**3. Objective(s):**

- Strategic Objectives:**
- Provide for the safety of fire fighters and the public through utilization of strategic and deliberate risk assessment processes. Ensure incident within an incident protocols are established.
  - Develop and implement operational objectives based on identified values at risk and highest probability of success limiting fire spread.
  - Follow established guidelines and mitigations regarding COVID and other infectious diseases.
  - Enhance relationships through timely communication and active involvement with the public, stakeholders, and cooperators.
  - Coordinate with the READ's to ensure natural and historical values are protected to the degree necessary.
  - Maintain fiscal responsibility keeping cost commensurate with the values at risk.
  - Provide initial attack response to new fire starts within the TFR boundary. Assist with initial attack efforts outside the boundary as requested.

**Lick Creek Operational Objective:**

- Keep fire within its currently identified perimeter.

**Green Ridge Operational Objective:**

- Keep fire north of the 2015 Butte Creek Burn scar along the West Butte Creek Trail to the East Butte Creek Trail to Yearling Ridge Trail to Crooked Creek Trail to Monument Ridge and along the First Creek Trail to NF 40 at Misery. Protect Little Turkey Tail Recreation residences and the Godman Guard Station Trail.
- Keep fire east of FS road 64 to protect private property, structures, and recreation sites.
- Keep fire south of the Panjab Trailhead to Panjab Campground along the Salter Trail to the 4022 Road towards Clear Water.
- Keep fire west of NF 40 Road. Minimize suppression impacts in the Wenaha-Tucannon Wilderness using natural containment features as practical.

**COVID Mitigations:**

- All persons must wear a mask indoors at all times regardless of vaccination status, as well as outdoors when physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- Maintain a module as one, wash your hands and sanitize surfaces.



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### ...Hot, Dry and Unstable Today...

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Today will be a critical day for fire weather, as it will be hot with low humidity and unstable conditions. In addition, winds coming from the east-northeast gusting as high as 18 mph along the ridges may align with north-south drainages such as Meadow Creek, Turkey Creek, and Panjab Creeks. The east-northeast winds will continue tonight with poor humidity recoveries along the ridges. There is a slight chance of an overnight shower or thunderstorm tonight. A better potential for showers and thunderstorms is expected this weekend.

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### **TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Increasing clouds. A few buildups in the afternoon.  
**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE:** 85-90° above 5000 feet. 96-101° valley bottoms along Turkey-Panjab creeks.  
**MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** 12-18% all elevations.  
**20-FOOT RIDGETOP WINDS:** East to Northeast 4-8 mph increasing to 5-10 mph gusting to 15 mph.  
**GREEN RIDGE CREEKS:** Northeast winds 5-10 mph in the afternoon.  
**CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ( $\geq 0.10''$ ):** 0%  
**LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL:** 1.  
**HAINES INDEX:** 5 (Moderate)  
**INVERSIONS/STABILITY:** Unstable after shallow low level inversion breaks around 0900.

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### **TONIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy in the evening. Partly cloudy overnight. A slight chance of an overnight shower or thunderstorm.  
**MINIMUM TEMPERATURE:** 67-72 all elevations.  
**MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** 25-30% ridgetops. 60-65% creek bottoms.  
**20-FOOT RIDGETOP WINDS:** East to Northeast 5-10 mph with evening gusts to 15-18 mph.  
**GREEN RIDGE CREEKS:** Northeast winds 5-10 mph...becoming drainage 0-3 overnight.  
**CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ( $\geq 0.10''$ ):** 10%  
**LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL:** 1...possibly 2.  
**HAINES INDEX:** 4 (Low)  
**INVERSIONS/STABILITY:** Shallow low level inversion and weak mid level inversion overnight.

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### **SATURDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy. A slight chance of afternoon showers or thunderstorms after 1600.  
**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE:** 80-85° above 5000 feet. 92-97° valley bottoms along Turkey-Panjab creeks.  
**MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** 22-27% above 5000 feet. 18-22% valley bottoms.  
**20-FOOT RIDGETOP WINDS:** East 4-8 mph becoming Southwest 5-10 mph gusting to 12-15 mph.  
**GREEN RIDGE CREEKS:** Upslope/Upcanyon 3-8 mph.  
**CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ( $\geq 0.10''$ ):** 10%  
**LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL:** 2.

### FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems, from higher elevation Sub Alpine Fir and Engelmann Spruce, to Doug-Fir, Grand Fir and Lodgepole Pine under 5000', and Ponderosa Pine in the lower elevations of the Forest. Outside of the 2006 Columbia Complex and the 2015 Grizzly Complex, all forested areas have extensive dead and down and ladder fuels that will work together to elevate fire into the crowns and generate short range spotting.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components currently setting daily record highs, and approaching all time high levels. You may see some resistance to spread in brush and re-prod areas, but these veg structures are losing moisture daily. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day.

