

How to Download Maps in Avenza

If your cell signal is poor you may need to connect to a wifi to download maps. However sometimes being connected to a wifi can slow map downloads. You'll just have to find out what works best.

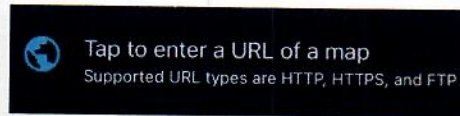
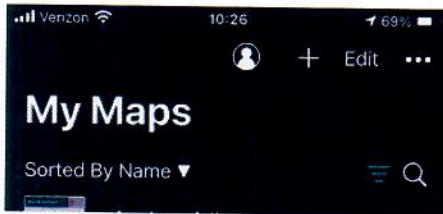
Method 1: From a browser - If you have a good cell or wifi signal

1. Tap on the desired map link and wait for the preview. *If it fails to load, use method 2 instead*
2. Tap the 'send to' icon (square with up arrow)
3. Choose the Avenza app



Method 2: From Avenza direct – if you don't have a good cell or wifi signal

1. Tap and hold on the desired map link, then choose 'copy' to copy the direct URL to the map
2. Launch the Avenza app
3. When not in any map... Tap the + (plus) icon at the top of the screen
4. Choose the load from URL option (last choice)
5. Paste the direct URL to the map
6. Tap 'Done' ; the map will begin downloading



How to Send Map Updates to the Situation Unit

1. From within the map in Avenza, click the pin with three lines near the lower-right corner.
2. *iPhone:* In the lower right, click the square with up arrow. From the pop-up menu, choose Export to Others.
Android: In the lower right, click the circle with three lines. Click the pop-up circle with up arrow.
3. Set these options:
 - a. Filename – leave alone
 - b. Export Format – choose SHP, GPX or KML
 - c. Data – all features
 - d. Image size – no image
4. Click the Export button in the upper-right corner.
5. When the export is ready, choose your Mail application.
6. Email the update to 2021.walker creek.situation@firenet.gov for the Walker Creek Fire map updates or 2021.chickadeecreek.situation@firenet.gov for the Chickadee Fire map updates.
7. If you have questions, call or text the Situation Unit at 360-584-3373.
8. Your email needs to include an explanation of the data and a contact phone number.

