DISCUSSION...A weak upper ridge will provide light winds, but slightly cooler temperatures on Thursday. Despite this, RH's will be lower than today. After that, the flow aloft will become westerly and then southwest Thursday night and Friday ahead of an incoming Pacific Weather System. During the day Friday, it will be warmer, with only a little increase in winds. RH's will also be lower on Friday as well. Rain showers will spread into the burn area by Friday night and continue through the weekend, with possibly significant amounts of rain through the weekend, along with significantly cooler temperatures and high RH's, and breezy winds.

11. UNBURNED FUEL BETWEEN YOU AND THE FIRE

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior On Tragedy Fires

- *Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on Isolated portions of larger fires.
- *Most fires are innocent in appearance before the “flare-ups” or “blow-ups”. In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
- *Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- *Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, chutes and on steep slopes.
- *Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (**Verify correct frequency prior to starting report**)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: *Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.*

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority	<input type="checkbox"/> RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE <i>Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.</i> <input type="checkbox"/> YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be DELAYED if necessary. <i>Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2° – 3° burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.</i> <input type="checkbox"/> GREEN / PRIORITY 3 Minor Injury or illness. Non-Emergency transport <i>Ex: Sprains, strains, minor heat-related illness.</i>
