Assumptions: *Just a little cooler with slightly higher relative humidity, BUT expect another observable increase in fire behavior today. Fuels are dry enough to support areas of active fire spread where heat and available fuels are present. Riparian and sheltered areas remain damp(ish). Peak burning period (1400-1800) provides the best opportunity for fire spread on sunny wind favored slopes and ridges. "Fair" night time humidity will re-enforce continued drying. Numerous sources of heat are present across a large geographic area on our current fires – monitor your neighborhood for increased activity.*

Fire Behavior Summary

Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of **Grass and shrubs, Timber Litter, and Timber with Understory.** Primary tree species include mixed sizes of Douglas Fir, Ponderosa Pine, True Fir and cedar. Brush and understory species include Ocean Spray, shrub-form Maple, and dog-hair conifer thickets. Snags and heavy fuel concentrations are common throughout all areas. **Live fuels are drought stressed, most grasses are fully cured. Fuel type changes occur by management activity, elevation, and aspect. Low crown base height (ladder fuels) and black shaggy moss are present in most of the timbered areas. Timber harvest blocks may contain shrub covered slash.** Deep duff is common especially in dense timber stands on lower slopes and riparian areas.

Today's "Peak Period" fire behavior may include scattered areas of spreading surface fire on slopes. Fire behavior characteristics are likely to include continued "skunking/chewing around", "smoldering & creeping", with persistent backing, flanking, and upslope spread. Isolated/group torching is possible with heat under low canopy timber. Flare-ups are possible on steep slopes that may lead to group torching or short crown runs. Rolling material and falling snags may produce drag fire downhill. Heavy fuel concentrations, log ends, and stump holes will continue to consume (and produce smoke) due to dryness.

- Div. F** – Monitor increased backing and flanking along upper W. Fk. Hall Creek. **Monitor SE/SW ¼ Sec.21 for slope reversal.**

Black Bear and Mountain Lion Safety Tips

Although black bears and mountain lions are completely different animals, the methods for preventing encounters and what to do if encounters occur are similar.

- **Avoid working alone in areas frequented by bears and mountain lions.**
- **Make noises such as talking loudly to alert animals that people are in the area. Most bears and lions want to avoid people if at all possible, and encounters often occur when one comes upon the other unintentionally.**
- **Look for signs of bears and mountain lions including tracks, scat, and animal carcasses. Bears will also tear open logs and stumps in search of grubs and insects.**

If an encounter occurs:

- **Remain calm.**
- **Stop or back away slowly, if you can do so safely.**
- **Do not approach. Most mountain lions and bears will try to avoid a confrontation. Give them a way to escape.**
- **Do not run, which may encourage lions and bears to chase. Instead, stand and face the animal. Make eye contact.**
- **Do all you can to appear larger. Wave your arms above your head and speak firmly in a loud voice. The idea is to convince the animal that you are not prey and that you may be a danger to it.**
- **Bears are known to bluff charge. Continue to stand your ground and give the appearance of one to be reckoned with.**
- **Fight back if attacked! Lions and bears have been driven off by prey that fights back. People have successfully fought back with tools, rocks, sticks, caps or jackets, and their bare hands. Remain standing or try to get back up.**

Bears and Food Etiquette

- **Do not feed or toss food to a bear or leave food scraps on the fireline.**
- **Bears will quickly associate humans with food and become a hazard or nuisance.**
- **Cook, eat and clean up at least 100 yards from a camp's sleeping area.**
- **Store food, garbage, and odorous personal items (toothpaste, deodorant, soap, and lotions) in bear-resistant containers, in a hard-sided vehicle, or at least 10 feet from the ground and 4 feet from side supports.**

From: Chuck Turley, PNW MAC Acting Chair on behalf of all PNW MAC Agency Executives
Subject: COVID Mitigation Expectations and Requirements

The frequency of COVID exposure and cases is increasing on our PNW wildfire incidents and within support functions. PNW MAC has reviewed the multiple guidance documents provided by CDC, Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT), and federal, state, and local entities. Beginning immediately our expectation and direction is that all PNW incidents and their support functions will implement and enforce the following:


- for all resources assigned to an incident within the PNW, and for our NW IMTs assigned outside the PNW, wear a mask at all times whether inside or outside. Exceptions include working alone, working on the fire line, having a medical exemption, and/or pilots and flight crew during all phases of flights for the following missions: airtanker, smokejumper, ATGS, ASM, point-to-point, HELCO, short-haul, rappel, and aerial ignition,
- highly encourage limiting access to all fire related facilities, and
- highly encourage maximum use of virtual meetings to the extent possible.

The PNW MAC and partner agencies are not authorizing the “Module as One” concept nor any process that would lessen the expectations and requirements set forth in this letter.

This direction applies to all levels of incident operations and all aspects of an incident including but not limited to transportation to/from incidents, ICPs, spike camps, helibases, tanker bases, ground support units, dispatch centers, smokejumper bases, caches, etc.

Thank you for your vigilance of COVID protections.
