

Strategic Framework: Implement a full suppression strategy on the Summit Trail fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values private recreational residences, wilderness forest infrastructure.

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Chuweah Creek fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values, forest infrastructure including commercial timber.

Management Objectives:

- Provide for firefighter and public safety by utilizing the risk management process to maintain safe and effective operational decisions, this includes full suppression strategies utilizing the full complement of tactics to achieve the control objectives.
- To the best extent possible, minimize size and duration of the Summit Trail fire to limit negative impacts to communities, commercial timberlands, natural resources, and cultural resources utilizing approaches that provide the highest probabilities of success and in close coordination with agency resource advisors and tribal leadership.
- Keep the Chuweah Creek fire in its current footprint and minimize additional impacts from fire suppression damage.
- Maintain the existing positive relationships between NW Team 7, the Colville Agency, Washington DNR, cooperators and public by fostering trust and ensuring information is provided in timely manner.
- Provide for infectious disease control through thoughtful mitigations when appropriate for the safety of the firefighters and the public we serve.
- Provide Initial Attack response and assist as requested by the Colville Agency and Mt. Tolman.

Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Control Objectives:

- LIFE is the most important value to be protected. There is no higher value than that of the responder/firefighter.
- 2) Keep fire north of Bridge Creek Road to minimize impacts to structures and recreational facilities at Twin Lakes
- 3) Keep fire east of BIA Road 73 to reduce loss of commercial timber and cultural values.
- 4) Keep fire south of Hall Creek Rd. and 17 Mile Rd. to reduce fire footprint and duration.
- 5) Keep fire west of Carson and Bitterroot Mountains to lessen impact on commercial timber, private property and primary residences in Seyler Valley.
- 6) Keep Chuweah Creek fire in current footprint, minimize additional impacts to expressed values of concern by continuing with mop up, patrol and back haul.

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Moderate WSW winds Saturday will become SW Saturday afternoon. Showers may develop as early as 1100 late Saturday morning ahead of a vigorous cold front which will move through late Saturday night into early Sunday morning, likely between 2200 Saturday morning and 0400 Sunday morning. This front will rapidly change the wind direction from SW to NW. Drizzle or light rain is likely with the frontal passage, but amounts will be meager and will likely not lead to wetting rains. With the nighttime timing of the cold front, significant thunderstorm activity is not likely. Significantly cooler temperatures are expected Sunday with a better chance of showers and thunderstorms throughout the first half of the day before the atmosphere stabilizes.

Assumptions: Deja'Vu forecast all over again... strong ridgetop SW winds by mid-morning (with increasing slope & valley wind) may outweigh the effects of recent moisture to provide areas of very active fire behavior on wind facing upper slopes. Exposed surface fuels have dried sufficiently to support active fire spread with forecast winds. Fire environment conditions will combine to produce a peak burning period between 1400-1800. Fire behavior characteristics will be moderate-to-active today depending on drying rate and forecast wind. Persistent burning conditions may be expected due to drought conditions and very dry fuels — heavy fuels release a lot of energy and retain heat for longer periods which provides reburn threat and mop-up difficulty.

Fire Behavior Summary

<u>Fuels in the fire area</u> are primarily composed of Grass and shrubs, Timber Litter, and Timber with Understory. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Ponderosa Pine, Douglas Fir, with scattered Lodgepole Pine, True Fir and cedar. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species include Ocean Spray, ceonothus, hardwoods, dog-hair conifer thickets reproduction. Snags and heavy fuel loading are common throughout all areas. Live fuels are drought stressed and may contribute to high rates of spread; grasses are fully cured. Fuel type changes occur by management activity, elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and black shaggy moss are present in most of the timbered areas. Timber harvest blocks may contain slash piles.

Today's potential fire behavior on wind facing slopes may include areas of active surface fire spread including flare ups with group torching, and rapid rates of spread. Where it is occurring, very active fire behavior may result in spotting and/or short crown runs that may lead to "leap-frog" type of fire spread. Expect high rates of spread in all fuels with wind/slope alignment. Expect areas of active head fire with lateral spread to increase in the afternoon. Backing fire may provide slope reversals resulting in aggressive upslope fire activity with torching and spotting. Sheltered/shaded fuels may provide reduced fire behavior due to residual moisture.

Specific Assignments:

- Div. F Expect increasing SW winds by mid-morning on SW aspects and upper slopes. Watch for flare-ups and reburn potential.
- Div. J Expect wind challenges on upper slopes. Monitor backing on slopes, anticipate isolated torching,, slope reversals and flare-ups.
- Div. U Complex terrain and irregular edge may produce flare-ups with torching, spots, and slop-overs. Regulate heat when firing lines.
- Div.X/V/B Increased wind may kindle smoldering fuels to flame. Monitor for interior flare-ups that may cause spot fires across lines.

