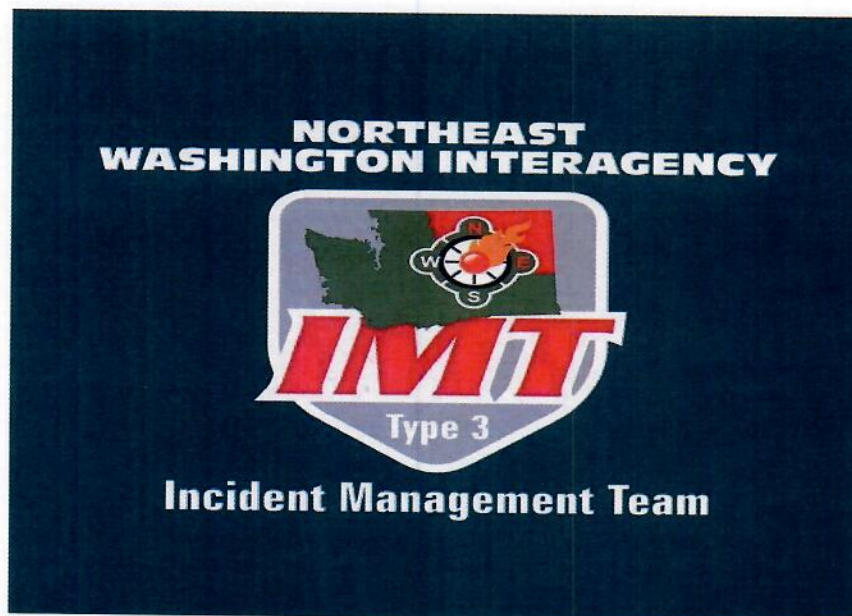

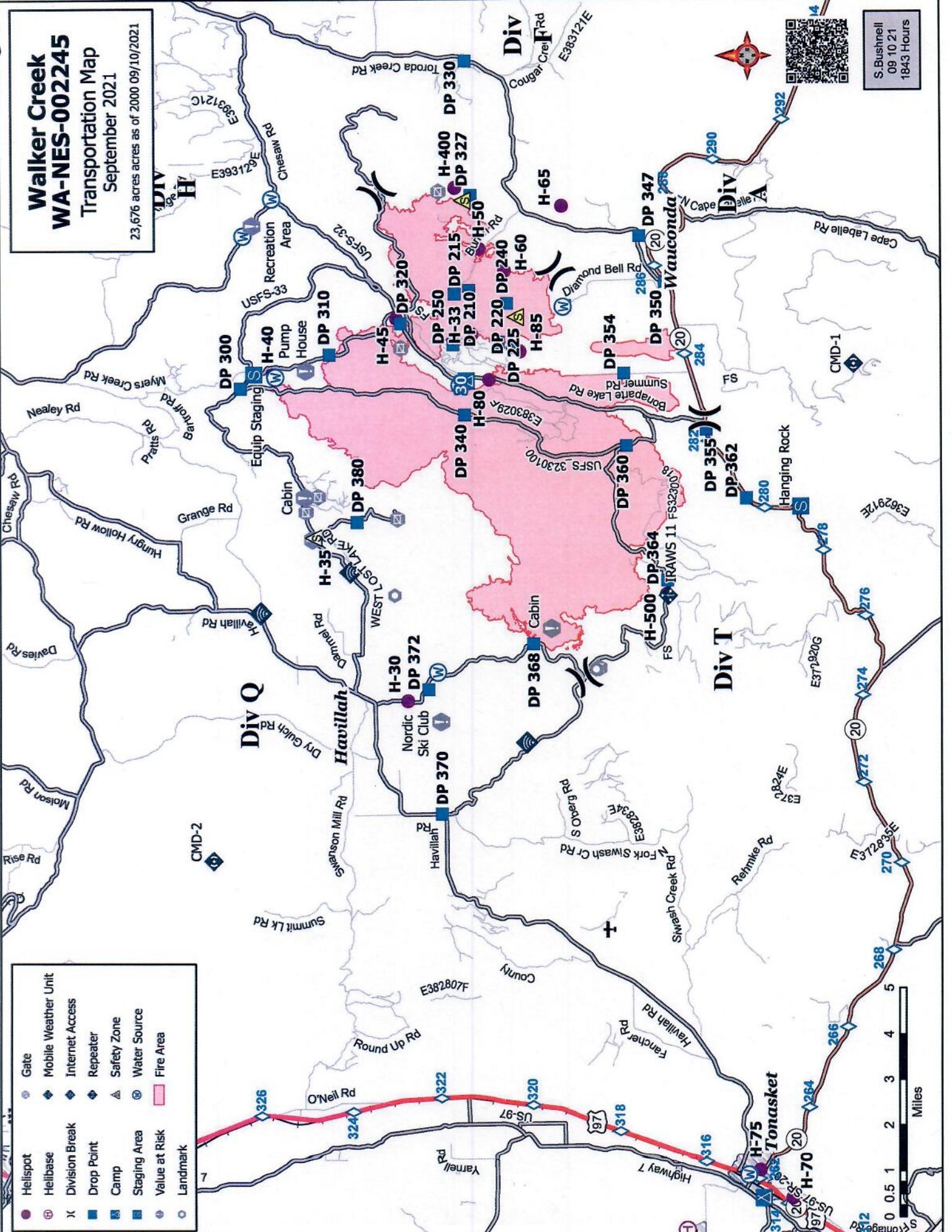

If conditions become unrepresentative...contact the National Weather Service.</p> <p>.DISCUSSION...</p> <p>The Walker Creek Fire will experience a surge of north winds this evening with gusts of 20 mph or more likely on ridges and other areas exposed to north winds. North winds will decrease by 2100 pdt over the majority of the fire this evening, but ridgetop gusts may persist well into the early morning hours. Thursday morning will be quite cool with low temperatures in the upper 20s in the sheltered valleys and low to mid 30s on the mid slopes and ridges. Rain chances will increase