HOW'S YOUR PASSION FOR SAFETY?

Often our emphasis on doing this dangerous job safely needs to be fine-tuned with a safety check in. We know what safety is, we know what things to watch out for, but our ability to concentrate on this aspect of our wildfire suppression responsibility often is impaired by situations, both on the fire and off, physical difficulties, and inconveniences that have a profound effect on our frame of mind and/or our ability to focus attention on safe processes. It is critical that our focus is sharp while doing our jobs so that distraction does not impair our ability to think clearly and act decisively.

Human Factor Watch Outs

Watching out for yourself, coworkers, subordinates and your boss is a primary responsibility for EVERONE involved in high risk activities. Watch outs are not just for the tactical environment. The Human Factor Watch Outs are designed to create an opportunity for you to take a tactical pause and re-evaluate your situation.

If any of the following occur:

- · Your briefing was unclear.
- · You are not getting answers to your questions.
- · You are not getting clear acknowledgment of your message.
- You are encountering hazards that are not mentioned in your brief.
- · You see something that makes you uncomfortable.
- · Your team is not debriefing.
- Your operational tempo is adversely effecting your ability to maintain command and control.

Take moment to re-assess your situation. Think. Stop, Think, Talk before Acting.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Friday will feature a cold front moving through the OR/WA region Friday afternoon into the evening. Showers and thunderstorms will develop ahead of the boundary with lingering chances of rainfall last through the night and into the day on Saturday. A few thunderstorms could produce some gusty winds mainly Friday evening. Some lingering moisture behind the front will leave some showers over the incident for Saturday with a damp day anticipated. A drier air mass will move in for Sunday with an increase in wind gusts up to 25 mph.

WEATHER: Mostly cloudy. Showers and a thunderstorm or two in the late afternoon. MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: 60-65° above 5000 feet. 67-72° valley bottoms.

OUTPUTS FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Fire behavior should be moderate today with the forecasted weather. The 40% humidity combined with the lower wind speeds will result in slow to moderate rates of speed, single tree torching, and a minimal chance of crown fire.

Probability of ignition is 50% with spotting distances of 1500 feet possible. Haines Index 2

1-hour fuel moistures: 7%, 10 hours at 4%, 100 hours at 7%, 1000-hour fuels are ~8 % and live fuel moistures are at around 75-95%. ERCs are above the 97th percentile.

SPECIFIC:

Green Ridge: The fire will continue to progress up and out of the drainages on the south flank, pushed by the upslope winds and the northwest general winds. The fire will be active in the heavier concentrations of fuels as the winds surface causing torching and spotting. The active line in divisions W, S, & P will move along the drainages and over the ridges to the east and southeast. Expect short range spotting where slope and wind line up.

Lick Creek: The NW winds today should again be favorable by pushing the heat and smoke into the interior. Expect interior fuels to continue to consume and put off smoke. Link Creek is not expected to gain any more acreage.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Heavy smoke may hamper air operations.

***Note: If you have cell phone coverage and have nothing to return to Communications or Supply, you will not physically need to come to demob. ***

AIR TRAVELERS please contact or stop by demob 4 days prior to your demob date to confirm travel plans.

After being notified by your supervisor of your tentative release date:

- 1. Return all supplies, radios, etc. that were checked out. If you have no items to return, you can complete finance and demob virtually. All line vehicles must complete a WEED WASH and have a post-inspection of their vehicles.
- 2. Submit time for all personnel and equipment to Finance per directions in IAP.
- 3. Once you receive confirmation from FINANCE with a copy of your OF-288 and other financial documentation, you are free to complete Step 4 and travel home.
- 4. Complete demob Checkout Sheet using QR code on the cover of the IAP. If unable to use, see demob. Once demob receives confirmation from Finance and your demob checkout sheet has been electronically submitted, you will be released in the system.

Training Specialist Message/Training Process

You do not have to wait until the last work day to complete a position task book (PTB) evaluation. You can complete the evaluation process at any time on the incident. Trainees are not required to check in with the Incident Training Specialist (TNSP). However, Geographic Area Priority Trainee Program participants are strongly encouraged to check in with the TNSP. The TNSP is available to answer questions and/or help guide both the Trainee and Evaluator through the process.

- 1. Incident trainees should check in early with the TNSP either in person or remotely using the QR code on the IAP cover. Within that QR code exists a training portal.
- 2. The trainee needs to take ownership of their training assignment. Working closely with their evaluator, identify tasks and learning opportunities that can be documented in their PTB.
- 3. Ensure all the information is complete and correct on the Evaluation Record and, if being recommended for certification, the PTB Verification/Certification form. Incorrect or incomplete information is a very common issue in PTBs and, all too often, delays certification of a trainee as fully qualified. Please review all information to make sure it is complete, accurate, and legible.
- 4. The evaluator should complete an Incident Personnel Performance Rating (ICS 225 WF) for the trainee, and submit a copy to the TNSP either in person or a picture copy.
- 5. Once all the documentation is completed, the trainee will need to close out with the TNSP. The trainee can: 1) stop by and close out in person with TNSP; 2) call the TNSP to go through the Exit Interview Form and discuss how the assignment went; or 3) complete the Exit Interview Form through the QR code link.