Structure Group(s) - Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times.

Contingency- Monitor fire activity. Know what your fire is doing at all times

<u>Chuweah Creek</u>—monitor for flare-ups that may spot across firelines.

Nightshift- Poor overnight humidity recovery will keep fire active in dead surface fuels.

Initial Attack - Continued threat of holdover lightning starts. Perform thorough size up and assessment of fuel conditions.

Air Operations: Visibility will be impacted from regional smoke with west winds. Expect gusty (25+mph) SW winds over ridges.

Safety

Sudden flare-ups are possible, multiple flare-ups may occur with wind. Multiple simultaneous flare-ups become critical without LCES. Plan ahead for actions to take; foot travel takes time! Review the Watch Out Situations with your resources; can you mitigate?

AFTER ACTION REVIEWS

If you have been doing this wildland fire thing for more than one season you have witnessed the following:

You are on day 10 and it is the end of another long shift. Your assignment is patrol and mop up on the same piece of ground. You are tired, hungry and dirty, and you are thinking, "lots of good work today, but I can't wait to get some dinner." The radio suddenly comes to life and your leader asks everyone on the division to meet at DP 200. You arrive and it is the same old story; What was planned? Mop up. What actually happened? Mop up. Why did it happen? Because it needed to be mopped up. What can we do next time? Mop up more. As the group heads back to their rigs to drive back to camp you hear someone sarcastically say, "Well, that was productive".

Now, before you report me to the NWCG for being snarky, please allow me to get serious.

IRPG page XIII contains a very useful format for conducting an AAR. Let's look a bit deeper at when AARs are the most beneficial.

- What was planned? Translation: What was the Leader's Intent for the assignment that meets the control objectives?
- What actually happened? Translation: Did we meet the Leader's Intent (Task, Purpose, and End State)?
- Why did it happen? Translation: This question can imply that there was a deviation in the plan or it can gauge if we understood the purpose.
- What can we do next time? Translation: Correcting a weakness, or building on a strength.

AARs are a very important tool! Use them for team building, improving performance, increasing situational awareness and managing risk. Don't fall into the trap of conducting an AAR just to "check the box". Make them meaningful, well thought out and productive.

Take care of each other

Duty, Respect and Integrity are words very familiar to the firefighter community. Doing our part to keep ourselves healthy, and making conscious decision about our safety, will ensure we all get home to our families. While we are guest here on in the Reservation, keeping reports of positive COVID-19 cases low is crucial. Afterall we all came to help!

What does Quarantine or Isolation mean?

Quarantine is a term used to explain if you have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19. Close Contact is defined within 6 feet of someone for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.

Isolation is term used to separate infected people from those who are not infected. This is a form of infection control to protect the resources and the Reservation.

Prevention is better than the Cure

Keeping up on Hygiene

- Properly wash (20 seconds) or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or after coughing or sneezing.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often: Radios, vehicles, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.
- Change cloths often.

Social/Physical Distancing

- Limiting face-to-face contact (keeping 6 feet or more distance) with others is the best way to reduce the spread of infection.
- Do not gather in groups; limit face-to-face meetings and spread out during briefings and other meetings you go to.

Cloth Face Coverings (aka Masks)

The primary purpose of these masks (also known as source control) is to reduce the spread of the virus from someone who may have the virus.

Wearing a mask, over your nose, mouth and chin. You do not need to wear a mask, when you are alone in an enclosed space, sleeping, or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.

Contact a Health Liaison /COVID Responder Member to assist you with the supplies, screening, testing and isolation/quarantine process.

COVID Mitigation Expectations and Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following:

- for <u>all</u> resources assigned to an incident within the PNW, and for our NW IMTs assigned outside the PNW, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside. Exceptions include working alone, working on the fire line, having a medical exemption, and/or pilots and flight crew during all phases of flights for the following missions: airtanker, smokejumper, ATGS, ASM, point-to-point, HELCO, short-haul, rappel, and aerial ignition,
- · highly encourage limiting access to all fire related facilities, and
- highly encourage maximum use of virtual meetings to the extent possible.

The PNW MAC and partner agencies are not authorizing the "Module as One" concept nor any process that would lessen the expectations and requirements set forth in this letter.

This direction applies to <u>all</u> levels of incident operations and <u>all</u> aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incidents, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, dispatch centers, smokejumper bases, caches, etc.

Thank you for your vigilance of COVID protections.