Friday into Friday night. With off and on rain through the weekend, the fire will have a good shot of up to a half inch of total precipitation by Monday.</p> <p>.THURSDAY...</p> <p>Sky/weather.....Sunny. CWR.....0 percent. LAL.....1. Max temperature....54. Min humidity.....25 percent. Wind (20 ft).....North winds 4 to 6 mph until 1000 PDT becoming upslope/upvalley (southwest) 2 to 5 mph and continuing through the afternoon. - Stay a tuned to the changing environment and your assigned mission.



- Stay focused out there the season is not over.

- Please get adequate rest, the acumination of days and hours will wear on you.

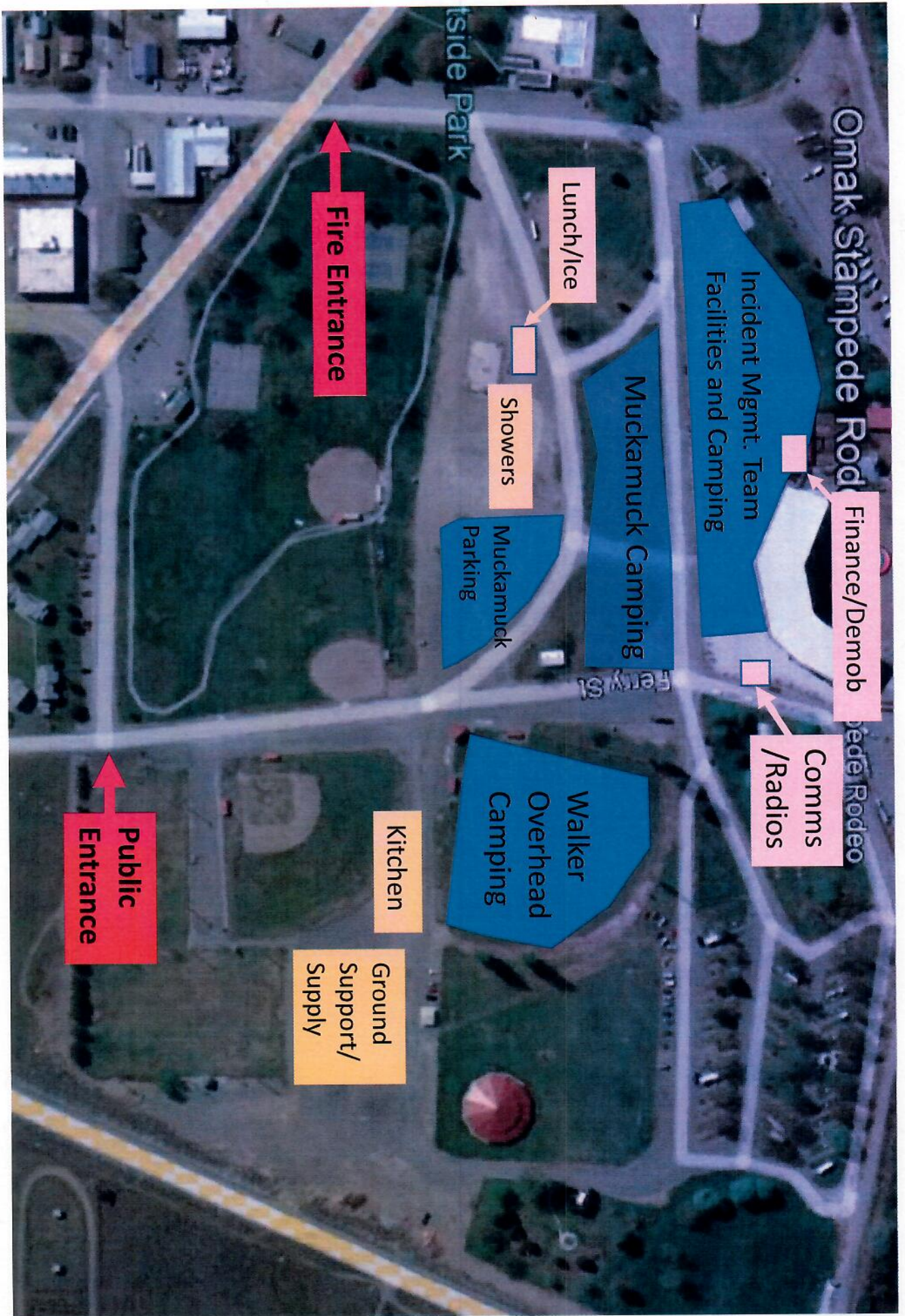
