FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems, from higher elevation Sub Alpine Fir and Engelmann Spruce, to Doug-Fir, Grand Fir and Lodgepole Pine under 5000', and Ponderosa Pine in the lower elevations of the Forest. Outside of the 2006 Columbia Complex and the 2015 Grizzly Complex, all forested areas have extensive dead and down and ladder fuels that will work together to elevate fire into the crowns and generate short range spotting.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components currently setting daily record highs, and approaching all time high levels. You may see some resistance to spread in brush and re-prod areas, but these veg structures are losing moisture daily. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day.

GENERAL/Potential:

DAY: Hotter and drier today, with RH values in the teens in lower values. As the smoke clears out late morning anticipate an uptick in fire behavior in the heavies, which will elevate fire once again into the crowns to aid in spotting and perimeter growth.

SPECIFIC

Green Ridge: Successful burn operations in Division G should see further burn down of fuels to increase depth off the 46 road. Alpha may see more single and group tree torching again, with rollout and flanking out in the rougher country out to the SE corner of the fire. Division K may look for more ways to move down and flank in an easterly direction within the Tucannon River drainage.

Lick Creek: Low probability, high consequence spotting concerns remain along the western and southern flanks.

Night Division: Activity will slowly taper down from shift change across the active parts of the Green Ridge fire as the smoke settles and relative humidity recovers.

Parking Safely on Slopes

Standard operating procedures for parking vehicles safely on slopes are:

In wildland fire operations, we frequently exit vehicles quickly, but it is imperative that anytime a vehicle is left unattended, time is taken to assure it is parked safely and will not present a hazard to ourselves or others.

- Turn the front wheels uphill or into the inside/embankment.
- Firmly set the emergency brake.
- Put the vehicle in park (if automatic transmission) or in forward gear (if manual transmission); do not
- leave it in neutral.
- Turn off the engine.
- Chock the wheels. When utilizing chocks, make sure they are on the correct side in reference to the slope. Assure the chocks are approved to hold the weight of the vehicle and will grip on the road surface.
- Be aware of safe parking on slopes during an incident when moving a vehicle frequently. When using engines in pumping operations along a roadway, it is easy to get complacent with procedures. Realize when the vehicle is on a slightly different slope and requires placing chocks differently. It is the driver's responsibility to assure not only that the vehicle is operated safely but is positioned and parked safely.

Reminders: Snag Trees can be killer tree's! Stay clear of snags. If a snag tree can't be mitigated by being putt on the ground, than flag the area and limit folks from entering the kill zone.

COVID Mitigation Expectations/Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following.

For resources assigned to an incident within the PNW and for our NW IMTs assigned outside
the northwest, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside, vaccinated or unvaccinated,
unless you are working alone or are on the fire line. Having a medical exemption is the only
exception.

This direction applies to all levels of incident operations and all aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incident, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, etc.






