**Strategic Framework:** Implement a full suppression strategy on the Summit Trail fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values private recreational residences, wilderness forest infrastructure.

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Chuweah Creek fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values, forest infrastructure including commercial timber.

### **Management Objectives:**

- Provide for firefighter and public safety by utilizing the risk management process to maintain safe and
  effective operational decisions, this includes full suppression strategies utilizing the full complement of
  tactics to achieve the control objectives.
- To the best extent possible minimize size and duration of the Summit Trail fire to limit negative impacts
  to commercial timber lands that provide highest probability of success and in close coordination with
  agency resource advisors and tribal leadership.
- Keep the Chuweah Creek fire in its current footprint and minimize additional impacts from fire suppression damage.
- Maintain the existing positive relationships between NW Team 7, the Colville Agency, cooperators and public by fostering trust and ensuring information is provided in timely manner.
- Provide for infectious disease control through thoughtful mitigations when appropriate for the safety of the firefighters and the public we serve.
- Provide Initial Attack response and assist as requested by the Colville Agency and Mt. Tolman.

### **Operational Period Command Emphasis:**

### **Control Objectives:**

- 1) LIFE is the most important value to be protected. There is no higher value than that of the responder/firefighter and our public.
- 2) Keep fire north of Bridge Creek Road to minimize impacts to structures and recreational facilities at Twin Lakes
- 3) Keep fire east of BIA Road 73 to reduce loss of commercial timber and cultural values.
- 4) Keep fire south of Hall Creek Rd. and 17 Mile Rd. to reduce fire footprint and duration.
- 5) Keep fire west of Carson and Bitterroot Mountains to lessen impact on commercial timber, private property and primary residences in Seyler Valley.
- 6) Keep Chuweah Creek fire in current footprint, minimize additional impacts to expressed values of concern by continuing with mop up, patrol and back haul.

Assumptions: ... Increased humidity and light winds have slowed the rate of spread but the fire will actively burn in the dead surface fuels. Winds are changing direction and may challenge unchecked fire perimeter in areas that have been less active. ERCs will lower briefly through the next 24 hrs. but begin to rise with warming and drying by mid-week.

### Fuels:

Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of Grass and shrubs, Timber Litter, and Timber with Understory. Ponderosa and lodgepole pine and Douglas-fir are common. Heavy down fuels in older untreated mixed conifer stands and activity slash in harvest units. True fir stands with low crown base heights are common. Type change occurs by aspect and management activity. Ladder fuels are common in most timbered areas (with low crown base height) that will contribute torching and spotting.

### Fire Behavior based on assumptions above:

The weather forecast will keep fire behavior low-moderate as fuels dry out from the recent increased in moisture. Fire behavior is fine dead fuel moisture driven... increase in humidity = decrease in rate of spread. However, this is a short duration effect and is dependent on moisture or precipitation location and duration. Changes in wind direction over the next few days will provide alignment on different slopes and provide localized influence on unchecked fire perimeters.

### \* Fine fuel moisture= 6-8%, 1000hr. moisture=8%, Woody fuels 80%, Probability of Ignition-50-60%

### **Specific Assignments:**

Div. B/F -Watch for undetected spot fires. Fire will actively burn dead surface fuels, spread rates will remain low.

 $\mathbf{Div.}\ \mathbf{J} - \mathbf{Fire}\ intensity$  will remain lower but backing and flanking around Lynx Mtn will continue.

Div. U - Fire intensity will remain lower but backing and flanking around Lynx Mtn will continue.

**Div.X/V** –Rollout across midslope lines may continue to challenge firelines.

<u>Structure Group</u> – Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times.

Contingency- Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times

<u>Chuweah Creek</u>—Forecasted moisture will provide a good opportunity to strengthen the fireline.

<u>Nightshift</u>- Poor overnight humidity recovery will keep fire active in dead surface fuels.

**Air Operations:** Visibility will be impacted from regional smoke with west winds. Local inversion will lift around 11 am.

### "GIT'R DUN"

Firefighters are known for their ability to go into very difficult situations with a "Git'R Done" attitude. Combine this with solid leadership, clear leader's intent based on sound risk management and you have a recipe for success. We live in a dynamic fire environment and even though risk analysis and hazard mitigations take place it is impossible to eliminate every hazard.

Let's drill down to the boots on the ground, literally...

The last 2 shifts we have had 2 injuries involving stump holes or burned-out root systems that extend out beyond the stump and are not always identifiable. As you read your Division Assignment list (ICS-204) page look at the control operations and you will see instructions such as, "Patrol and mop up to the extent necessary to maintain control objectives." Now Go to page 1 in your IAP (Incident Objectives) and read the Control Objectives. The first item on the list is YOU! Everything after that describes landmarks where we don't want the fire to get passed.

### Putting it all together

In the old days we used to have mop up standards based on chains or depth. Now, we do it smarter and base mop up on threat to our fire perimeter and life safety. Mop up has always been hard, dirty work and unfortunately dangerous work.