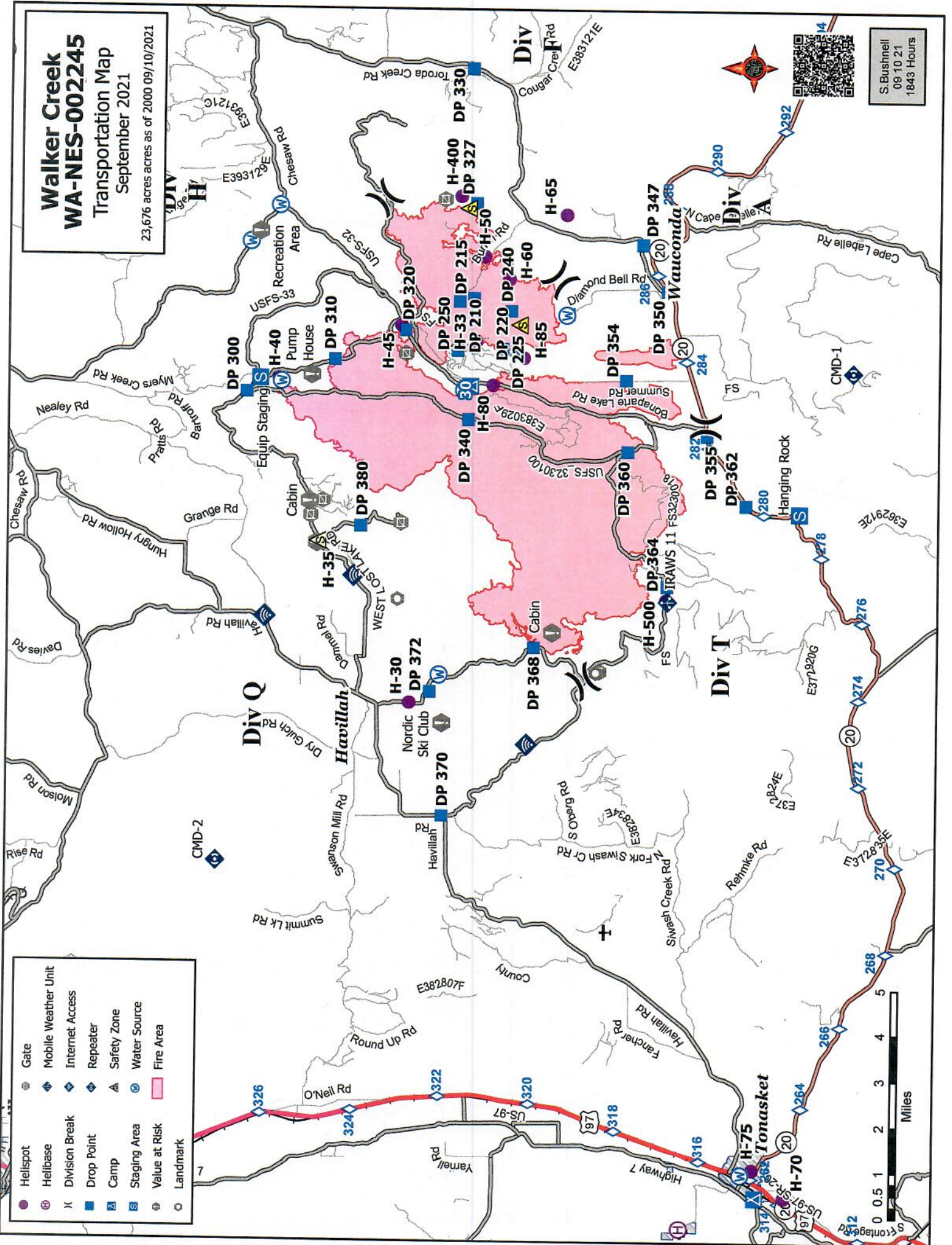

Walker Creek WA-NES-002245 Transportation Map

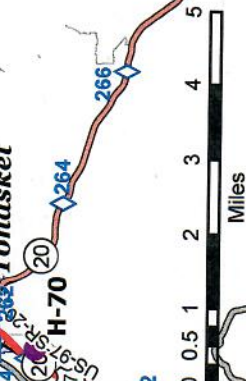

Notify public health officials.
Have individual transported as appropriate.
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

EMERGENCY PLAN INCIDENT WITHIN AN INCIDENT

ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER

In the event of an accident or medical incident of any size, your primary responsibility is to ENSURE that the victim(s) receive prompt and effective Triage, Treatment, Extrication and Transport.

- ENSURE THE MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT IN THE INCIDENT ACTION PLAN IS BEING USED AND FOLLOWED- ***IF DETERMINED TO BE A GREEN, DO NOT DECLARE EMERGENCY TRAFFIC AND ONLY COMPLETE LINE 1-4 ON MIR***.
- Conduct size-up of the incident nature of accident, number type of resources involved, latitude and longitude location (DD°MMM.MM format): notify incident communications center and supervisor, request assistance as needed.
- Order and coordinate medical and support response to the accident.
- Evaluate special needs (law enforcement, haz mat, etc.).
- Clear the command frequency if medical emergency, coordinate with incident communications and air attack for air medical transportation needs.
- Preserve and photograph the scene for accident investigation.
- Remain aware of surroundings and the status of the main incident (delegate personnel to monitor the main fire) to ensure safety of medical treatment personnel.
- Until relieved, supervise and manage all personnel involved at the incident scene.

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.
