**...Hot with Low Humidity through Friday and a Slight Chance of Afternoon Thunderstorms...
...Gusty and Erratic Winds always possible with Thunderstorms...**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A warming trend continues through Friday, and it will be considerably warmer today with low humidity. The air mass remains unstable with cumulus buildups in the afternoon. There is a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms during the last few hours of the operational period and this tonight. RH recoveries tonight will be poor, and several fire weather concerns are anticipated on Friday (hot, dry, unstable, and a northeast wind).

TODAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. A slight chance of afternoon showers or thunderstorms, mainly after 1500 PDT.
MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: 79-82° above 5000 feet. 88-93° valley bottoms along Turkey-Panjab creeks.
MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 25-30% above 5000 feet. 18-23% valley bottoms.
20-FOOT RIDGETOP WINDS: Southwest 2 to 5 mph in the morning, becoming Northwest 4 to 9 mph with gusts to 12 mph.
GREEN RIDGE CREEKS: Upslope/up-creek: 3 to 8 mph.
CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ($\geq 0.10''$): 10%
LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1...possibly 2.
HAINES INDEX: 4 (Low)
INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Unstable after mid-morning inversion breaks.

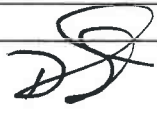

FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems, from higher elevation Sub Alpine Fir and Engelmann Spruce, to Doug-Fir, Grand Fir and Lodgepole Pine under 5000', and Ponderosa Pine in the lower elevations of the Forest. Outside of the 2006 Columbia Complex and the 2015 Grizzly Complex, all forested areas have extensive dead and down and ladder fuels that will work together to elevate fire into the crowns and generate short range spotting.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components currently setting daily record highs, and approaching all time high levels. You may see some resistance to spread in brush and re-prod areas, but these veg structures are losing moisture daily. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day.

GENERAL/Potential:

DAY: Unstable air in the afternoon once the inversion clears could bring to life areas still holding intense heat. Expect isolated areas of active fire behavior with low spread in the timber litter, potential for isolated torching in the interior unburned islands and adjacent to control lines. Spotting up to .10 mile is possible primarily in the mature spruce/fir timber type. Expect surface fire with creeping, smoldering and backing/flanking. Look for Green Ridge to become more active mid-afternoon. With current ERC values and drought conditions even light wind speeds will contribute to very active fire behavior.

SPECIFIC:

Green Ridge: Potential rollout, flanking, and active backing down into the Tucannon River drainage in the Division M 'spot'. Some slope driven runs to the east and west of the most active spots are again possible with any afternoon clearing or support from winds. Fire continues its slow but steady march south towards West Butte Ridge with fuel driven ground fire and occasional isolated single tree and group torching. Active burning will also occur in the large unnamed drainage south of H-37, with more rollout, backing, and potential for slope driven runs with favorable topographic support. Look for spotting to occur downwind of these runs in all areas.

Lick Creek: Continued interior burning will occur within the fire area, especially along the southern and western flanks. Be especially heads up of any group torching with winds pushing embers across containment lines, as there are multiple large drainages lacking recent fire history to the south and west that would be very receptive to spotting.

SAFETY:

Yesterday we saw what the fire can do with upper atmospheric support for growth, even for an hour or two late morning or near the end of shift. Know what your fire is doing at all times.

Hygiene

- **PPE “Nomex”.** When using your PPE insure you are wearing it in the right places. Observe your Nomex is it due for changing out or needs cleaning? Is it going to provide you the protection you need?

- Weather continues to be hot and dry.
- Decreasing humidity's means increased fire behaviors.

Fire Behavior:

- Base actions on expected weather and fire behavior.
- In areas where firing has been completed watch for changes in overhead hazards as smoldering may have weakened the base of snags and other objects.
- Extreme Fire Behavior is possible at any time during the day, be heads up.
- Alignment of topography and wind during the burning period should always be considered a trigger point to re-evaluate strategy and tactics

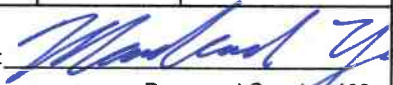

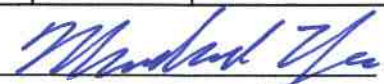

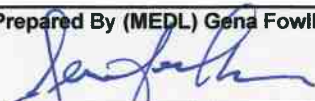

SUBJECT: MPHAT Wildland Fire COVID-19 Prevention and Mitigation 2021

The purpose of this memorandum is to request wide distribution of the attached *Wildland Fire COVID-19 Prevention and Mitigation 2021* guidance issued from the Medical and Public Advisory Team (MPHAT) July 17, 2021.

The following has been excerpted as recommendations for fire leadership.

- Fire managers, agency administrators, line officers and incident managers need to re-enforce the importance of prevention and mitigation of COVID-19 in the workplace.
 - MPHAT would like to remind all leadership and fire personnel that following MPHAT's guidance has been proven effective and is critical to prevent the further spread of COVID-19.
 - Leader's intent and expectations must be clear that COVID-19 prevention and mitigation is still a priority for the 2021 fire season.
 - With vaccination status not being systematically tracked, face covering/mask and physical distancing requirements on wildfire incidents needs strengthened – everyone follow COVID-19 prevention and mitigation guidance for un-vaccinated individuals regarding physical distancing and mask/face covering use in fire camp unless alone in an enclosed space or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.
- Fire managers, agency administrators, line officers and incident managers need to prioritize and incorporate COVID-19 strategies that were effective and considered standard operating procedures in 2020 such as:
 - daily individual screening tool, distributive operations, spike camps, boxed meals, community cooler mitigations, remote briefings, decentralized staging areas, virtual and remote participation, and module as one (updated) to the maximum extent possible.
