south of Hall Creek Rd. and 17 Mile Rd. to reduce fire footprint and duration. 5) Keep fire west of Carson and Bitterroot Mountains to lessen impact on commercial timber, private property and primary residences in Seyler Valley. 6) Keep Chuweah Creek fire in current footprint, minimize additional impacts to expressed values of concern by continuing with mop up, patrol and back haul.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Warm and dry conditions will occur Tuesday and Wednesday, prompting a Heat Advisory from 1100 today through Wednesday night with temperatures in the mid to upper 80s to low 90s with overnight temperatures in the upper 60s to low 70s. Increasing winds will likely develop between 1400 Tuesday and 0200 Wednesday due to a passing weak weather disturbance, with erratic gusty winds possible due to cumulus buildups. A short period of moderate northeast winds are possible Tuesday evening as the weather system passes. A Haines of 5 is possible Wednesday with clouds starting to increase late.

Assumptions: ... *Warming and drying will resume today, relative humidity recovery will be fair-to-poor tonight. We will continue to have all the ingredients for very active fire behavior. Fire environment conditions will combine to produce a peak burning period between 1400-1800. We can expect a full range of fire behavior characteristics today. Persistent burning conditions may be expected due drought conditions and very dry fuels. Expect high resistance to control efforts under current conditions.*

Fire Behavior Summary

Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of *Grass and shrubs, Timber Litter, and Timber with Understory*. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Ponderosa Pine, Douglas Fir, with scattered True Fir and cedar. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species include Ocean Spray, shrub form Maple, and dog-hair conifer thickets. Snags and heavy fuel loading are common throughout all areas. *Live fuels are drought stressed and may contribute to high intensity and rates of spread; most grasses are fully cured. Fuel type changes occur by management activity, elevation, and aspect. Ladder fuels AND MOSS are present in most of the timbered areas.*

Today's potential fire behavior may include areas of very active surface fire spread including high intensity flare ups with group torching, and rapid rates of spread. Where it is occurring, high intensity fire behavior may result in profuse spotting and/ or crown fire activity that may lead to "leap-frog" type of fire spread. Expect very high rates of spread in fine fuels with wind. Sustained backing fire with active lateral spread will increase in the afternoon. Backing fire may provide slope reversals resulting in aggressive upslope fire activity with torching and spotting.

Specific Assignments:

Div. B/F – Watch for undetected spot fires. Fire will actively burn dead surface fuels. Apply appropriate heat management if burning.

Div. U – Complex terrain and irregular fire edge may produce flare-ups with torching and spotting.

Div.X/V/B – Monitor for interior flare-ups that may cause spot fires across lines.

Structure Group – Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times.

Contingency- Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times

Chuweah Creek—monitor for flare-ups that may spot across firelines.

Nightshift- Poor overnight humidity recovery will keep fire active in dead surface fuels.

Air Operations: Visibility will be impacted from regional smoke with west winds. Local inversion will lift around 11 am.

Anticipate current conditions to continue for the next several days.....anticipate fire behavior before you observe it, anticipate your actions before need to act. **Remember :** *fine fuels + wind = rapid rate of spread ; shrub/timber litter + wind = high intensity fire with torching and spotting*

The Issues: HEAT ADVISORY, SMOKE, CUMULATIVE FATIGUE

- Fatigue management is pertinent to both your self-care and ability to perform your mission. Your skill and capability are required to help accomplish the objectives of this fire and will be needed the rest of this busy fire season.
- Indicators of fatigue are highly personalized to the individual. No two person’s symptoms or recovery needs are the same.
- Often the indicators of fatigue are not recognized until an accident or injury has occurred.

Know the Signs in Others:

- Decreased motivation and low morale.
- Increased irritability and depression.
- Confusion, poor problem-solving.
- Poor abstract thinking.
- Poor attention/decisions.
- Poor concentration/memory.
- Extreme emotional responses not in concurrence with actual situation.
- Withdrawal from social interactions

Know Yourself:

- Recognize that you are not immune to fatigue. Become self aware of fatigue signs.
- Conduct an ongoing self-assessment, much like situational awareness of the fire environment. Being able to catch yourself in the early stages of fatigue onset may allow you to manage or resolve the fatigue issue.

Recommendations for Team

Leaders:

- Know your people and their thresholds
- Ensure that workers are adequately rested before they begin work shifts.
- Provide periodic rest breaks to allow physical and mental recovery.
- Alternate between heavy and light tasks.
- Be a servant leader

Recommendations for Team

Members:

- Eat a well balanced diet
- Maintain hydration.
- Maintain good personal hygiene.
- Maintain high standards of physical fitness and work capacity.
- Do not be afraid to ask for help.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority	<input type="checkbox"/> RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE <i>Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.</i> <input type="checkbox"/> YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness.
