

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong westerly winds aloft will remain through Sunday. It will be slightly cooler today with higher humidity compared to yesterday. The air mass will be stable with a low and mid-level inversion.

FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems, from higher elevation Sub Alpine Fir and Engelmann Spruce, to Doug-Fir, Grand Fir and Lodgepole Pine under 5000', and Ponderosa Pine in the lower elevations of the Forest. Outside of the 2006 Columbia Complex and the 2015 Grizzly Complex, all forested areas have extensive dead and down and ladder fuels that will work together to elevate fire into the crowns and generate short range spotting.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components currently setting daily record highs, and approaching all time high levels. You may see some resistance to spread in brush and re-prod areas, but these veg structures are losing moisture daily. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day.

GENERAL/Potential:

DAY: Continued gusty SW winds will again be influenced, enhanced, and/or redirected through the terrain across all areas of the fire today. Expect long range spotting downwind of any active fire areas, especially single or group tree torching or slope aligned runs. Areas of the fire that have been cold for some time may come back to life, so keep lookouts posted when working in the green.

SPECIFIC

Green Ridge: Yesterday the fire made substantial runs up and out of the Tucannon River drainage- it's now in a different weather environment with more exposure to ridgetop winds. Anticipate greater rates of spread with increased wind support, fuels are also a drier forest type than down in the river drainages. Take time to understand where the fire has spread to and what slope, fuels, and weather influences will drive growth today.

Lick Creek: SW winds associated with the dry cold front passage should be favorable for the Lick Ck fire, as most holding concerns with long duration intense heat have been along the SW flanks.

Night Division: Due to the late burn periods, anticipate daytime burning conditions to continue well into the night, seeing relief with a decrease in winds and/or relative humidity recovery.

Make a Plan to Reposition

- Establish a plan to reposition resources in the event of adverse fire behavior.
- · Have decision points established.
- Post experienced lookouts who know the decision points, and where all of the resources are working.
- Develop notification protocols to initiate the plan.
- Make sure all resources know where to go and their travel time to that location.
- Have a check in protocol for resources when they arrive at their safe locations.

Major Hazards and Risks: Mopping up, stump holes, hazard trees, steep rugged terrain, driving, Chain saw operations, unburned fuel between you and the main fire when trying to pick up spot fires.

Team Transition Period

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- ✓ No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel.
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- ✓ Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- ✓ Not all Resources know who is in command.

Mitigation action:

<u>Communications</u>: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources while you are developing communications with incoming resources and your "new" supervisor.



What Does **Safety <u>Triangle</u>** Mean? The **Safety Triangle**, also known as the Safety Pyramid, the <u>Heinrich</u> Triangle, and the Bird Triangle, is a theoretical model that describes a stable ratio between workplace incidents of varying degrees of severity.

COVID Mitigation Expectations/Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following.

For resources assigned to an incident within the PNW and for our NW IMTs assigned outside
the northwest, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside, vaccinated or unvaccinated,
unless you are working alone or are on the fire line. Having a medical exemption is the only
exception.

This direction applies to all levels of incident operations and all aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incident, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, etc.

How are you and your fellow workers doing?

As crew supervisors, you should be looking for and anticipating potential problems and symptoms of stress, low morale, and inappropriate treatment.

INDICATOR EXAMPLES

- 1. People avoiding people
- 2. Seclusion/withdrawal/separation from the group
- 3. Racial or sexual jokes & or remarks
- 4. Comments that indicate inappropriate treatment like:
 - ** "You can't take a joke"
 - ** "Just expect that type of treatment on these types of jobs"
 - ** "I was just kidding"
 - ** "I was trying to be nice"
- 5. Accusations
- 6. Name Calling
- 7. Blaming
- 8. Unequal/unfair treatment

You need to check out these indicators, ask folks to stop the inappropriate behavior and squelch it immediately. You should be setting examples and making sure no one has to deal with ANY INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR.



- 5. **Demobilization Unit** will be your last stop. Make sure they know your travel times. If you are going to rest overnight let them know where you plan to stay.







Base Camp Facilities Map




