Spot Forecast for Green Ridge Wildfire...CORRECTED

421 PM PDT Tue Sep 7 2021

Forecast is based on forecast start time of 0600 PDT on September 08.

DISCUSSION: An upper high pressure system will persist over the region and burn area through Wednesday morning. A weak weather disturbance will then push into the region and go mostly to the northwest of the fire. The main effects from this will be some mid and high clouds and a slight increase in winds. Temperatures will be warm, but RH's will be moderate. A stronger system will move into the region on Thursday into Friday bringing more clouds and temperatures a little cooler. There may also be a chance of showers and thunderstorms Thursday night and Friday. Cooler air with dry conditions will then persist during the weekend.

Isolated to Scattered Thunderstorms and Breezy Winds through Friday Night

Issued: Tuesday, September 7, 2021

KEY POINTS

- The atmosphere is currently dry and stable, but high pressure will weaken over the next several days and give way to more unstable conditions.
- Isolated thunderstorms early Wednesday morning along the Washington Cascades
 - Although storms will mainly be north of the forecast area and will be isolated, there is a potential for outflow winds of 20-25 mph with nearby storms.
- Isolated showers and thunderstorms over portions of eastern Oregon and far southeast Washington Thursday night. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms for the same area Friday.
 - Showers and thunderstorms may bring moderate to heavy rain, mainly on Friday. At this time, models are advertising 0.25 to 0.5 inch are possible with some storms.
- Occasionally breezy winds can be expected this week with gusts 20 mph...locally 30 mph. On Wednesday, the Lower Columbia Basin and surrounding valleys will have breezy winds. On Thursday, central and southeast Oregon will have gusty winds. Afternoon RHs will be in the 20s--not critically low but enough to pose concerns for rapid fire spread for new and existing fires.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

Models are coming in stronger with a Pacific frontal system Thursday night and Friday. The potential for showers and thunderstorms have expanded in coverage with increasing confidence that the eastern mountains and valley will have thunderstorms, mainly Friday, with a good chance of moderate to heavy rain with some storms on Friday.

