... High Pressure Builds in with Warming and Drying...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will continue to build into the area today with no change to the dry pattern expected. Afternoon min relative humidity will decrease and begin to dry out as temperatures increase each day heading into the weekend. Winds will switch to a north-northwest predominant direction as the high nudges into northwestern WA. Winds will then begin to decrease through Friday afternoon. Temperatures will then return to above normal heading into the weekend. Increased warming and winds returning on Saturday as the high shifts east, will result in elevated fire weather conditions for afternoon min RH on Friday and into Saturday. By the beginning of next week, the pattern points to the high becoming a more blocking feature over SE Washington keeping temperatures up and min RH in the afternoon just above elevated fire weather conditions. This will slow an approaching cold front on Monday and Tuesday causing it to stall over central WA, keeping cooler air at bay and a reprieve to afternoon relative humidity.

WEATHER SUMMARY - See attached Fire Weather Forecast; Temps rising, RH dropping, still breezy.

Fuel: Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of Timber w/Understory (Mixed Conifers with litter and shrubs), Timber with Litter (Conifers with dead/down/litter), and Grass with Shrubs (perennial grasses w/brush). Fuels are generally discontinuous - broken up by rock outcrops, areas of grass and changes in aspect. ERC values are starting to rise (slowly) as fuels dry out, moving towards **90**th **percentile weather**.

1000 hr. fuels = 7%-8%, Eastern Washington & the Idaho panhandle are in Extreme to Exceptional Drought. The drying trend will continue to reduce the effects of recent precipitation, along with lower RH recovery.

Topography: Area topography for both fires includes steep slopes with multiple deep drainages. Elevations range from 3,300 to over 6,200 feet. Be aware of situations where topography, wind, and fuels align.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General: Burn period not as long as we move into September, as days become shorter. The fire environment will stay moderated – the higher elevations with open fire perimeter are still relatively cool; drying trend in weather will allow fuels to more readily combust. Sheltered fuels can still be dry enough to burn with limited torching. **Spotting distances can be up to 1000 feet, but generally less than 500 feet**, unless spotting occurs from ridgelines. Fine dead fuel moistures continue to be low, with temps rising over the next few days, RH will be down slightly, **raising POI about 10%**; light winds will keep ROS/FL limited.

Green Ridge Fire - All Divisions: The southern flank has large areas of open line that have been mostly checked up on Misery Ridge, roads, riparian areas, discontinuous fuels, and the burn scars from 2015. Likely to see increased smoke production and areas of moderate fire activity along the open southern flank, where fuels are available, and wind/slope align. Interior smokes will continue to consume fuel and involve islands or pockets of available fuel. Torching and spotting likely when wind/slope/fuels align.

Probability of Ignition for most areas is **55%-65%** (higher temps/lower FDFM); ROS / FL table is **worse case**; lower slope percent, less wind, discontinuous fuels, will reduce these values significantly.

Lick Creek Fire - All Divisions: No change. Be alert for threats to the control line; spots from interior islands or areas of heat along control lines, with wind/slope alignment. Most smoke is interior of control lines.

IA within the TFR: Live & 1000 hour fuels will still support combustion. Fine fuels will dry when exposed to sunny & breezy conditions, becoming available to burn; rapid ROS when wind/slope/fuels are aligned.

AIR OPERATIONS

Limited to no impacts on aviation operations with good ventilation over the fire at this time; slight inversion until about 1000.

SAFETY – Ensure escape routes are clear, viable, and safe to use, prior to engaging in suppression activities. **Base all actions on current and expected fire behaviors**.

Most of the safety programs we are familiar with focus on, and propose "safe" practices or acts, here's one:


COMPLACENCY: we are well into the critical time to be on guard for complacency to set in. Fire and line activity has settled into a routine for the most part, and it is easy to get into a comfortable routine. It is important to remain alert to changing weather conditions, fire behavior, and be aware of your work environment. Think about what you are doing and what the consequences of your actions are-because they may affect somebody else! Remember that we are somewhat fluid on this incident with regard to people and what they are doing. There is still lots of work to get accomplished and lots of hazards to be on the lookout for. Remain focused on the task at hand, the basics involved to accomplish it and alert at all times for changing conditions, whether driving, hiking, on the grid for spots, mopping up, pulling hose, loading freight, typing or whatever.

HYGENE AND YOU: If you're unaware of the protection measure of washing your hands, it's time to climb out from under the rock and embrace the greater world. Certainly COVID has highlighted hygiene, specifically handwashing. Another benefit to handwashing is abating the spread of <u>CAMP CRUD</u>. The Crud is on the rise, protect yourself!

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR CIVILIAN TRAFFIC AND PEOPLE: Safety encountered a hunter on a camouflaged E Bike yesterday. He thought people were not working the fire anymore.

Finally, we have discussed the idea of a safety culture. Basically the mental shift from thinking of safety as a "Thing", or a process to thinking of safety as a cultural value we hold as professional fire fighters. In holding that value, each one of us accepts that we are responsible for our own safety, those we supervise and to not harm others, in short:
