- Provide for the safety of firefighters and the public through the utilization of strategic and deliberate risk assessment processes. Ensure incident within an incident (IWI) protocols are established.
- Develop and implement strategies and tactics with the highest probability of success to protect identified values at risk.
- Maintain and enhance relationships, through timely communication, actively engaging the Agency Administrators, the public, and stakeholders.
- Coordinate with the READs to ensure natural and historical values are identified and protected.
- Assist with initial attack as requested, when it will not impede meeting of incident objectives.
- Manage the incident following established COVID-19 mitigation guidelines limiting spread of infectious diseases.

4. Safety

Confusion in the Transition.

Transition is not just a term for a new team being inserted into an incident; it also takes place with changes in tactics, objectives and incident complexity. This has been known to cause a lot of confusion on an incident at times.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- Have your communications changed? Do you need to re-clone?
- Do you have new leadership?
- Do you understand the leader's intent?
- Have you received a quality briefing?
- Are you changing camps?
- Are you on the IAP?
- Are there changes in your logistical support (food, showers, Medical plans and fuel)?
- Updated Maps unavailable?

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Temperatures on Tuesday will be significantly lower than Monday and humidity significantly higher. Winds will switch from W early Tuesday to NW in the afternoon with gusts to 20-25 mph. Rain chances will increase Tuesday evening as the NW winds weaken. Late Tuesday night through Wednesday afternoon is the period that rain is most likely to fall with a 70% chance of any rain and a 35% chance of at least 0.1". Thursday and Friday will be cool with light winds before precip chances increase again Saturday.

OUTPUTS FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Wind speeds will decrease today and humidity will increase resulting in moderate fire behavior today and tonight. The potential is greatest on the steep slopes and ridgetops. Expect torching and terrain driven crown runs where winds and slope line up.

Probability of ignition is 60% with spotting distances of 2000 feet possible. Haines Index 3

1-hour fuel moistures: 5%, 10 hours at 4%, 100 hours at 7%, 1000-hour fuels are ~8 % and live fuel moistures are at around 75-95%. ERCs are above the 97th percentile.

SPECIFIC:

Green Ridge: The fire will continue to progress up and out of the drainages on the south flank, pushed by an upslope wind of 3-8 MPH and the nortjhwest general winds. The fire will be active in the heavier concentrations of fuels as the winds surface causing torching and spotting. The active line in divisions A & P will move along the drainages and over the ridges to the east and southeast. Expect long range spotting and crown runs where slope and wind line up.

Lick Creek: The NW winds today should again be favorable by pushing the heat and smoke into the interior. Expect interior fuels to continue to consume and put off smoke.

Night Division: Due to the late burning periods, anticipate daytime burning conditions to continue well into the late evening due to the high wind speeds and continuing until the downslope winds set up and the humidity recovers. Expect torching and spotting, especially on the uphill runs.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Heavy smoke may hamper air operations.

Training Specialist Message/Training Process

You do not have to wait until the last work day to complete a position task book (PTB) evaluation. You can complete the evaluation process at any time on the incident. Trainees are not required to check in with the Incident Training Specialist (TNSP). However, Geographic Area Priority Trainee Program participants are strongly encouraged to check in with the TNSP. The TNSP is available to answer questions and/or help guide both the Trainee and Evaluator through the process.

- 1. Incident trainees should check in early with the TNSP either in person or remotely using the QR code on the IAP cover. Within that QR code exists a training portal.
- 2. The trainee needs to take ownership of their training assignment. Working closely with their evaluator, identify tasks and learning opportunities that can be documented in their PTB.
- 3. Ensure all the information is complete and correct on the Evaluation Record and, if being recommended for certification, the PTB Verification/Certification form. Incorrect or incomplete information is a very common issue in PTBs and, all too often, delays certification of a trainee as fully qualified. Please review all information to make sure it is complete, accurate, and legible.
- 4. The evaluator should complete an Incident Personnel Performance Rating (ICS 225 WF) for the trainee, and submit a copy to the TNSP either in person or a picture copy.
- 5. Once all the documentation is completed, the trainee will need to close out with the TNSP. The trainee can: 1) stop by and close out in person with TNSP; 2) call the TNSP to go through the Exit Interview Form and discuss how the assignment went; or 3) complete the Exit Interview Form through the QR code link.