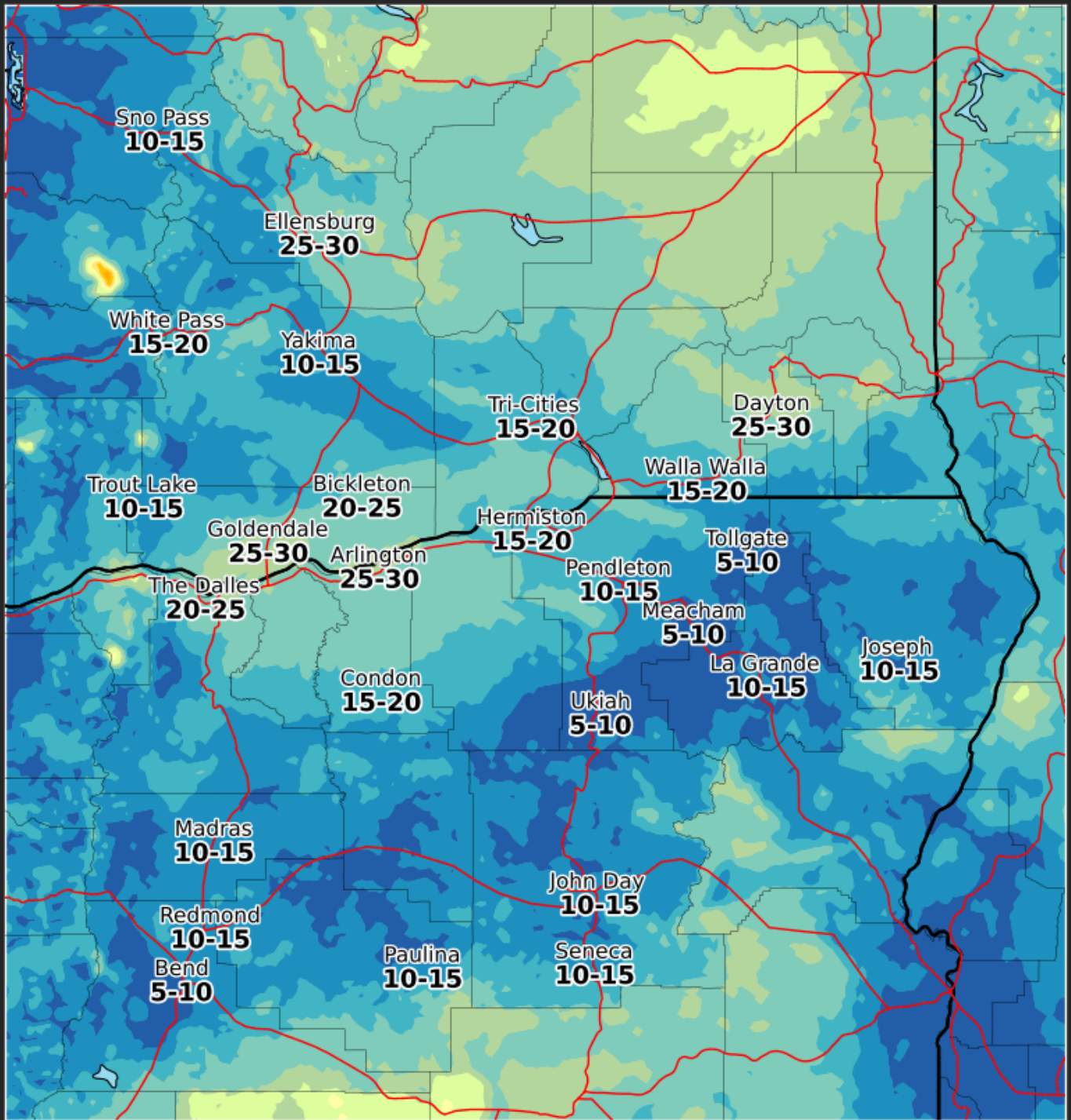

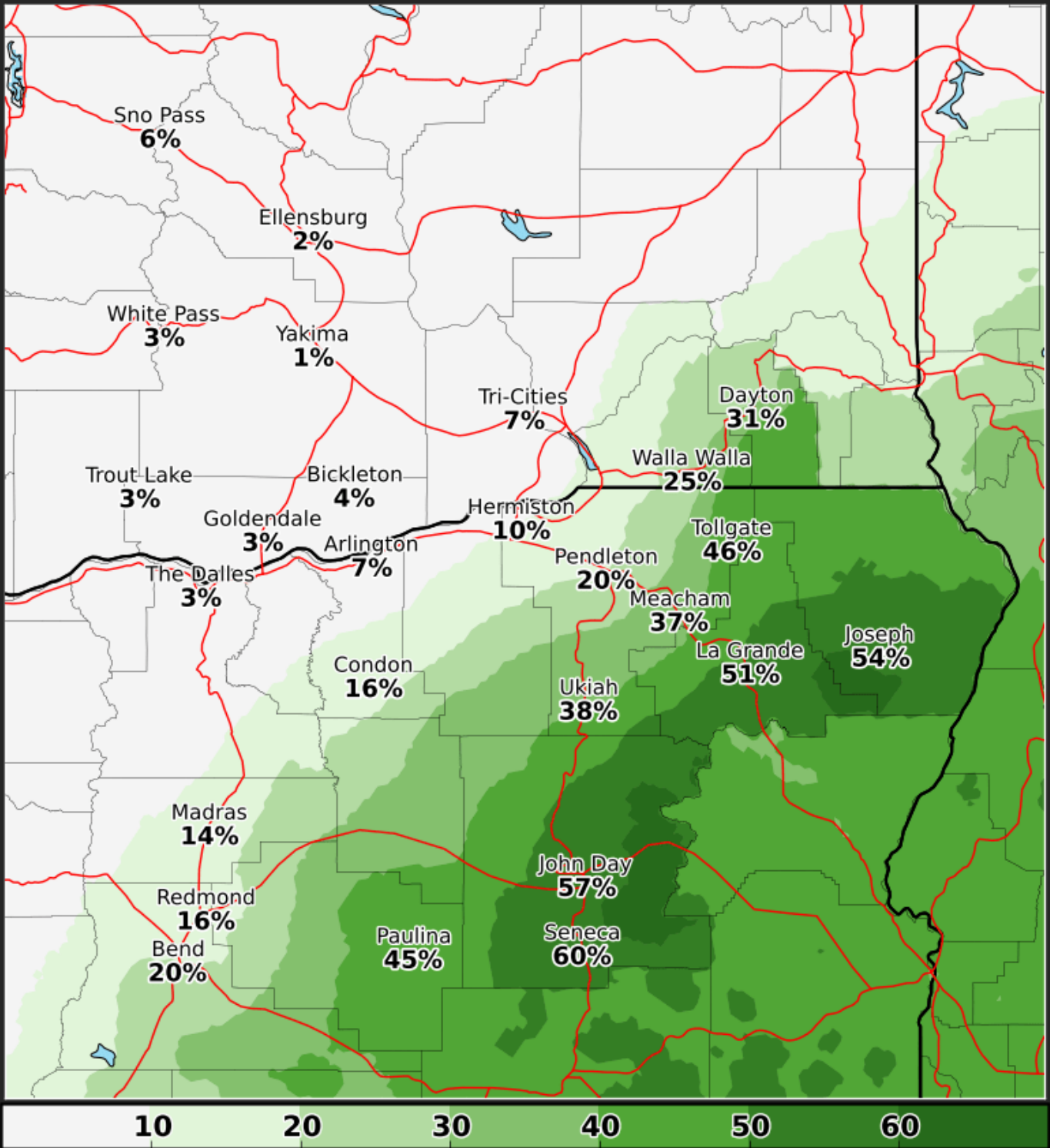

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
