<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hold and improve along Bethel Ridge to the William O. Douglas Wilderness and complete indirect line preparations to secure the southern fire perimeter and reduce the threat to values at risk.</li> <li>• Complete indirect line and implement firing operations, as needed, to keep fire west of the Naches River and reduce the threat to forest infrastructure and the communities of Cliffdell and Pinecliff.</li> <li>• Monitor fire activity and implement suppression actions, as needed, to keep fire east of the Bumping River reducing the threat to structures and forest infrastructure in the Goose Prairie area. Keep fire on American Ridge south of highway 410, protect structures and maintain safe access to Goose Prairie</li> <li>• Mop up and secure containment lines to the degree necessary to make the likelihood of escape low based on experience, terrain, fuel type and condition, and current and forecasted weather.</li> <li>• Track suppression repair needs. Initiate repair actions when appropriate, resources are available and where they will not compromise suppression efforts.</li> </ul>

**DISCUSSION:** Much drier conditions are anticipated over the area today as skies clear and high temperatures remain slightly below normal. Light terrain driven flow is expected today, with upslope winds generally remaining at, or below, 5 to 7 mph. Humidity values today will drop substantially as compared to yesterday, with minimums falling right around 30%.

**TRANSFER OF COMMAND/TRANSITION**

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. There is a high potential for fatalities, serious injuries, or incidents with potential during transfer of command periods (some have occurred in the past). Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zone.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel.
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be difficult.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all Resources.
- Not all Resources know who is in command.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor. Ask questions until you understand your situation.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.
- Know who you are working for, what your assignment is, and where you will be working before leaving briefing.

Potential for occasional rollout on steep slopes exists. Conditions have lowered fire intensity, great for direct attack.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:**

Div A: Monitor cured brush patches for flare-ups. Critical to watch for structure damaged trees as their roots continue to burn and weaken. Rollout, creeping and smoldering potential should persist on American Ridge and in the American River Drainage.

Div D: Monitor for rollout on slope into Bumping River. Fuel near indirect line is likely to sustain creeping and smoldering fire and should not pose a threat to control lines. Expect smoldering of stumpholes and large logs to continue until consumed or suppressed.

Div H: Smoldering likely, monitor islands & cured brush patches for flare-ups with slight warming pattern. Rollout off Edgar Rock to Naches River is likely to continue. The donut hole has been the most recent active part of the fire and also an area that has received the least amount of precipitation. Possible smoldering and backing fire into Lost Creek south of 1706 Road.

Night: Expect minimal fire spread and activity. Smoldering likely throughout the night, conditions will be cool and fire behavior should be confined to heavy fuel consumption. Areas with the most recent fire growth are likely to have the most heat, monitor and identify hazards.

**AIR OPERATIONS:**

Clouds and fog from the fall weather are likely to be main factors, expect minimal impact from smoke on air operations.

## SAFETY

Watch you footing, the fire has experienced rain and wet ash could be extremely slick.

Review the first three Standard Firefighting Orders: All three are related to Fire Behavior and are important to firefighter safety. Think of how you will gather the information and then relay the information to other resources.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

**1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH** (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

*Ex: "Communications Div Alpha Stand-by for Emergency Traffic"*

**2. INCIDENT STATUS:** Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure
