- Steep slopes and rolling material
- Stump holes and blowing ash
- Snags
- Keep your head up and maintain your working distant
- Don't get in a hurry

## *"WATCH OUT" FOR COMPLACENCY* "LISTEN FOR THE ALARM"

- Fire activity is slowing considerably. Ward off boredom and complacency
- Take care of personal health needs.
- Clearly understand assignment and be accountable for meeting determined objectives.
- Review the 10 standard fire orders and 18 "watch out" situations.
- Communicate identified hazards to others.
- Enjoy your work but avoid horseplay.
- Display an appropriate sense of humor.
- It's a good time to do some "house-keeping with vehicles, secure all loose items in cab or bed of vehicles. Provide for safe transport of hand tools. Clean windshields daily. Use headlights and observe speed limits
