Forecast is based on forecast start time of 0600 PDT on September 07.

High pressure aloft will continue to build into the Pacific Northwest during the next couple of days. This will bring above normal temperatures with continued dry conditions. Winds will be mostly light, except for some locally breezy conditions in the afternoons/evenings, especially on Wednesday. There will be a weak disturbance Wednesday night into Thursday, but any weather with it will stay to the south of the fire. Other than that, expect upper ridging to persist with dry conditions through the end of the week. Saturday and Sunday will be dry with near normal temperatures...and mostly terrain driven winds.

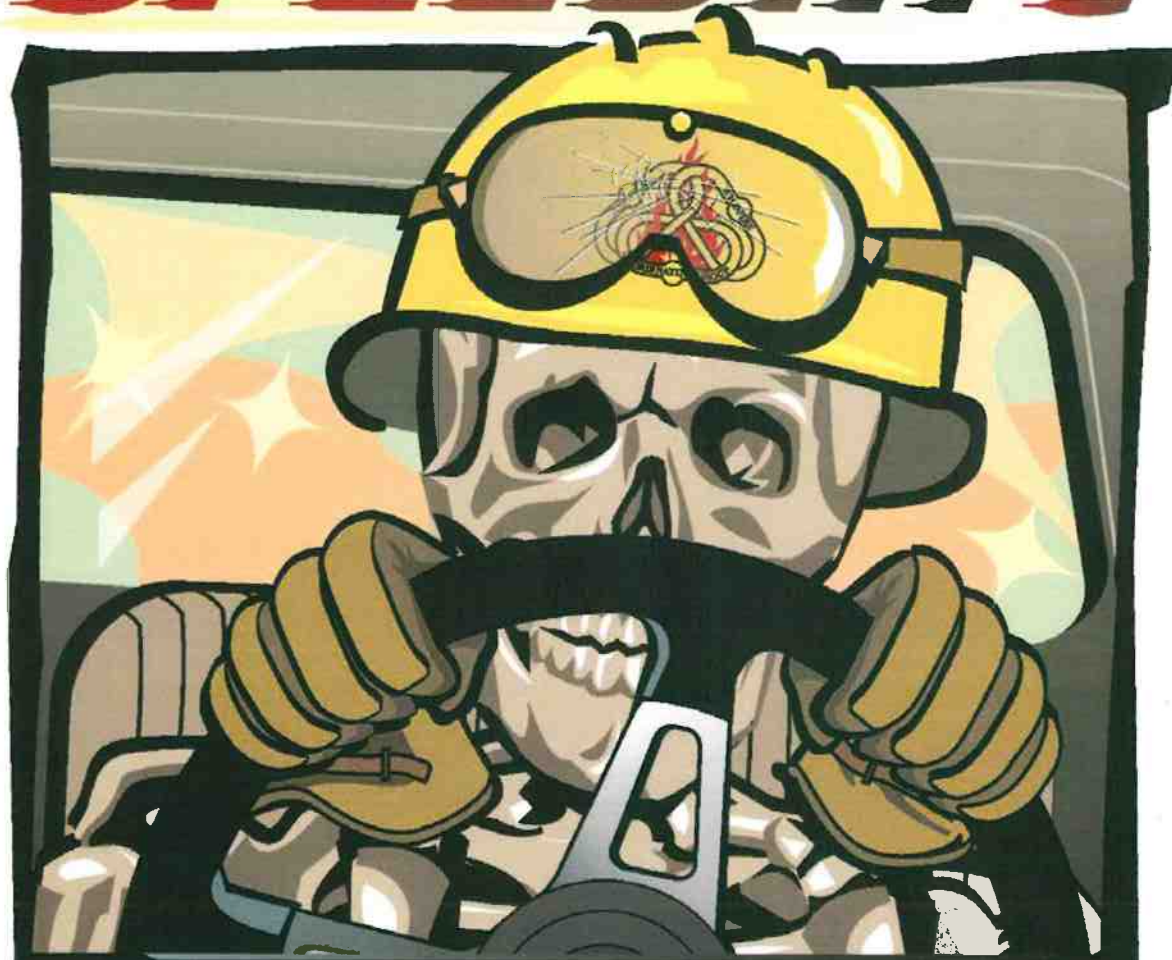
