INCIDENT OBJECTIVES

Strategic Framework: Implement a full suppression strategy on the Summit Trail fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values private recreational residences, wilderness forest infrastructure.

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Chuweah Creek fire that protects identified values at risk. Values identified include human life and safety, cultural and historical values, forest infrastructure including commercial timber.

Management Objectives:

- Provide for firefighter and public safety by utilizing the risk management process to maintain safe and effective operational decisions, this includes full suppression strategies utilizing the full complement of tactics to achieve the control objectives.
- To the best extent possible, minimize size and duration of the Summit Trail fire to limit negative impacts to communities, commercial timberlands, natural resources, and cultural resources utilizing approaches that provide the highest probabilities of success and in close coordination with agency resource advisors and tribal leadership.
- Keep the Chuweah Creek fire in its current footprint and minimize additional impacts from fire suppression damage.
- Maintain the existing positive relationships between NW Team 7, the Colville Agency, Washington DNR, cooperators and public by fostering trust and ensuring information is provided in timely manner.
- Provide for infectious disease control through thoughtful mitigations when appropriate for the safety of the firefighters and the public we serve.
- Provide Initial Attack response and assist as requested by the Washington DNR, the Colville Agency, and Mt. Tolman.

Operational Period Command Emphasis:

Control Objectives:

- 1) LIFE is the most important value to be protected. There is no higher value than that of the responder/firefighter and our public.
- 2) Keep fire north of Bridge Creek Road to minimize impacts to structures and recreational facilities at Twin Lakes
- 3) Keep fire east of BIA Road 73 to reduce loss of commercial timber and cultural values.
- 4) Keep fire south of Hall Creek Rd. and 17 Mile Rd. to reduce fire footprint and duration.
- 5) Keep fire west of Carson and Bitterroot Mountains to lessen impact on commercial timber, private property and primary residences in Seyler Valley.
- 6) Keep Chuweah Creek fire in current footprint, minimize additional impacts to expressed values of concern by continuing with mop up, patrol and back haul.
- 7) Keep Upper Lime Creek Fire south of Cache Creek Rd., west of HWY 21, north of Lime Creek Rd., and south of Jack Creek Rd.

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Moderate northwesterly winds Sunday morning will continue throughout the day, gradually decreasing by the evening. Significantly cooler temperatures are expected Sunday with a good chance of showers and thunderstorms developing from the north and moving south across the fires and ICP from the late morning through the evening hours. These storms could produce brief heavy downpours, lightning and gusty outflow winds of 25-35 mph. Stabilizing weather conditions are expected Monday with temperatures near normal and some lingering moisture producing fair weather cumulus and occasional gusts to 15 mph. High pressure will strengthen throughout the week bringing a return of well-above normal temperatures, prevailing southwesterly daytime winds and northwesterly nighttime winds for the fire areas.

Assumptions: Today' new wind direction (NW) provides a fresh set of slope alignments and drainage influences that may affect fire behavior. All surface will support active fire spread with forecast winds. Fire environment conditions will combine to produce a peak burning period between 1400-1800. Fire behavior characteristics will be moderate-to-active today depending on strength of wind. Persistent burning conditions may be expected due to drought conditions and very dry fuels – heavy fuels release a lot of energy and retain heat for longer periods which provides reburn threat and mop-up difficulty.

Fire Behavior Summary

<u>Fuels in the fire area</u> are primarily composed of *Grass and shrubs, Timber Litter*, and *Timber with Understory*. Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Ponderosa Pine, Douglas Fir, with scattered Lodgepole Pine, True Fir and cedar. Local timber litter is compact to fluffy. Brush and understory species include Ocean Spray, ceonothus, hardwoods, dog-hair conifer thickets reproduction. Snags and heavy fuel loading are common throughout all areas. *Live fuels are drought stressed and may contribute to high rates of spread*; grasses are fully cured. Fuel type changes occur by management activity, elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and black shaggy moss are present in most of the timbered areas. Timber harvest blocks may contain slash piles.

<u>Today's "peak period" fire behavior</u> on wind facing slopes may include areas (pockets) of active surface fire spread including flare ups with isolated torching and rapid rates of spread. Steep slopes may produce active fire with backing and flanking. Expect high rates of spread in all fuels with wind/slope alignment. Areas of active head fire with lateral spread increase in the afternoon. Backing fire may provide slope reversals resulting in aggressive upslope fire activity with torching and spotting. Sheltered/shaded fuels may provide reduced fire behavior – heavy fuels will continue to consume and hold heat (due to dryness).

* Fine fuel moisture= 6-9%, 1000hr. moisture=8%, Woody fuels 80%, Probability of Ignition-40-60%

Northwest Team 7 prides itself on doing our absolute best to *Take Care of the Firefighter* – You. – YES- YOU! We have a well developed and continually updated set of procedures and staffing for addressing your medical and health needs. There are several ways to access or tap into this help: Notify your supervisor that you have a health or medical issue or a medical emergency. Or, notify a safety officer, or a line medic. All of these people are here to serve you, and help you, and will activate the plans necessary to get you the help you need -day or night. It is not an inconvenience or making trouble for us to do this. We plan for it. It is part of our job and we want to help YOU.

You can also activate emergency help by calling communications on the command channel on a radio, or by calling their 24-hour emergency number by phone at (503) 867-3045. This number is also on the front page of the IAP. **PUT IT IN YOUR PHONE**

We have a well-staffed and stocked medical unit right here in the ICP. It is here for you to use. Walk on in and get some help. Come in early if you have a developing issue- blisters, stomach problems, bee stings, etc. Did I say BLISTERS? Medical folks can help with those and make you more comfortable and reduce the chance of infection.

We have a medical clinic here in Inchelium and the MEDL here in camp may send you there for assessment or treatment. We have a hospital in Colville and if you get sent there a "maroon shirt" is prepared to go there with you, or meet you there to support you, help with any necessary paperwork, and communicate any needs or issues back to ICP.

Don't skip or delay a visit/treatment to save a shift or part of a shift worth of pay, and have a condition develop that causes you to miss several shifts or part of the remaining season.

COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT INFECTION CONTROL

How does hand washing kill the virus that causes COVID-19?

Soap and water, worked into a lather, trap and remove germs and chemicals from hands. Wetting your hands with clean water before applying soap helps you get a better lather than applying soap to dry hands. A good lather forms pockets called micelles that trap and remove germs, harmful chemicals, and dirt from your hands.

COVID Mitigation Expectations and Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following:

- for <u>all</u> resources assigned to an incident within the PNW, and for our NW IMTs assigned outside the PNW, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside. Exceptions include working alone, working on the fire line, having a medical exemption, and/or pilots and flight crew during all phases of flights for the following missions: airtanker, smokejumper, ATGS, ASM, point-to-point, HELCO, short-haul, rappel, and aerial ignition,
- highly encourage limiting access to all fire related facilities, and
- highly encourage maximum use of virtual meetings to the extent possible.

The PNW MAC and partner agencies are not authorizing the "Module as One" concept nor any process that would lessen the expectations and requirements set forth in this letter.

This direction applies to <u>all</u> levels of incident operations and <u>all</u> aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incidents, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, dispatch centers, smokejumper bases, caches, etc.

Thank you for your vigilance of COVID protections.