### GENERAL/Potential:

**DAY:** Early clearing, high temperatures, relative humidity in the low teens, and gusty winds from the NNE will set us up for an active fire day today. Heavy fuels are holding heat for an extended amount of time, keeping quiet areas of the fire in play. Today we will see fires elevate from ground into crown, starting with single tree torching, then group torching and potential for crown runs where slope or wind assist spread. These fuels burn in a torching/spotting, torching/spotting manner, trees are drought stressed and heavies are record dry.

### SPECIFIC

**Green Ridge:** Thursday brought fire life and growth to several areas that will cause challenges for suppression resources today. Winds with a northerly component will be influenced by several drainages in Divisions Gulf, Alpha, and Sierra; these drainages will be aligned with wind and slope which will increase spread rates and intensities. Spotting distances could reach 0.4 miles downwind of torching trees.

**Lick Creek:** Continued interior burning will occur within the fire area, especially along the southern and western flanks. Be especially heads up of any group torching with winds pushing embers across containment lines, as there are multiple large drainages lacking recent fire history to the south and west that would be very receptive to spotting.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise: 0530, Civil Twilight ends: 2059

### SAFETY:

Change in wind speed and direction will influence fire spread in new directions, threatening large portions of Divisions G, A, and P/S. Fire activity will likely increase earlier in the shift and continue well into the evening hours.

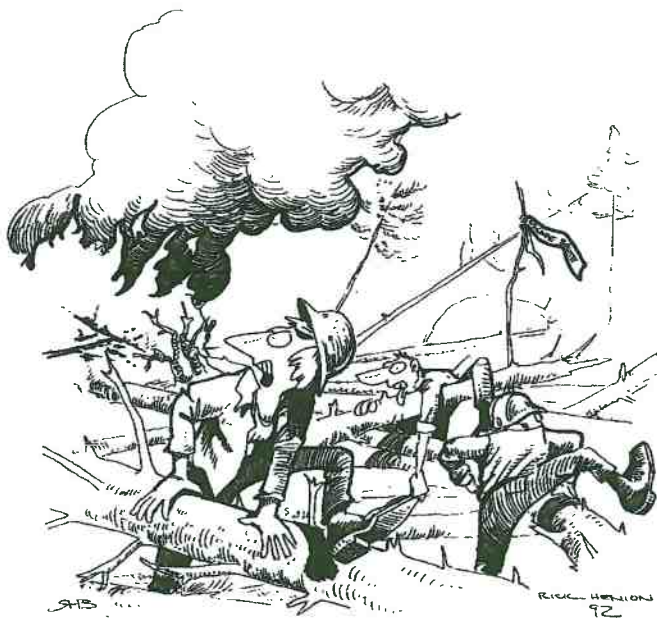

- Take care of your feet and they will take care of you. Treat hot spots on your feet before they become blisters. Utilize line EMTs and Med Unit in preventive and post injury/illness needs.

- \*Scouted for size and hazards
- \*Close enough considering escape time needed



SUBJECT: MPHAT Wildland Fire COVID-19 Prevention and Mitigation 2021

The purpose of this memorandum is to request wide distribution of the attached *Wildland Fire COVID-19 Prevention and Mitigation 2021* guidance issued from the Medical and Public Advisory Team (MPHAT) July 17, 2021.

The following has been excerpted as **recommendations** for fire leadership.

- Fire managers, agency administrators, line officers and incident managers need to re-enforce the importance of prevention and mitigation of COVID-19 in the workplace.
  - MPHAT would like to remind all leadership and fire personnel that following MPHAT's guidance has been proven effective and is critical to prevent the further spread of COVID-19.
  - Leader's intent and expectations must be clear that COVID-19 prevention and mitigation is still a priority for the 2021 fire season.
  - With vaccination status not being systematically tracked, face covering/mask and physical distancing requirements on wildfire incidents needs strengthened – everyone follow COVID-19 prevention and mitigation guidance for un-vaccinated individuals regarding physical distancing and mask/face covering use in fire camp unless alone in an enclosed space or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.
- Fire managers, agency administrators, line officers and incident managers need to prioritize and incorporate COVID-19 strategies that were effective and considered standard operating procedures in 2020 such as:
  - daily individual screening tool, distributive operations, spike camps, boxed meals, community cooler mitigations, remote briefings, decentralized staging areas, virtual and remote participation, and module as one (updated) to the maximum extent possible.
