## ...Fire Weather Watch in Effect Thursday for Thunderstorms... ...Storms may bring gusty and erratic winds...

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION</u>: Today will be another hot and unstable day over southeast Washington. There may be an instability thunderstorm in the late afternoon or evening. Today will be the same or a little warmer than Tuesday, and the humidity will be the same or a little lower. The probability of showers and thunderstorms increases on Thursday, and a Fire Weather Watch has been issued for thunderstorms producing lightning in dry fuels.

## **TODAY:**

WEATHER: Mostly sunny in the morning. Partly cloudy in the afternoon. A slight chance of thunderstorms in the

late afternoon and evening.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: 85-90° above 5000 feet. 95-100° valley bottoms.

## **FUELS:**

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems, from higher elevation Sub Alpine Fir and Engelmann Spruce, to Doug-Fir, Grand Fir and Lodgepole Pine under 5000', and Ponderosa Pine in the lower elevations of the Forest. Outside of the 2006 Columbia Complex and the 2015 Grizzly Complex, all forested areas have extensive dead and down and ladder fuels that will work together to elevate fire into the crowns and generate short range spotting.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components currently setting daily record highs, and approaching all time high levels. You may see some resistance to spread in brush and re-prod areas, but these veg structures are losing moisture daily. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day.

## **GENERAL/Potential:**

**DAY:** Hotter and drier today, with RH values in the teens in lower valleys. As the smoke clears out late morning antici pate an uptick in fire behavior in the heavies, which will elevate fire once again into the crowns to aid in spotting and perimeter growth. Thunderstorms in the area could bring strong, erratic winds especially where influenced by terrain.

## **SPECIFIC**

**Green Ridge**: Lots of great work with crews and the drone operators to get depth all along the 46 road in Division Gulf over the past few days. Keep in mind the Lick fire had spotting outside lines a couple weeks after the fire moved through, heavies are holding heat for extended times in the drought. Any reburning or interior islands that make runs could produce spots across lines. If working in Division Alpha, keep a good heads up for fire below your location as high Haines days have generated slope runs, especially on west aspects. Heads up for any squirrely winds that could influence the backing fire above Lady Bug CG in Division Kilo/Mike.

Lick Creek: Low probability, high consequence spotting concerns remain along the western and southern flanks.

**Night Division:** Activity will slowly taper down from shift change across the active parts of the Green Ridge fire as the smoke settles and relative humidity recovers.

## SAFETY:

Keep an eye on the brush. Fire has had trouble carrying through with higher live fuel moisture, but that's rapidly changing, especially on the drier aspects. Fire Weather Watch on tap for Thursday for lightning.

## 9. Building fireline downhill with fire below.

Downhill fireline construction is hazardous in steep terrain, fastburning fuels, or rapidly changing weather. Downhill fireline construction should not be attempted unless there is no tactical alternative. When building downhill fireline:

- Crew supervisor(s) and fireline overhead must discuss assignments prior to committing personnel. Qualified, responsible overhead individuals such as a Task Force Leader (TFLD) or an Incident Commander Type 4 (ICT4) at minimum, will stay with resources until the job is completed.
- Decisions about downhill fireline construction will be made only after proposed fireline has been scouted by supervisor(s) of involved crew(s).
- Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones (LCES) will be coordinated for all personnel involved. This includes verifying:
  - o Crew supervisors are in direct contact with lookout(s) who can see the fire.
  - o Communication is established between crews.
  - Rapid access to safety zones is ensured in case fire crosses below crews.
- Direct attack will be used whenever possible; if not possible, the fireline should be completed between anchor points before being fired out.
- Fireline will not lie in or adjacent to a chute or chimney.
- Starting point will be anchored for crews building fireline down from the top.
- Bottom of the fire will be monitored; if the potential exists for the fire to spread, action will be taken to secure the fire edge.
- Before carrying fire with you, ensure it can be done safely.

Subject: COVID Mitigation Expectations/Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following.

For resources assigned to an incident within the PNW and for our NW IMTs assigned outside
the northwest, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside, vaccinated or unvaccinated,
unless you are working alone or are on the fire line. Having a medical exemption is the only
exception.

This direction applies to all levels of incident operations and all aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incident, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, etc.



- 5. **Demobilization Unit** will be your last stop. Make sure they know your travel times. If you are going to rest overnight let them know where you plan to stay.




